

Introduction

This document provides a set of thematic maps on the **industry of employment** data by estate and settlement in Milton Keynes from 2011 Census data.

Methodology

These maps were created by the Research and Intelligence team at Milton Keynes Council based on 2011 Census data published by the Office for National Statistics.

The 2011 Census data was not released at estate level. The Research and Intelligence team at Milton Keynes Council therefore added together Output Area (the smallest census geography) data to provide an estimate at estate level. As Output Areas (OAs) boundaries and estate boundaries do not always match, the data for OAs is weighted to estates. The data in the maps should therefore be seen as estimates based on 2011 Census data rather than actual figures. 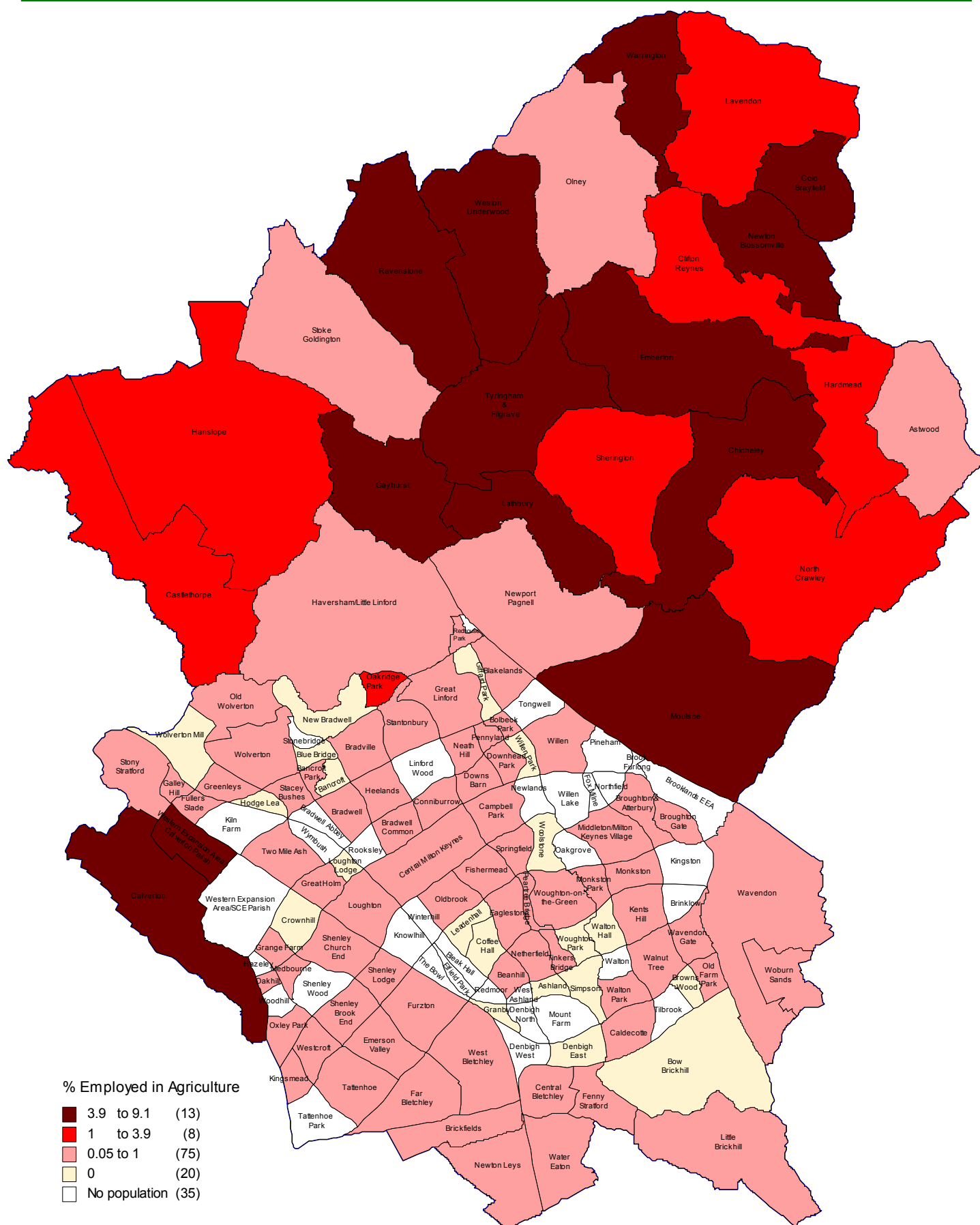

