

Introduction

This document provides a set of thematic maps on the **National Statistics Socio-Economic Classification** data by estate and settlement in Milton Keynes from 2011 Census data.

Methodology

These maps were created by the Research and Intelligence team at Milton Keynes Council based on 2011 Census data published by the Office for National Statistics.

The 2011 Census data was not released at estate level. The Research and Intelligence team at Milton Keynes Council therefore added together Output Area (the smallest census geography) data to provide an estimate at estate level. As Output Areas (OAs) boundaries and estate boundaries do not always match, the data for OAs is weighted to estates. The data in the maps should therefore be seen as estimates based on 2011 Census data rather than actual figures. 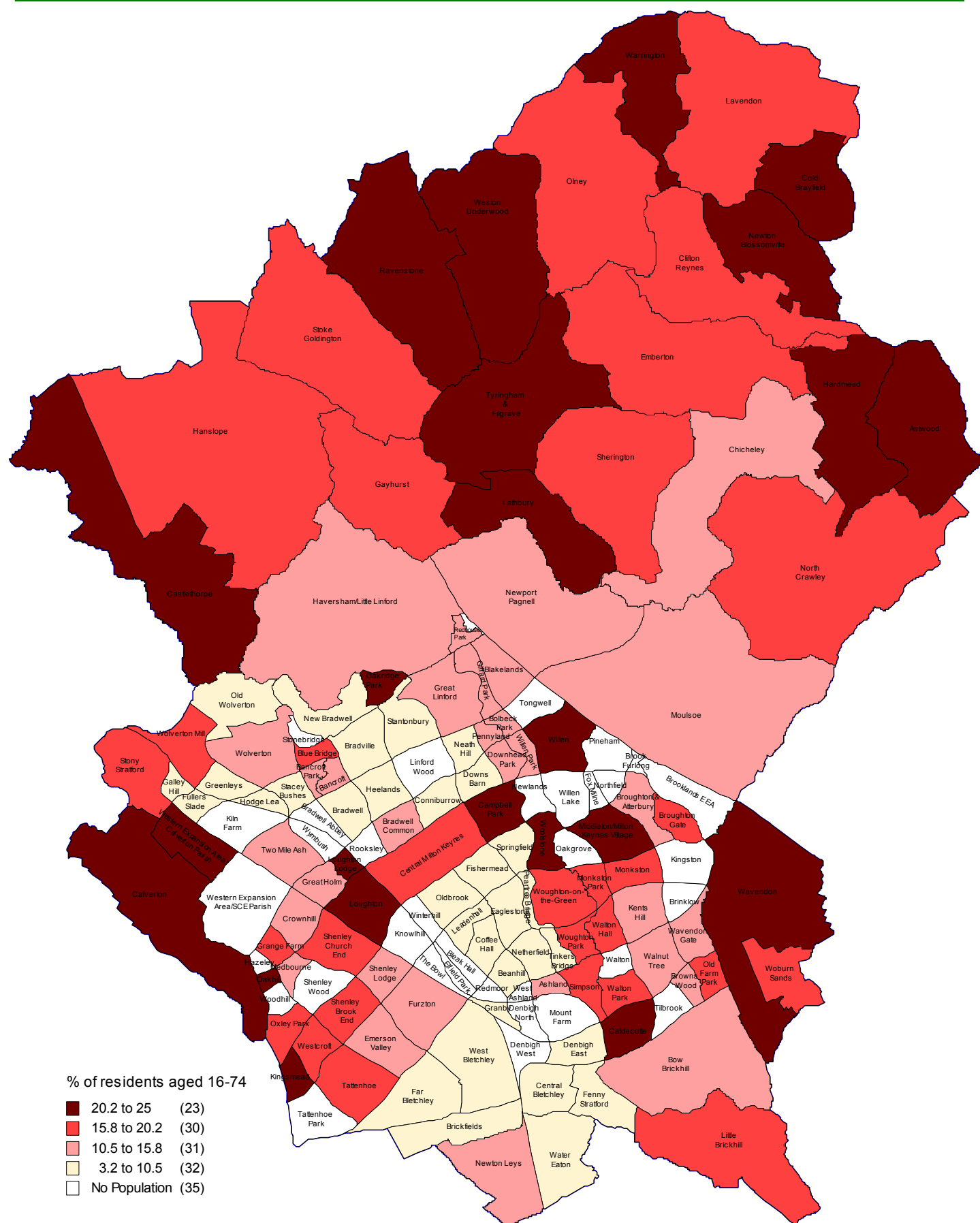

