# Campbell Park Ward 2011 Census Profile



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# 1. Executive Summary

## **Population**

- The population of Campbell Park in 2011 was 16,860.
- Campbell Park had a very high population growth rate when compared with Milton Keynes as a whole. The population increased by 3,880 people (29.9%) to 16,860 between 2001 and 2011.
- Campbell Park had a younger age profile than Milton Keynes as a whole. It
  had a large percentage of 20-44 year olds. 47.7% of the population were in
  this age group compared with 37.5% in Milton Keynes. Just 6.0% of the
  population were aged 65+ compared with 11.1% in Milton Keynes
- The highest growth rate between 2001 and 2011 occurred in the 25-29 year old age group, growing by 80%.
- Campbell Park had a large black and minority ethnic community. 51.1% of the population in classified themselves in a black and minority ethnic group compared with 26.1% in Milton Keynes.
- 2,240 people classified themselves as Black African; this is 13.3% of the population compared with 5.2% in Milton Keynes.
- 39.3% of the population in Campbell Park were born outside of the UK. This is significantly higher than Milton Keynes as a whole (18.5%).

#### Health

- 930 residents said their day to day activities were limited a lot because of health issues. This is 5.5% of the population compared with 6.4% for Milton Keynes.
- 1,280 residents in Campbell Park provided some unpaid care a week. This is 7.6% of the population compared with 8.8% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

#### Housing

- Campbell Park had the highest percentage of non-pensioner one person households compared with all wards in Milton Keynes (24.9% compared to 17.2%).
- Campbell Park had the largest percentage of dwellings classified as purpose built flats of all wards in Milton Keynes. In total 39.8% of dwellings in the ward were flats compared with Milton Keynes (16.2%).
- A growing percentage of dwellings in the ward were flats. 27.1% of dwellings in the ward were flats in 2001, this compares to 39.8% in 2011.
- Campbell Park had a significantly lower percentage of owner occupied households and a larger percentage living in social and private rented accommodation than Milton Keynes as a whole.

• The percentage of households living in private rented accommodation in Campbell Park more than doubled between 2001 and 2011. It increased from 15.7% of dwellings in 2001 to 34.4% in 2011.

# **Transport**

• 32.0% of households in Campbell Park had no cars or vans in the household. This is the second highest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes.

#### **Education**

- Levels of qualifications in Campbell Park were higher than the Milton Keynes average. 15.5% had no qualifications compared with 18.0% in Milton Keynes.
- In addition to qualifications being higher than Milton Keynes, levels of qualifications also increased considerably between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 18.5% of residents aged 16+ had a degree or higher qualification by 2011 this had increased to 29.1%.

#### **Economic**

- A smaller percentage (65.9%) of Campbell Park residents aged 16-74 were in employment compared with Milton Keynes (68%).
- There was a fall from 51.5% to 47.3% between 2001 and 2011 in the percentage of the 16-74 year old population in Campbell Park working as full time employees.
- 88.0% of Campbell Park residents in employment were employed in the service sector compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole. The wholesale and retail trade industrial sector was the largest employer of Campbell Park residents.
- Residents in Campbell Park were more likely to be classified in lower supervisory and technical occupations, routine occupations and never worked and long-term unemployed socio-economic categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.

# 2. Introduction

This document provides a profile of Campbell Park Ward from data released via the 2011 Census. The profile includes data for the ward and comparisons to Milton Keynes and to the 2001 Census figures.

# 3. Population Size and Age Structure

Campbell Park had a very high population growth rate when compared with Milton Keynes as a whole. The population increased by 3,880 people (29.9%) to 16,860 between 2001 and 2011.

In 2011 the population of Campbell Park was 16,860. Table 1 outlines that the population growth rate in Campbell Park between 2001 and 2011 was significantly higher than for Milton Keynes as a whole. Campbell Park grew by 3,880 people; this is an increase of 29.9% compared with 17% for Milton Keynes. Out of the 23 wards in Milton Keynes it had the 4<sup>th</sup> largest population growth rate between 2001 and 2011.