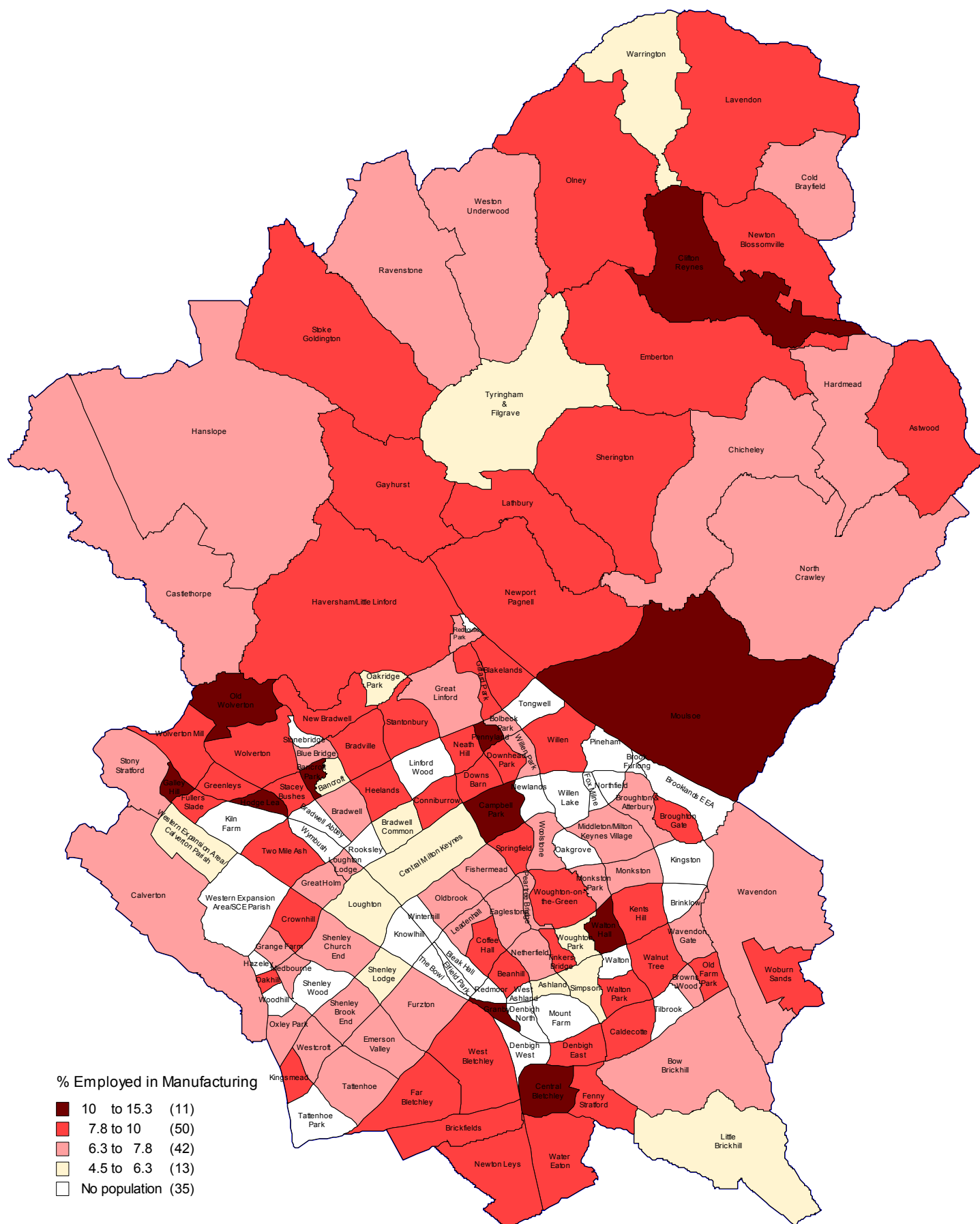
2011 Census Atlas: Industry of Employment

Map 1: % aged 16-74 who are employed in Agriculture



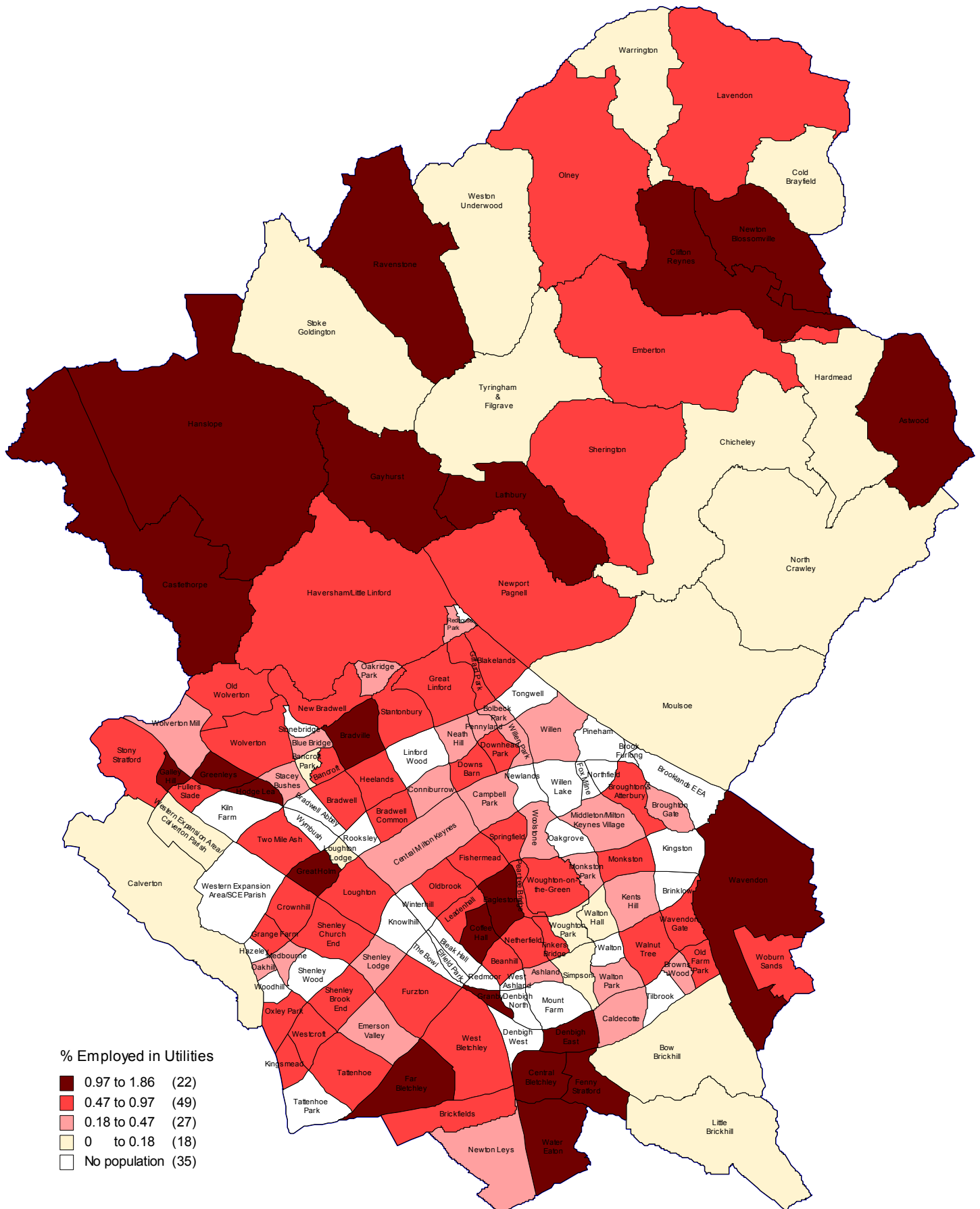
The highest percentage of people aged 16-74 working in agriculture live in rural areas. This includes Western Expansion Area/Calverton Parish (9.1%), Ravenstone (8.3%), Calverton (7.4%), Chicheley (6.6%) and Newton Blossomville (6.5%)