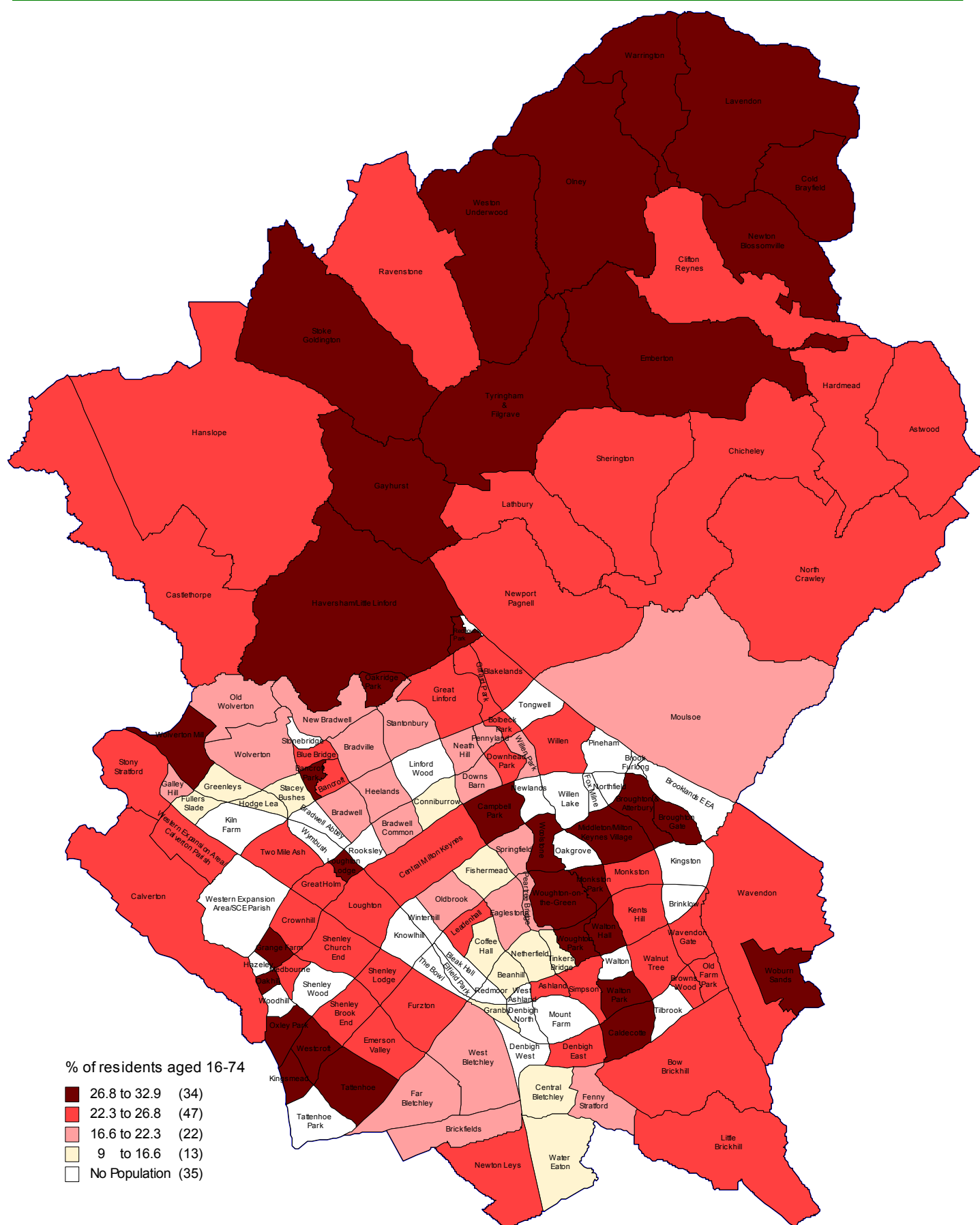
2011 Census Atlas: National Statistics Socio-Economic Classification