Campbell Park had a large percentage of 20-44 year olds. 47.7% of the population were in this age group compared with 37.5% in Milton Keynes.

Campbell Park had a younger age profile than the Milton Keynes average. The average age in Campbell Park was 31 compared with 35 for Milton Keynes.

Table 2 shows the age structure of Campbell Park compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the ward had a lower percentage in the older age groups. In Campbell Park in 2011 just 6.0% of the population were aged 65+ compared with 11.1% in Milton Keynes.

Campbell Park had a high percentage of 20-44 year olds. It had the highest percentage of 20-24 and 25-29 years olds of all wards in Milton Keynes.



The highest growth rate between 2001 and 2011 in Campbell Park occurred in the 25-29 year old age group.

Graph 2 shows the change in age structure between 2001 and 2011. It outlines that the highest growth occurred in the 25-29 year old age group. The number of people aged 25-29 grew by 80.4% from 1,260 people in 2001 to 2,280 people in 2011.

The number of people aged 0 to 4 also increased significantly; it increased by 74.1% from 860 to 1,490 people. Other age groups that grew significantly include the 60-64 (+68.8%) and 30-44 (+38.5%) age groups.

The 5-19 and 75+ year old age groups remained roughly the same size between 2001 and 2011.

## 4. Ethnicity

Campbell Park had a large black and minority ethnic community. 51.1% of the population in classified themselves in a black and minority ethnic group compared with 26.1% in Milton Keynes

Overall 8,610 people in Campbell Park were from a black and minority ethnic group this is 51.1% of the population compared with 26.1% in Milton Keynes.

Table 3 shows the number of people in each ethnic group in Campbell Park compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the ward ranks very highly for all black and minority ethnic groups except White Irish.

- 2,240 people classified themselves as Black African; this is 13.3% of the population compared with 5.2% in Milton Keynes and is the highest of all wards in Milton Keynes.
- 1,610 people in Campbell Park classified themselves as White Other this is 9.5 % of the population, higher than the Milton Keynes figure of 5.1%. Campbell Park

also had relatively high proportions of Asian Other residents. 1,190 residents classified themselves in this category; this is 7.1% of the population compared with 2.5% in Milton Keynes.



The population is becoming more ethnically diverse. In 2001 22.1% of the population were from a black and minority ethnic group compared with 51.1% in 2011.

Graph 3 outlines that there were a number of ethnic groups in Campbell Park which experienced very high population growth between 2001 and 2011. The Black African ethnic group had the highest growth in Campbell Park between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 it accounted for 3.7% of the population by 2011 it accounted for 13.3%, this is an increase from 480 people to 2,240. Other ethnic groups which increased significantly between 2001 and 2011 include Other Asian (0.8% to 7.1%) and White Other (3.0% to 9.5%).

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# 5. Country of Birth

# 39.3% of the population in Campbell Park were born outside of the UK. This is higher than Milton Keynes as a whole (18.5%).

Campbell Park had the higher percentage of its population born outside of the UK of all wards in Milton Keynes. 39.3% of the population in Campbell Park were born outside of the UK, this is a total of 6,625 people. Table 4 shows the country of birth for Campbell Park residents compared with Milton Keynes.

0.7% of the Campbell Park population were born in Ireland and 4.2% were born in EU member states as at March 2001. 1,020 people where born in 2001-2011 EU accession countries; this is 6.0% of the population significantly higher than Milton Keynes as a whole (2.5%). 4,780 people (28.4%) were born outside of the EU, significantly higher than the Milton Keynes figure of 13.0%.

The number of Campbell Park residents born outside of the UK increased from 2,060 people to 6,625 between 2001 and 2011.

# 2,830 people living in Campbell Park had been living in the UK for less than five years.

16.8% of the total Campbell Park population had lived in the UK for less than five years. This is the highest of all wards in Milton Keynes and is significantly higher than Milton Keynes as a whole (5.4%).

