Homeworking: Milton Keynes

This briefing provides details on the number and characteristics of homeworkers in Milton Keynes from 2011 Census data.

Key Points

- 1. In 2011 12,500 people aged 16-74 mainly worked from home in Milton Keynes. This is 10.0% of all those in employment.
- 2. The number of homeworkers increased by over a third (35.1%) between 2001 and 2011.
- 3. The majority of homeworkers (57.9%) are employed in manager, director & senior office and professional and technical occupations.

Definition of Homeworker

The Census asks people to state their location of work. This report details the results of people who stated that they 'Work mainly at or from home'. It therefore excludes people who work from home occasionally, for example those working from home once or twice a week.

The Office for National Statistics initially published incorrect data in February 2013 on homeworkers in table CT0015 (alternative). This document provides the revised figures published in November 2013, alongside tables DC6607, DC6608 and DC6609.

Number of Homeworkers

In 2011 there were 12,500 homeworkers in Milton Keynes; this is 10.0% of the total number of people in employment. It is a slightly smaller proportion when compared with England total of 10.3%.

The number of homeworkers increased by over a third (+35.1%) between 2001 and 2011, it rose from 9,250 to 12,500 people or 8.6% of those in employment to 10.0%.

Demographic Profile of Homeworkers

Table one outlines the age and gender profile of homeworkers. It details that there were more male homeworkers than female. The 35-49 year old age group are the largest age group, accounting for 41% of homeworkers. Just 500 people aged 16-24 are homeworkers; this is 4% of all homeworkers.

Industry of Employment

A quarter of people who work from home in Milton Keynes are employed in the financial, real estate, professional and administrative sector. Large proportions are also found in the public administration, education and health (18.0%), transport and communication (17.9%) and distribution, hotels and restaurant (15.7%) sectors.

Occupation of Homeworkers


The majority of homeworkers (57.9%) are employed in manager, director & senior office and professional and technical occupations. Very small proportions are employed in sales and customer service occupations (3.4%), process, plant and machine operatives (5.5%) and elementary (5.5%) occupations.

Geographic Location of Homeworkers

The Census also provides the number of homeworkers by ward. Map 1 outlines that rural wards have the highest proportion of homeworkers. 15.9% of those in employment in Danesborough ward worked from home. This compares to just 6.0% in Eaton Manor ward.