Map 1: % aged 16-74 who are in higher managerial, administrative and professional occupations



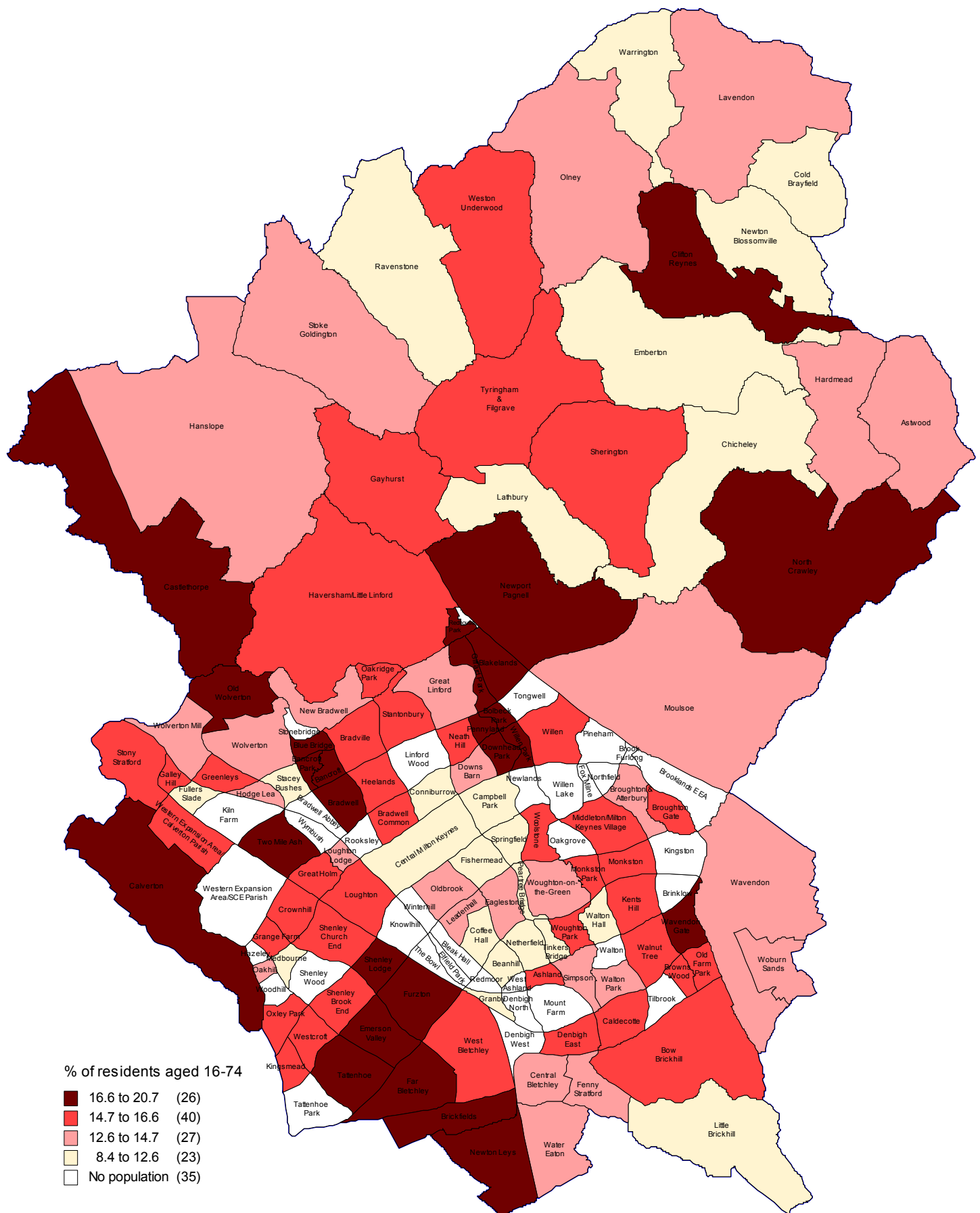
Areas with a high proportion of residents who are in the higher managerial, administrative and professional occupations include Ravenstone (25.0%), Loughton Lodge (24.2%), Kingsmead (23.6%), Middleton/Milton Keynes Village (23.3%) and Woolstone (23.0%).