Map 2: % aged 16-74 who are employed in Manufacturing



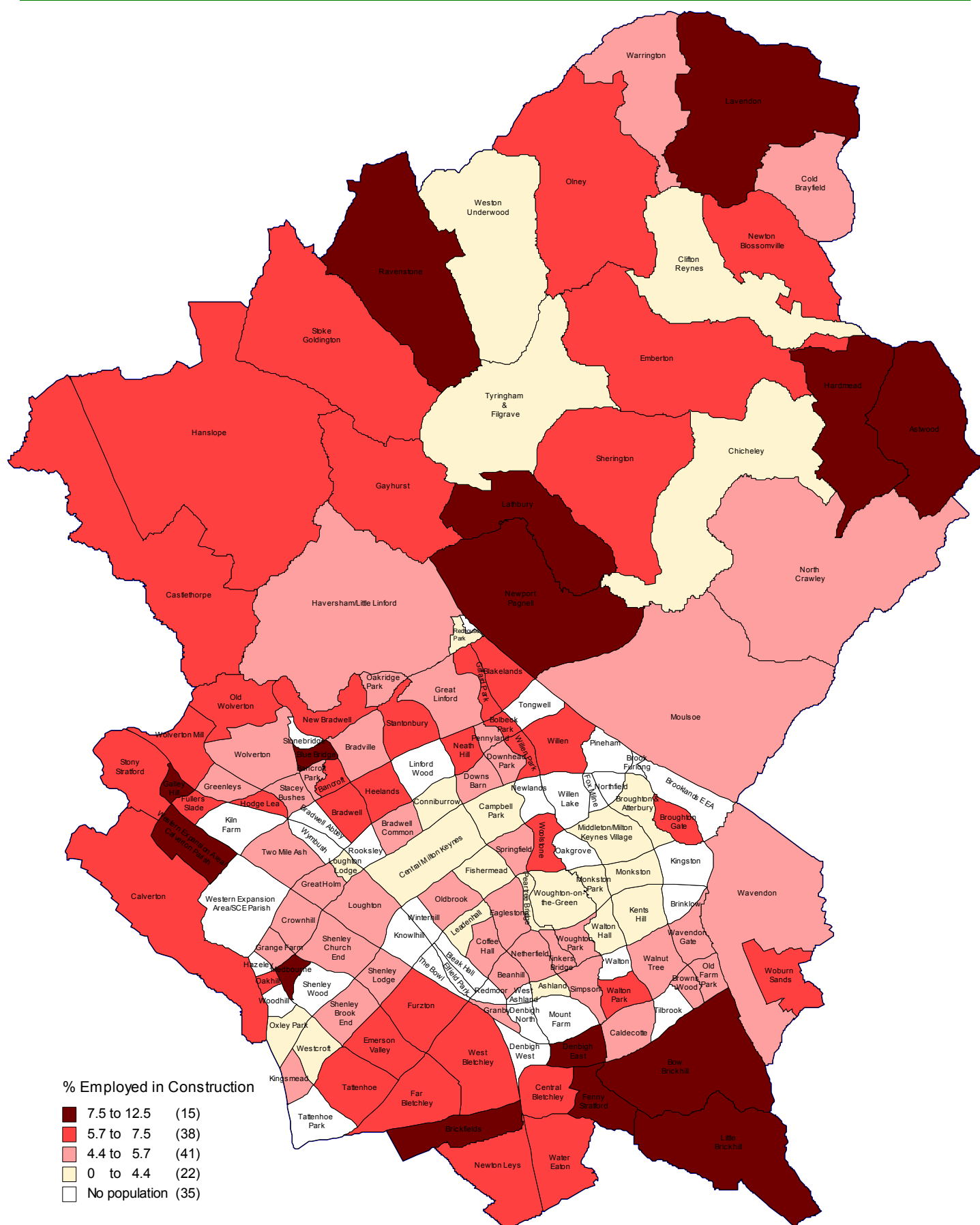
Estates with a high percentage of residents employed in manufacturing are spread throughout the city. They include Granby (14.7%), Old Wolverton (12.1%), Bancroft Park (11.1%), Galley Hill (10.8%), and Campbell Park (10.5%).