# 6. Household Language

17.7% of households in Campbell Park had no adult who had English as their main language compared with 6.4% in Milton Keynes.

72.5% of households in Campbell Park had all adults in the household with English as their main language and 82.3% had at least one adult with English as their main language. 1,170 households had no adult who had English as their main language. This is 17.7% of the population, the highest percentage of all Milton Keynes wards.

# 7. Religion

46.9% of the Campbell Park population stated they were Christian, 10.7% Muslim and 7.7% Hindu. 26.8% of the population in Campbell Park stated they had no religion.


Table 7 shows the number of people in each religious group in Campbell Park compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the largest religious group in Milton Keynes was Christian which accounted for 46.9% of the population, this is lower than Milton Keynes as a whole (52.8%).

1,810 people in the ward identified themselves as Muslim; this is 10.7% of the population compared with 4.8% in Milton Keynes. 7.7% of the population identified themselves as Hindu compared with 2.8% in Milton Keynes.

Graph 4 outlines the changes in religion in Campbell Park between 2001 and 2011. It shows that there was a decline in the percentage of the population that stated they were Christian (58.9% to 46.9%) and an increase in the percentage that stated they had no religion (24.6% to 26.8%), Muslim (4.9% to 10.7%) and Hindu (2.4% to 7.7%).

#### 8. Health

5.5% of residents in Campbell Park said their day to day activities were limited a lot because of health issues. This compares to 6.4% in Milton Keynes.

The 2011 Census asked two questions on the health of residents.

# 1. Are your day-to-day activities limited because of a health problem or disability which has lasted, or is expected to last, at least 12 months?

930 people stated their day-today activities were limited a lot due to health; this is 5.5% of population compared with 6.4% in Milton Keynes. This is the sixth lowest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes. In total 12.1% of residents in Campbell Park stated they were limited a lot or a little. This compares to 13.9% in Milton Keynes.

# 2. How is your health in general?

670 respondents in Campbell Park felt their general health was bad or very bad. This is 4.0% of the population compared with 4.1% of the Milton Keynes population. 86.2% of residents in the ward felt they had good or very good health compared with 85.1% in Milton Keynes.

The 2011 Census questions on health were different to the 2001 Census and therefore can not be directly compared.

Health status is very strongly correlated to age. Residents in the older age groups tend to be less healthy than younger age groups. Therefore to make robust comparisons between areas health by age is needed.

## 9. Carers

1,280 residents in Campbell Park provided some unpaid care a week. This is 7.6% of the population compared with 8.8% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

The 2011 Census asked respondents if they provided some unpaid care each week to others either because of a long term disability or old age. The results show that around 1,280 people in Campbell Park provided some unpaid care. This is 7.6% of the population, slightly smaller than the Milton Keynes figure of 8.8%.

Table 10 shows the number of hours of unpaid care residents undertook each week. It outlines that around 560 people undertook more than 20 hours of unpaid care each week with 290 of those undertaking more than 50 hours.



The number of Campbell Park residents providing unpaid care increased by 220 people (22.1%) between 2001 and 2011.

The number of Campbell Park residents providing unpaid care grew from 1,030 in 2001 to 1,280 in 2011. However as a percentage of the ward's population it decreased slightly from 7.9% in 2001 to 7.6% in 2011.

Graph 5 outlines that those that were providing unpaid care were doing so with greater hours. 3.3% of the population provided unpaid care for 20 or more hours a week compared with 2.8% in 2001.

# 10. Living Arrangements

Campbell Park had the highest percentage of single (never married) people not living in a couple of all wards in Milton Keynes and a lower percentage of people living as a couple.

4,810 residents aged 16 and over in Campbell Park were married and living as a couple, this is 36.5% compared to 46.7% for Milton Keynes. 4,380 (33.2%) residents were single (never married) whilst 969 people (7.4%) were divorced.

## 11. Household Composition

Campbell Park had the highest percentage of non-pensioner one person households of all wards in Milton Keynes.