Map 2: % aged 16-74 who are in lower managerial, administrative and professional occupations



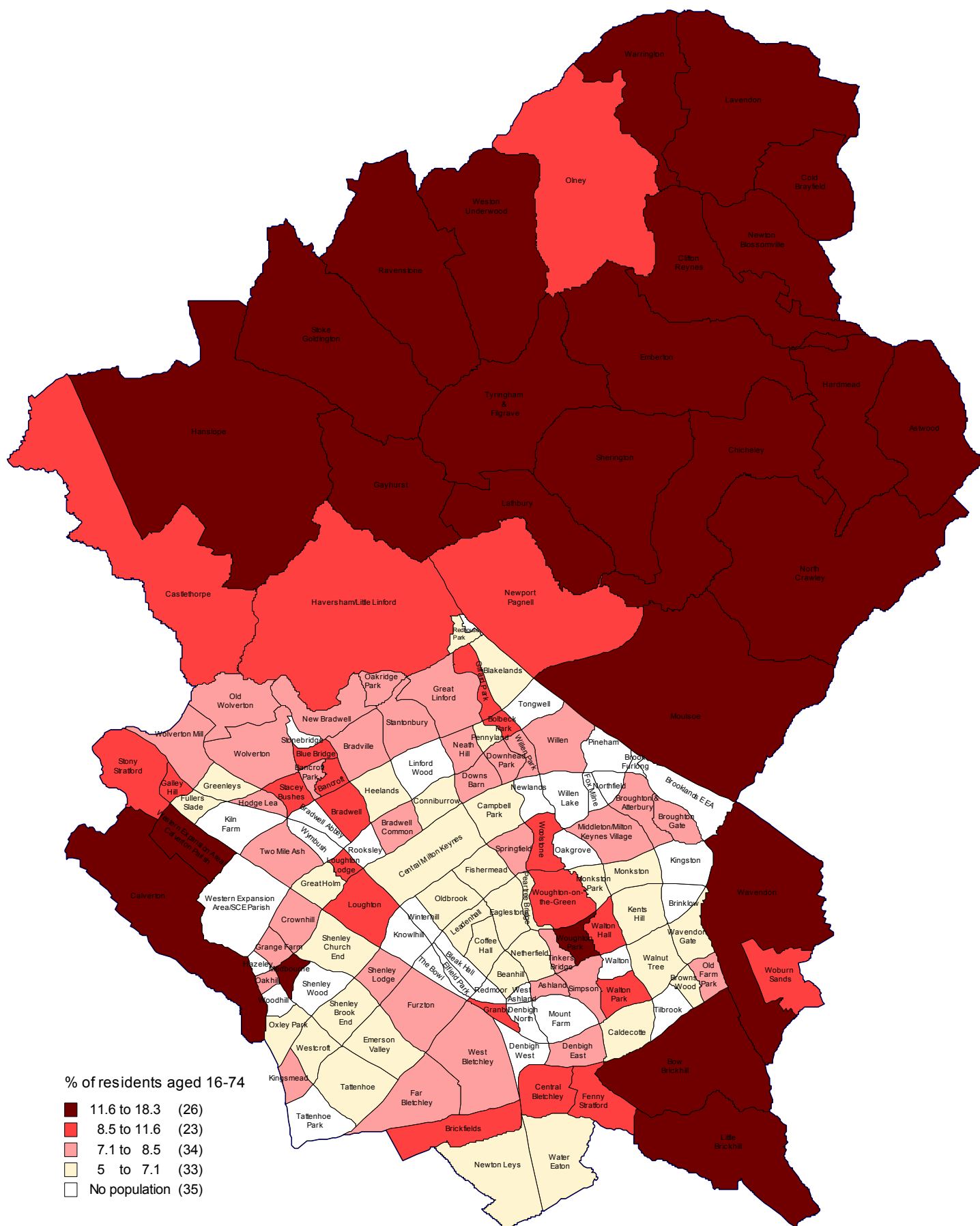
Almost a third of the 16-74 population in some estates are in the lower managerial, administrative and professional occupation category. Areas with the highest percentage include Stoke Goldington (32.9%), Warrington (32.1%), Oxley Park (31.7%), Redhouse Park (31.6%) and Weston Underwood (31.3%).