Map 3: % aged 16-74 who are employed in Utilities



A relatively small proportion of residents are employed in utilities. Estates with the highest proportion are spread across the borough. They include Ravenstone (1.9%), Coffee Hall (1.8%), Astwood (1.7%), Denbigh East (1.7%) and Castlethorpe (1.7%).

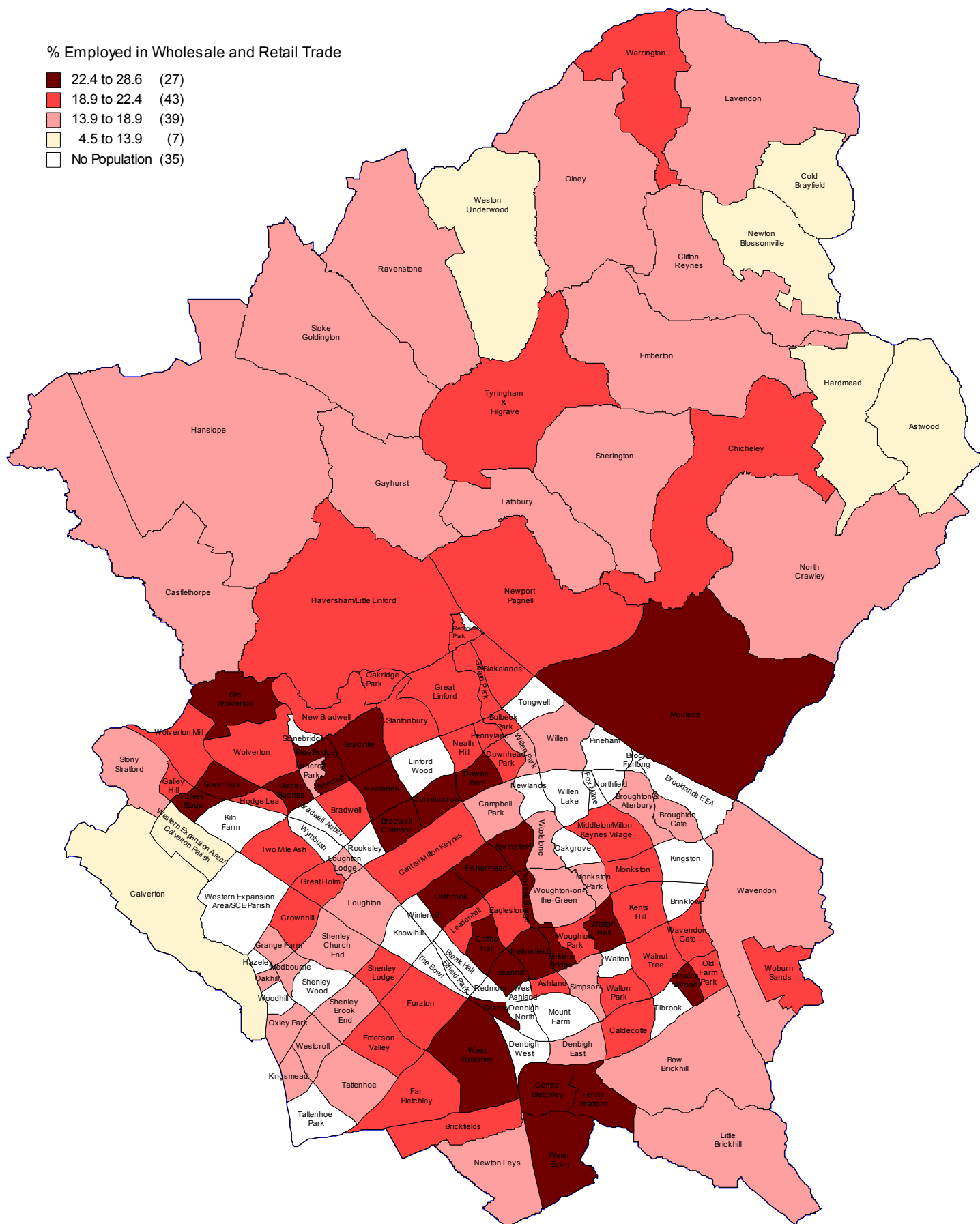
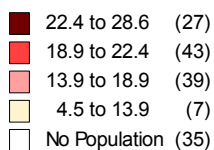
Map 4: % aged 16-74 who employed in Construction



Rural areas tend to have the highest percentage of residents aged 16-74 who are employed in construction. The five estates with the highest percentage are Denbigh East (12.5%), Lathbury (10.5%), Astwood (10.3%), Ravenstone (10.2%) and Hardmead (9.5%).