There were 6,610 households in Campbell Park in 2011. 1,650 (24.9%) of these households were one person non-pensioner household, this compares to 17.2% for Milton Keynes as a whole. The ward did had a smaller percentage of one person households aged 65 and over (5.0% compared to 8.7% in Milton Keynes).

In total 2,130 (32.3%) households in Campbell Park had dependent children this compares to 35.0% in Milton Keynes.

600 households, or 9.0%, in Campbell Park were lone parent households with dependent children. This compares to 8.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

The percentage of households with dependent children in Campbell Park decreased from 33.7% in 2001 to 32.3% in 2011.

Table 13 outlines how household composition changed between 2001 and 2011. The number of households with dependent children grew from 1,800 to 2,130; but declined as a percentage from 33.7% of households to 32.3%.

The percentage of lone parent households with dependent children declined slightly from 9.5% in 2001 to 9.0% in 2011.

# 12. Rooms and Bedrooms

The ward had an average of 2.5 bedrooms per household compared with 2.5 in Milton Keynes.

The ward's average household size of 2.5 was the seventh highest of all 23 wards in Milton Keynes. The average household size in the ward grew from 2.4 to 2.5 between 2001 and 2011.

Campbell Park had a smaller average number of rooms per household than Milton Keynes. There was an average of 4.5 rooms per household compared with 5.5 in Milton Keynes.

780 households in Campbell Park lived in over occupied accommodation.

The 2011 Census also estimates the number of households with a high occupancy rating. An occupancy rating of -1 implies that a household had one less room/bedroom than required. Table 15 shows that Campbell Park had around 780 households (11.9%) which were over occupied in terms of bedrooms. This was higher than the Milton Keynes figure of 5.1%.

Over occupancy in terms of rooms increased between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 880 (16.6%) households had an occupancy rating of -1 or less, in 2011 it had risen to 1,670 (25.3%). This is a trend that is seen nationally.

# 13. Accommodation Type

Campbell Park had the largest percentage of dwellings classified as purpose built flats of all wards in Milton Keynes.

There were 7,030 dwellings in Campbell Park in 2011. The 2011 Census asked residents what type of dwelling they lived in. A larger percentage (39.8%) of dwellings in the ward were flats compared with Milton Keynes (16.2%).

Campbell Park had a much smaller percentage of detached properties than Milton Keynes as a whole (15.0% compared to 28.2%). The ward had a lower percentage of semi-detached properties.



A growing percentage of dwellings in the ward were flats. 27.1% of dwellings in the ward were flats in 2001, this compares to 39.8% in 2011.

Overall the number of dwellings in Campbell Park grew from 5,850 in 2001 to 7,030 in 2011. This is an increase of 1,180 dwellings or 20.1%.

The number of flats in Campbell Park grew by 77.2% between 2001 and 2011 from 1,585 to 2,810 in 2011. Graph 6 outlines that the percentage of dwelling which were flats increased from 27.1% in 2001 to 39.8% in 2011; this is a trend which is observed nationally. The percentage of houses/bungalows in Campbell Park decreased from 72.9% of all dwellings to 60.3%.

#### 14. Tenure

# 34.4% of households in Campbell Park rent privately. This compares to 18.3% in Milton Keynes.

Overall just 34.7% of households in Campbell Park were owner occupied; this is significantly lower than the figure for Milton Keynes as a whole of 57.7%. A higher percentage of households were living in the council rented accommodation in Campbell Park than Milton Keynes. 920 households (14.0%) live in council rented accommodation compared to 11.0% in Milton Keynes.

Campbell Park also had a higher percentage of households in other social rented accommodation than Milton Keynes. There were 710 households in social rented housing other than from the council accounting for 10.7% of households compared with 7.1% in Milton Keynes.

Campbell Park had the highest level of private rented accommodation of all wards in Milton Keynes. 2,270 households were in private rented accommodation (including living rent free); this is 34.4% of households compared with 18.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole.