Map 3: % aged 16-74 who are in intermediate occupations



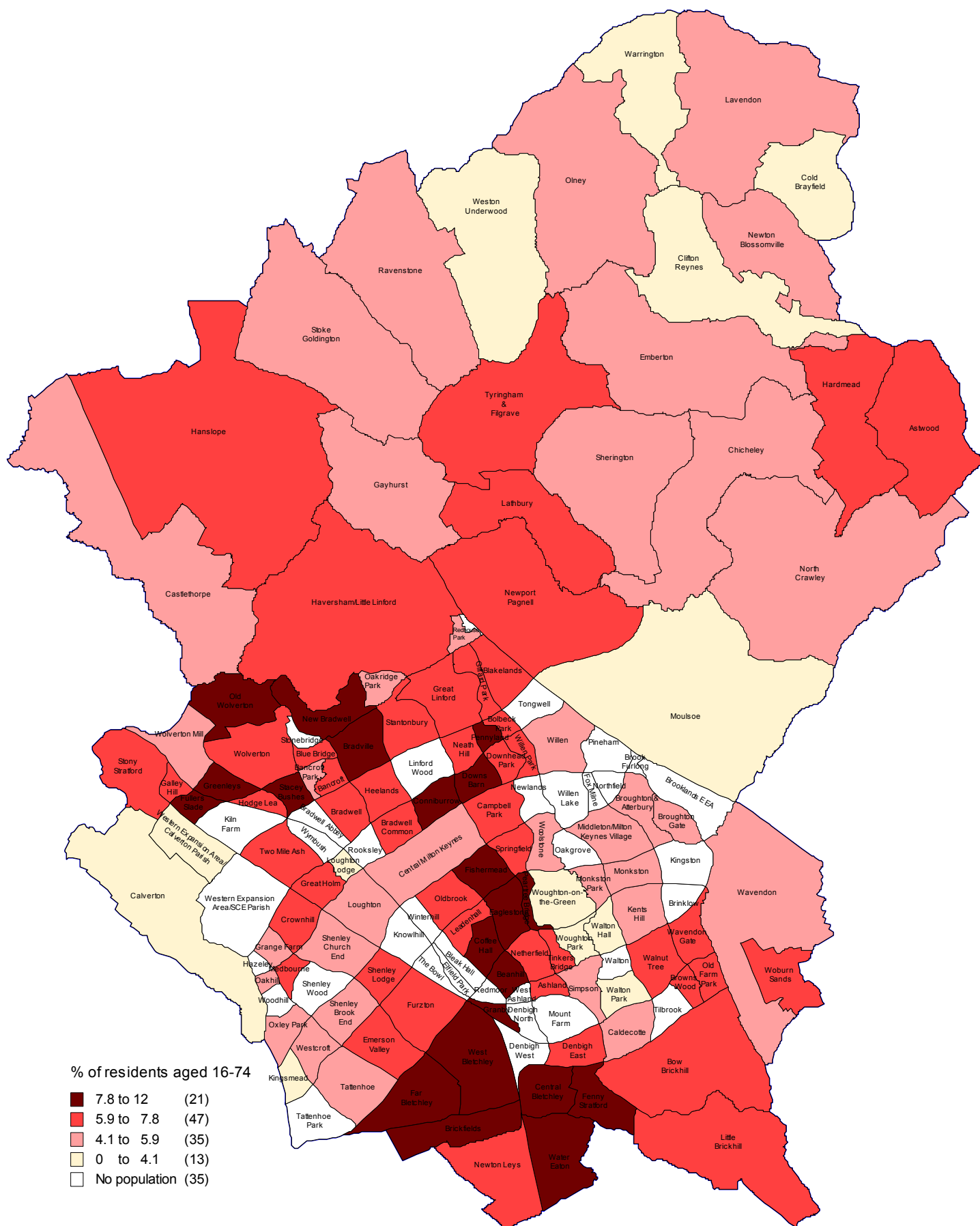
Areas with a high proportion of residents who are in the intermediate occupations category include Bancroft (20.7%), Bancroft Park (20.5%), Redhouse Park (20.1%), Newton Leys (19.4%), Tattenhoe (18.8%), Blakelands (18.6%) and Giffard Park (18.3%).