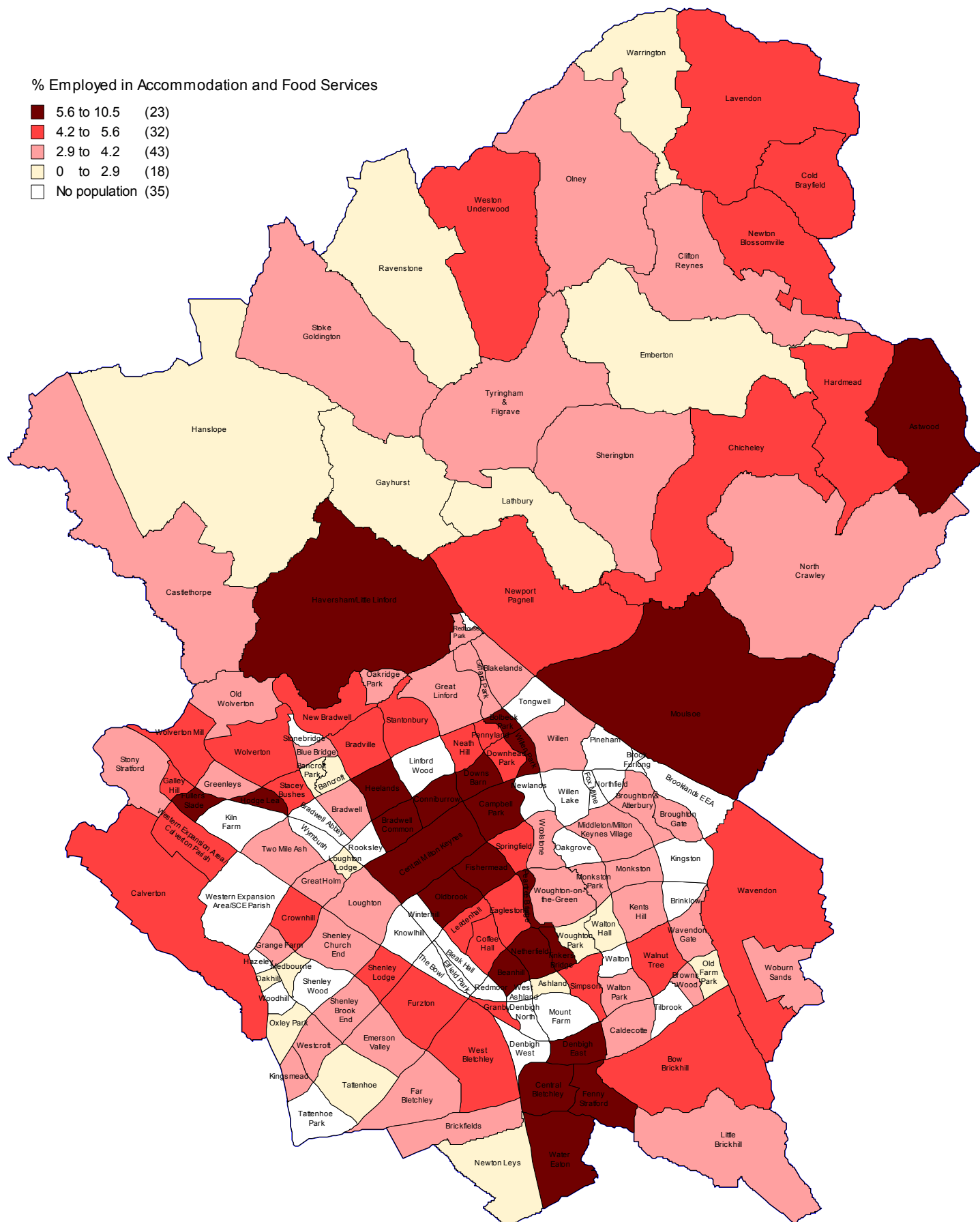
Map 5: % aged 16-74 who are employed in Wholesale and Retail Trade