The percentage of households living in private rented accommodation in Campbell Park more than doubled; it increased from 15.7% in 2001 to 34.4% in 2011.

Between 2001 and 2011 the number of households in Campbell Park living in private rented accommodation almost tripled from 840 households to 2,270. It increased from 15.7% of all households in 2001 to 34.4% in 2011.

The number of households living in social rented accommodation increased slightly from 1,530 in 2001 to 1,630 2011. As a percentage of all dwellings it decreased from 28.7% to 24.7%.

There was a large decrease in the percentage of households living in owner occupied properties in Campbell Park from 50.8% in 2001 to 34.7% in 2011. The percentage of households in shared ownership increased from 4.7% to 6.2%.

## 15. Communal Establishments and Residents

There were 57 residents of communal establishments in the ward.

There were 11 communal establishments in the ward with 57 residents. 27 (47.4%) of these residents live within care home with nursing establishments.

# 16. Car or Van Availability

32.0% of households in Campbell Park had no cars or vans in the household. This is the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes


In total in 2011 there were 6,410 cars or vans in households in Campbell Park compared with 5,760 in 2001. However 2,110 households in the ward had no car or van. This is 32.0% of all households, significantly higher than Milton Keynes (18.9%).

## 18. Qualifications and Students

Levels of qualifications in Campbell Park were higher than Milton Keynes. 15.5% had no qualifications compared with 18.0% in Milton Keynes.

Table 20 shows the highest level of qualifications for residents aged 16+. It outlines that roughly 2,050 people aged 16+ in Campbell Park had no qualifications. This is 15.5% of the population and is lower than the Milton Keynes average of 18.0%.

3,850 people aged 16+ in the ward had a degree or higher qualification. This is 29.1% of the population, higher than the Milton Keynes average of 28.2%.

1,640 people in the ward had an 'other' qualification this is 12.4% of the population, the highest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes.



# Levels of qualifications in Campbell Park increased significantly between 2001 and 2011.

Levels of qualifications in the ward increased considerably between 2001 and 2011. Graph 9 outlines how levels of qualifications changed since 2001. In 2001 18.5% of residents aged 16+ had a degree or higher, by 2011 this had increased to 29.1%. In 2001 24.4% of the population had no qualifications by 2011 this had decreased to 15.5%.

# Campbell Park had the largest percentage of students aged 18+ of all wards in Milton Keynes.

Table 21 shows that there were 770 people aged 18 and over in full time education resident in the ward. This is 5.8% of the population, higher than the Milton Keynes average of 3.5%.

## 19. Economic Activity

A smaller percentage (65.9%) of Campbell Park residents aged 16-74 were in employment compared with Milton Keynes (68%).

Table 22 outlines that the population aged 16-74 can be broken down into two broad categories:

# 1. Economically Active: People that were in work or looking and available for work.

9,830 people in the Campbell Park were economically active. This is 76.6% of the 16-74 year old population similar to the Milton Keynes figure of 75.9%. The percentage of the population working as full time employees was higher in Campbell Park compared with Milton Keynes as a whole. 6,060 residents in the ward were full time employees; this is 47.3% of the 16-74 year old population and is higher than the Milton Keynes average of 46.3%. 920 residents (7.1%) in Milton Keynes were self employed; this is a smaller percentage than the Milton Keynes average (8.7%).

There were 865 unemployed people in Campbell Park which accounted for 6.7% of the population, higher than the Milton Keynes rate of 4.8%.

# 2. Economically Inactive: People that were not in work and were not looking and available for work.

Campbell Park had a similar percentage of the 16-74 population who were economically inactive. 23.4% of the ward's 16-74 population were economically inactive compared with 24.1% in Milton Keynes as a whole. This is due to a much smaller percentage of the 16-74 year old population being retired. 5.9% of 16-74 year old population were retired compared with 10.3% in Milton Keynes. 5.1% of 16-74 year old population were economically inactive students compared with 3.9% in Milton Keynes.



There had been a fall in the percentage of 16-74 year old population working as full time employees in Campbell Park.