Map 4: % aged 16-74 who are small employers and own account workers



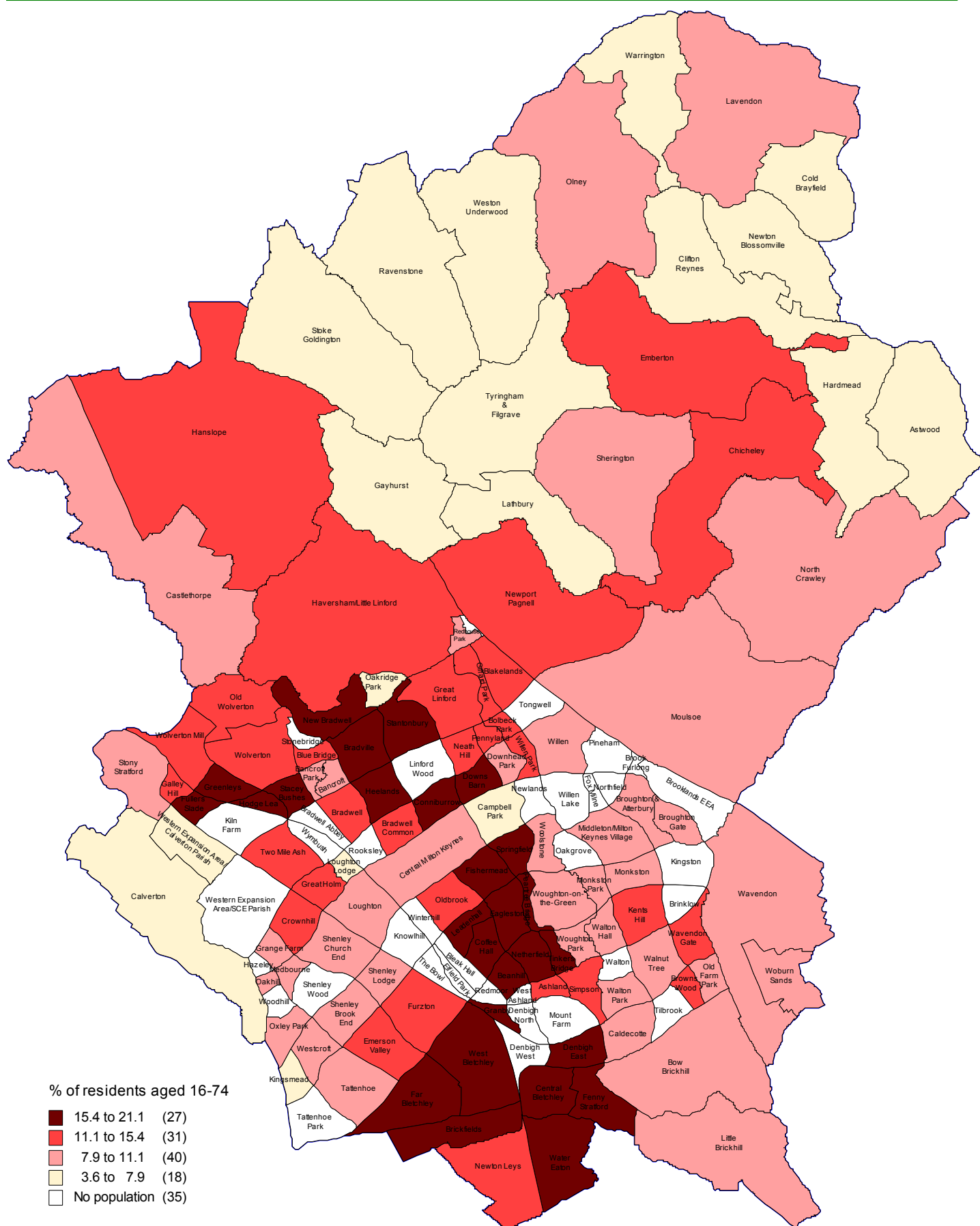
Rural areas have the highest percentage of people aged 16-74 who are small employers and own account workers. The highest percentage occurs in Lathbury (18.3%), Weston Underwood (17.6%), Ravenstone (17.3%), Gayhurst (16.8%), Tyringham & Filgrave (16.3%) and Moulsoe (16.3%).

Map 5: % aged 16-74 who are in lower supervisory and technical occupations



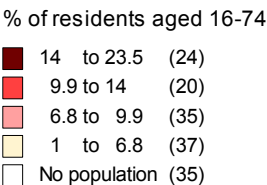
Areas with a high proportion of residents who are in the lower supervisory and technical occupations category include Old Wolverton (12.0%), Granby (11.2%), Fenny Stratford (9.5%), Peartree Bridge (9.5%), Water Eaton (9.2%), Fishermead (9.0%) and Fullers Slade (8.9%).