% Employed in Wholesale and Retail Trade



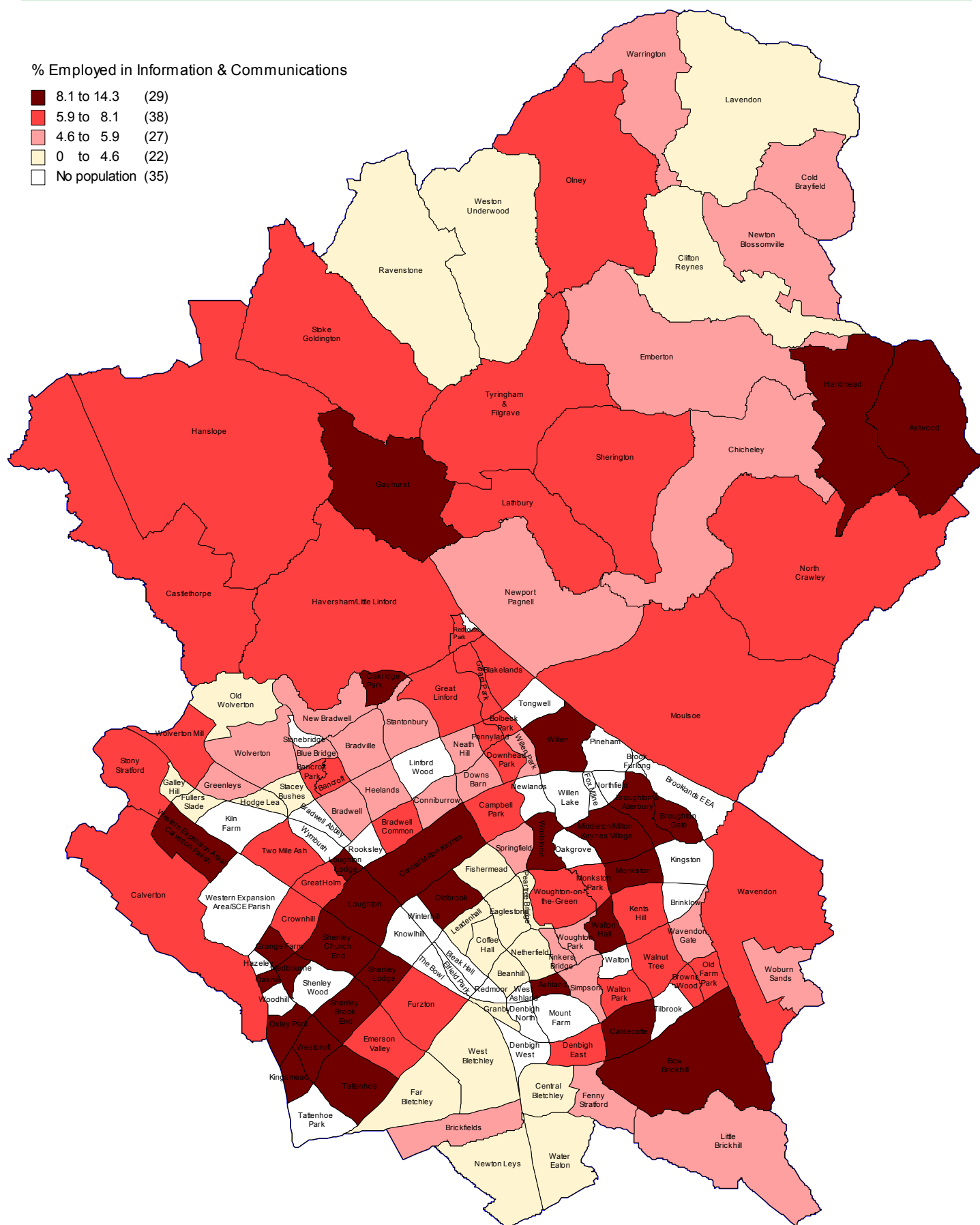
In some estates over a quarter of residents aged 16-74 in employment are employed in the wholesale and retail trade. These include Beanhill (25.8%), Fullers Slade (25.8%), Greenleys (25.2%), Stacey Bushes (25.2%), Fishermead (25.2%) and Water Eaton (25.1%).

Map 7: % aged 16-74 who are employed in Accommodation and Food Services



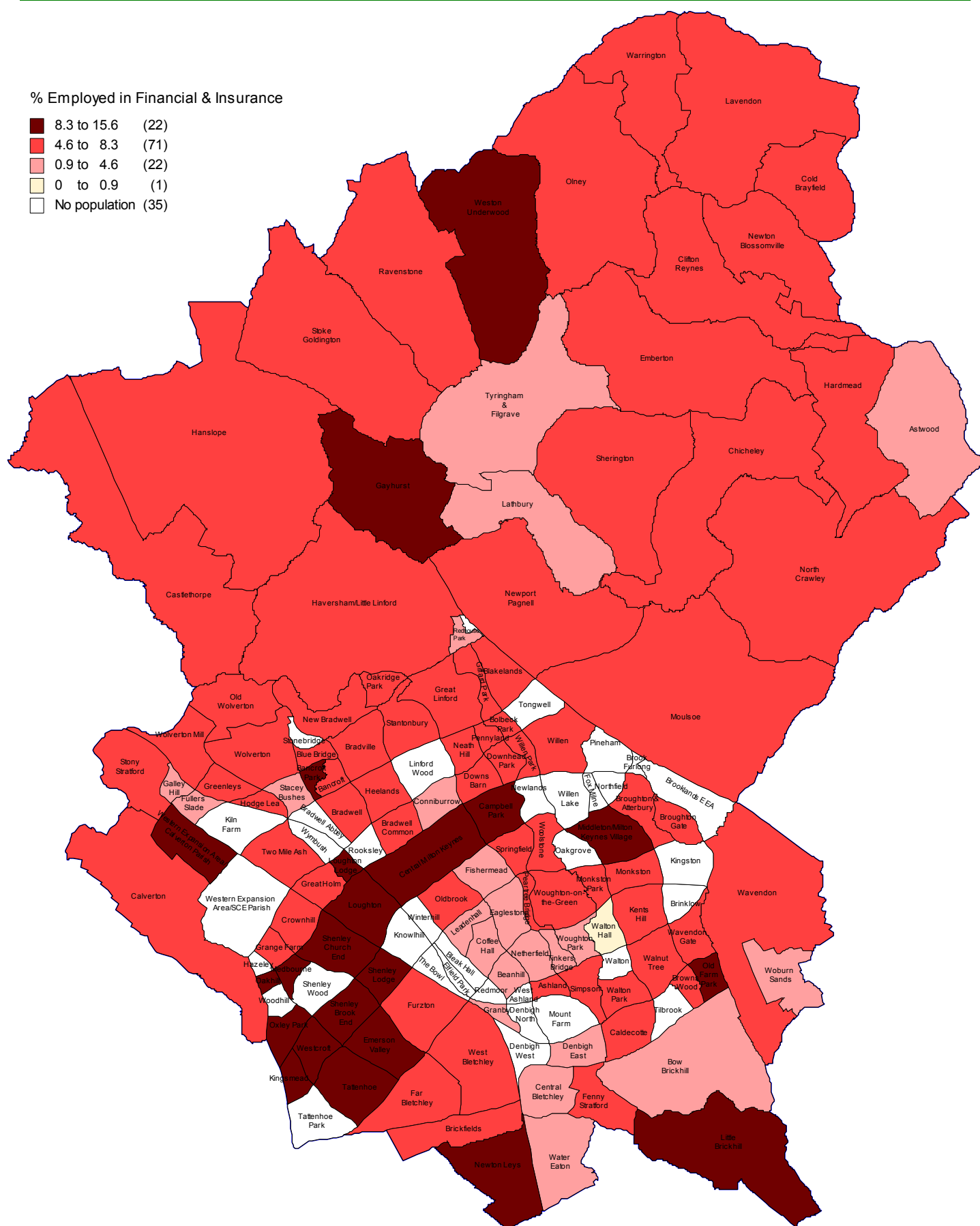
Estates with the highest proportion of residents aged 16-74 in employment who are employed in accommodation and food services tend to be cluster around the city centre, and Bletchley. These include Conniburrow (10.5%), Fishermead (9.0%), Central Bletchley (8.1%), Hodge Lea (7.9%), Oldbrook (7.6%) and Fullers Slade (7.3%).