Graph 10 outlines that the percentage of the 16-74 population who are full time employees decreased from 51.5% in 2001 to 47.3% in 2011. However, there was an increase in the percentage of people in part time employment and self employment which offsets this decrease to some degree. This is a trend experienced nationally.

The percentage of people who were unemployed increased from 4.3% to 6.7%, whilst the percentage of people who were economically inactive declined slightly from 25.1% to 23.4% between 2001 and 2011.

Economic activity is strongly correlated to age. Middle aged people tend to be more economically active than younger people (who may be students) and older people (who were more likely to be retired etc). Therefore to make robust comparisons between areas economic activity by age is needed.

## 20. Hours Worked

Three quarters of Campbell Park residents in employment worked full time hours whilst a quarter worked part time.


The 2011 Census asked those in employment how many hours they worked a week. Table 23 outlines that in total 2,040 Campbell Park residents worked part time hours, this is 23.1%.

Graph 11 outlines that females were more likely to be in part time employment than males. 35.5% of female Campbell Park residents were in part time employment compared with just 14.0% of males.

## 21. Industry

88.0% of Campbell Park residents in employment were employed in the service sector compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

7,770 Campbell Park residents were employed in the service sector. This is 88.0% of employment compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole. 610 Campbell Park residents in employment were employed in the manufacturing sector; this is 6.9% of those in employment. A smaller percentage of residents were employed in 'other' industries such as construction in the ward compared with Milton Keynes.

The wholesale and retail trade industrial sector was the largest employer of Campbell Park residents.

Table 24 provides more detail on the industry of employment in Campbell Park and Milton Keynes. It shows that the wholesale and retail trade was the largest employer of residents in the ward. 2,010 residents were employed in this sector; this is 22.8% of people in employment compared with 20.6% in Milton Keynes.

Education, health and social work and public administration, defence and compulsory social security employs 1,710 people (19.3%).

The wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles/cycles, information and communication, transport and storage and accommodation and food service activities were larger in Campbell Park than Milton Keynes as a whole. The education, manufacturing, construction and public administration and defence; compulsory social security activities were in smaller proportions compared with Milton Keynes.

#### 22. Occupation

8.3% of residents in Campbell Park were employed in manager, director and senior official occupations and 20.0% in elementary occupations.

A smaller percentage (8.3%) of employees were employed in the managerial occupations in Campbell Park compared with Milton Keynes as a whole (10.9%). 1,760 residents were employed in elementary occupations. This is 20.0% of those in employment and is significantly higher than the Milton Keynes average of 12.3%.

A smaller percentage of people in employment in Campbell Park were employed in administrative and secretarial occupations, manager, director and senior official and caring, leisure and other service occupations than Milton Keynes as a whole.

Larger proportions were employed in sales and customer service, process, plant and machine operatives and elementary occupations.



The largest increase in employment between 2001 and 2011 in Campbell Park occurred in professional occupations the largest decrease occurred in managers, directors and senior officials.

Graph 12 outlines that the largest increase in employment between 2001 and 2011 in Campbell Park occurred in professional occupations. 11.1% of those in employment in 2001 were employed in professional occupations by 2011 this had increased to 17.5%. The largest decrease occurred in managers, directors and senior officials from 13.2% to 8.3%. There was also a decrease in the percentage employment in administrative and secretarial occupations from 14.2% in 2001 to 10.1% in 2011.

# 23. National Statistics – Socio-Economic Classification

Residents in Campbell Park were more likely to be classified in lower supervisory and technical occupations, routine occupations and never worked and long-term unemployed socio-economic categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.

1,340 residents aged 16-74 in the ward were in the higher managerial and professional category. This is 10.4% of the population compared with 12.2% in Milton Keynes. Campbell Park also had a smaller percentage of people in the lower managerial, administrative and professional occupation category.

Campbell Park had a higher percentage of residents in the lower supervisory and technical occupations, routine occupations and never worked and long-term unemployed categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.