Map 6: % aged 16-74 who are in semi-routine occupations



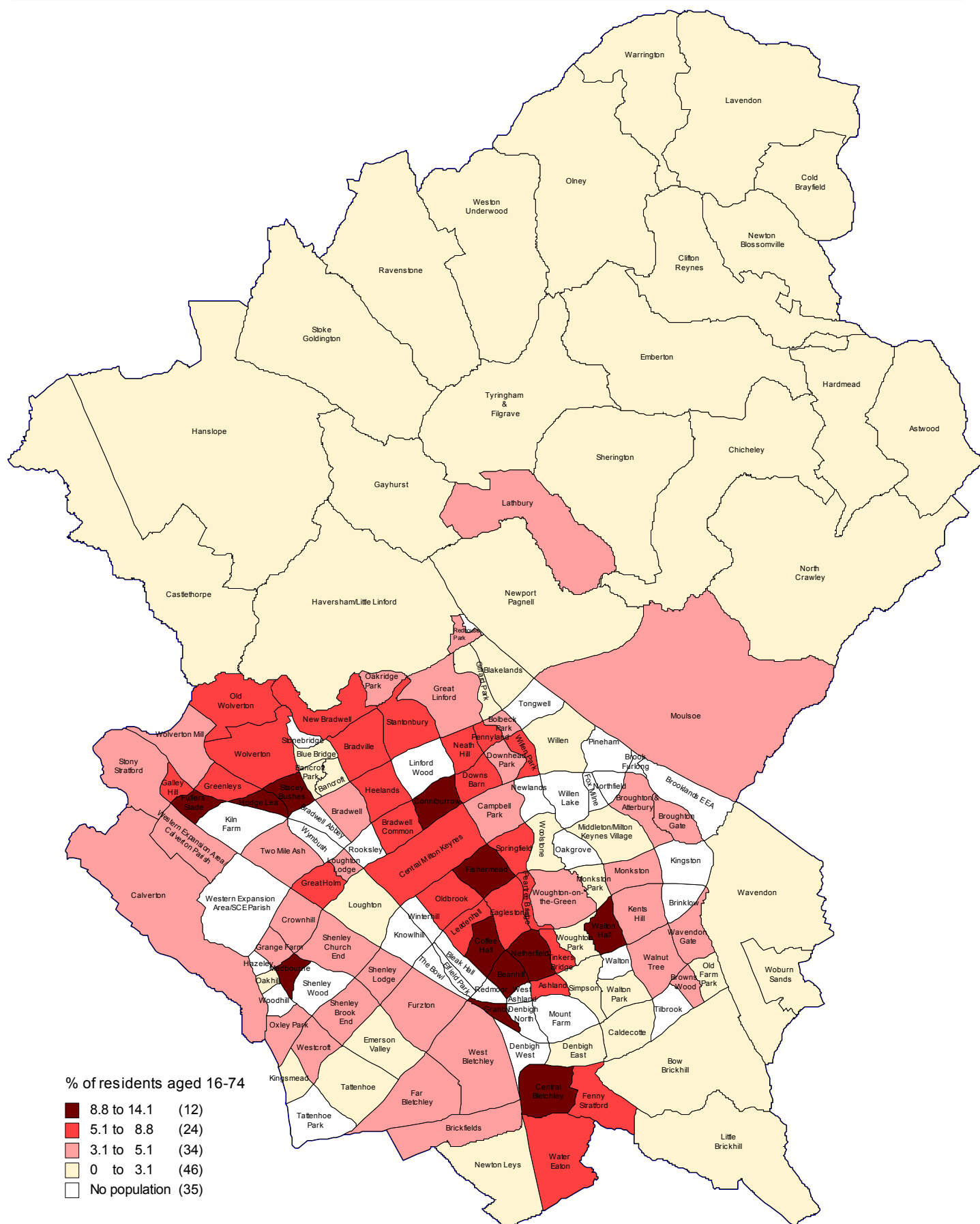
There are a cluster of estates with a high percentage of residents in the semi-routine occupations category in Bletchley and Woughton Ward. Areas with a high percentage include Beanhill (21.1%), Water Eaton (20.7%), Greenleys (20.1%), Hodge Lea (19.9%), Eaglestone (19.3%) and Netherfield (19.0%).

Map 7: % aged 16-74 who are in routine occupations



All estates in Woughton Ward have a high proportion of residents aged 16-74 who in the routine occupation category. There are other clusters in Bletchley, just north and south of the city centre and around the south of Wolverton Ward. This includes Beanhill (23.5%), Netherfield (21.0%), Stacey Bushes (21.0%) and Granby (20.5%).

Map 8: % aged 16-74 who are in the never worked and long-term unemployed category



Estates with high proportions of residents aged 16-74 who are in the never worked and long-term unemployed category are dispersed through the city area. Estates with the highest percentage include Granby (14.1%), Netherfield (13.7%), Beanhill (12.3%), Fullers Slade (11.9%) and Fishermead (11.3%).