Map 8: % aged 16-74 who are employed in Information and Communications



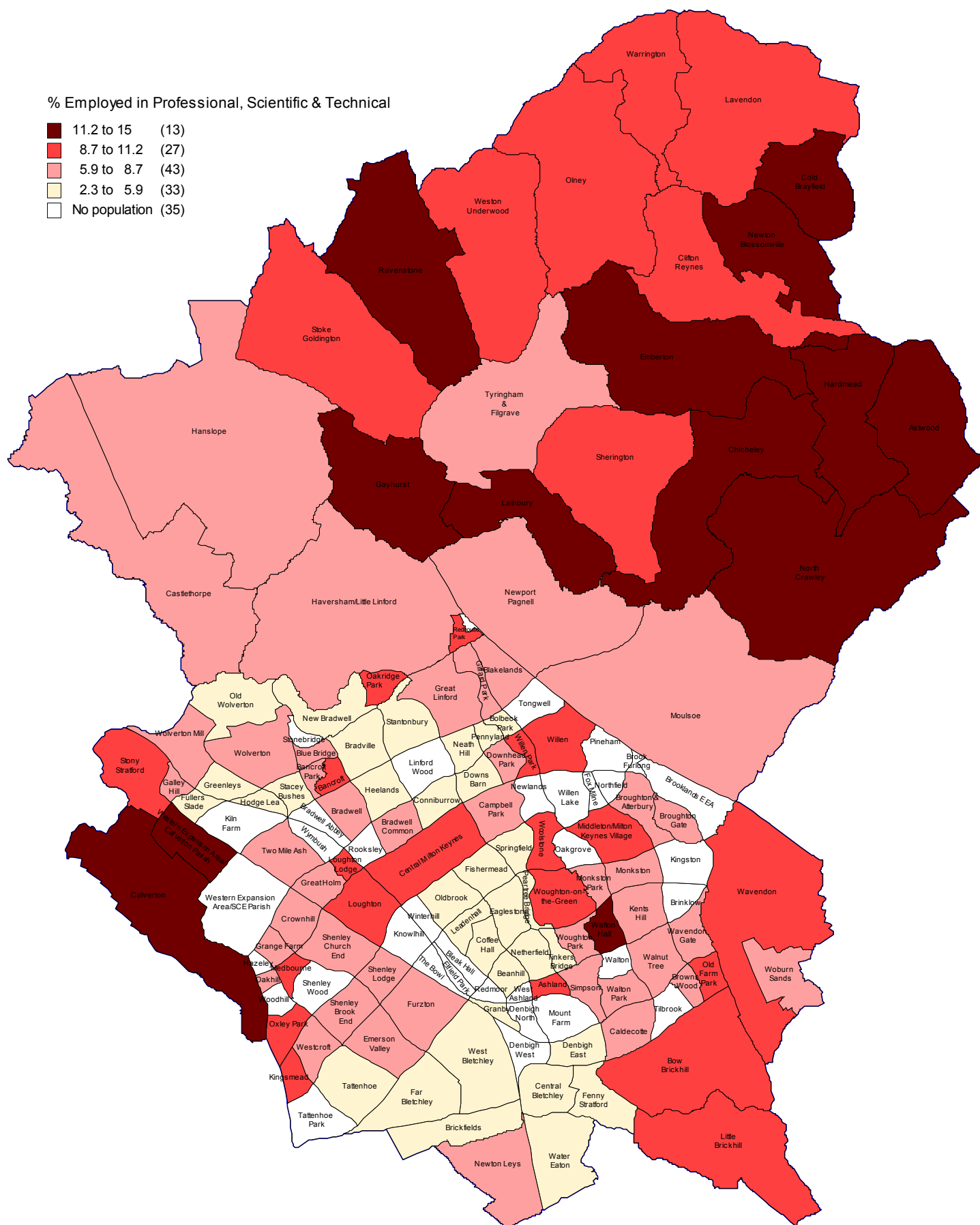
Estates with the highest proportion of residents aged 16-74 in employment who are employed in information and communication are dispersed across the borough. Estates with the highest percentage include Gayhurst (12.5%), Central Milton Keynes (12.5%), Kingsmead (12.0%) and Oakhill (12.0%).

Map 9: % aged 16-74 who are employed in Finance and Insurance



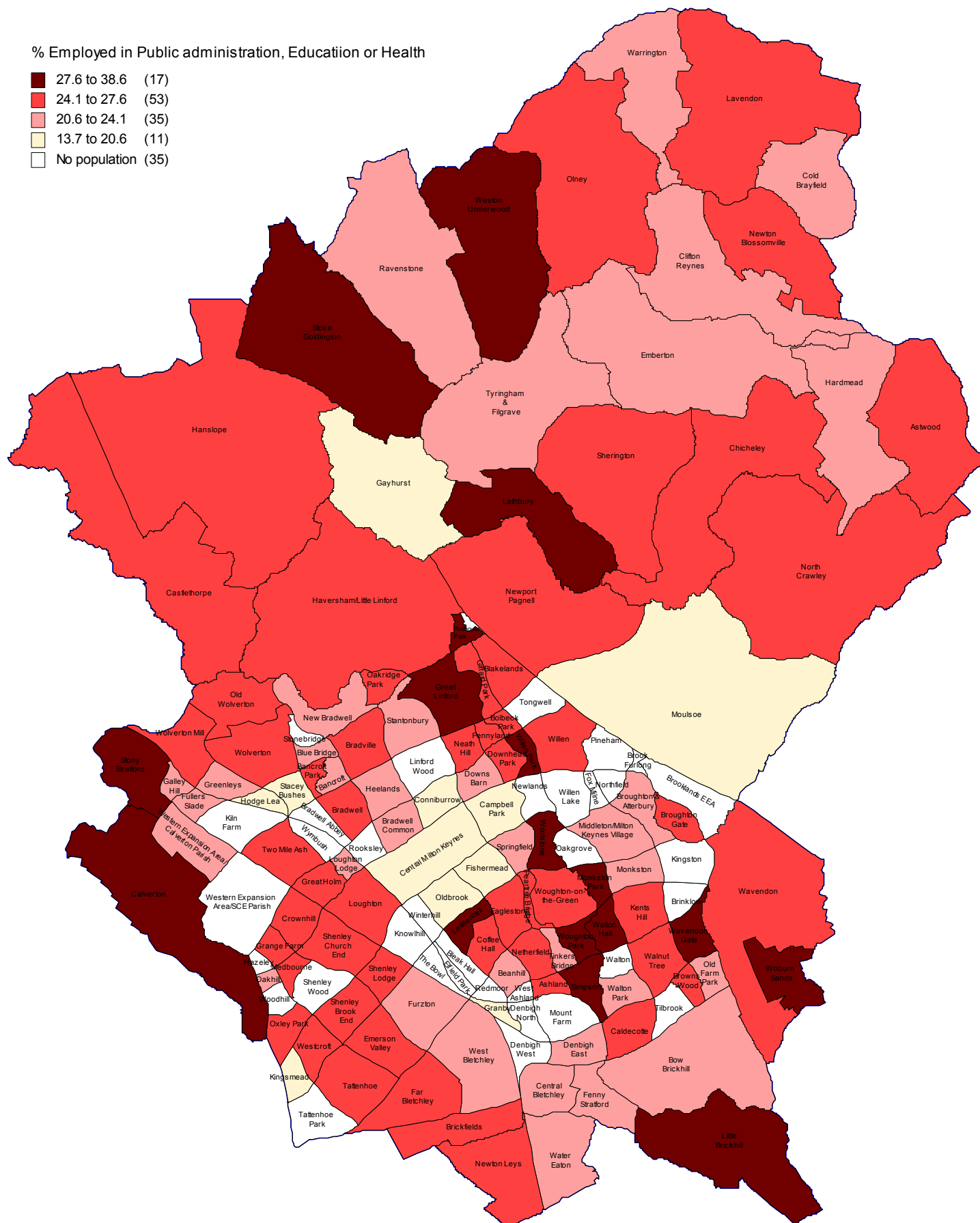
Estates with the highest proportion of residents aged 16-74 in employment who are employed in finance and insurance tend to be clustered around Loughton Park & Emerson Valley wards. The estates with the highest percentage include Loughton Lodge (15.6%), Oakhill (13.4%), Weston Underwood (11.5%), Oxley Park (10.9%) and Medbourne (10.8%).

Map 10: % aged 16-74 who are employed in Professional, Scientific and Technical Activities



Rural areas tend to have the highest percentage of residents aged 16-74 who are employed in professional, scientific and technical activities. The estates with the highest percentage are Cold Brayfield (15.0%), Calverton (14.9%), Newton Blossomville (14.5%) and Lathbury (14.5%).

Map 12: % aged 16-74 who are employed in Public Administration, Education and Health



Over a third of residents of Leadenhall (38.5%) and Simpson (33.9%) aged 16-74 in employment are employed in public administration, education and health. Other estates with a high percentage include Stoke Goldington (30.8%), Monkston Park (30.4%) and Woolstone (29.7%).
