

Sherington Ward 2011 Census Profile



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1. Executive Summary

Population

- The population of Sherington in 2011 was 4,100.
- Sherington had a relatively small population growth rate. The population grew by 150 people between 2001 and 2011. This is a 3.8% increase, the 5th smallest growth rate of all wards in Milton Keynes.
- Sherington had a much older age profile than the Milton Keynes average. The average age in Sherington was 47 compared with 35 for Milton Keynes. 21.0% of the population were aged 65+ compared with 11.1% in Milton Keynes.
- The highest growth occurred in the 60+ year old age groups. The number of people aged 60+ grew by over a third from 870 people in 2001 to 1,190 people in 2011.
- 7.6% of the Sherington population were from a black and minority ethnic group. This compares to 4.7% in 2001 and 26.1% for Milton Keynes as a whole.
- The Other White ethnic group had the highest growth in Sherington between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 it accounted for 2.1% of the population by 2011 it accounted for 3.0%.
- Just 6.9% of the population in Sherington were born outside of the UK. This is significantly lower than Milton Keynes (18.5%).

Health

- 250 residents said their day to day activities were limited a lot because of health issues. This is 6.1% of the population compared with 6.4% for Milton Keynes.
- 455 residents in Sherington provided some unpaid care a week. This is 11.1% of the population compared with 8.8% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

Housing

- Sherington had a smaller percentage of households with dependent children than Milton Keynes (27.7% compared to 35.0%).
- The percentage of one person households is smaller in Sherington (22.2%) than in Milton Keynes as a whole (25.9%).
- Sherington had a small average household size. It had an average of 2.4
 people per household compared with 2.5 in Milton Keynes.
- A larger percentage of dwellings (51.3%) were classified as detached properties in Sherington than Milton Keynes as a whole (28.2%).
- 37.3% of households in Sherington own their dwelling outright. This compares to 21.5% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

• The percentage of households living in private rented accommodation in Sherington increased from 11.1% in 2001 to 14.5% in 2011.

Transport

• 6.7% of households in Sherington had no cars or vans in the household. This is the lowest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes.

Education

- Levels of qualifications in Sherington were higher than the Milton Keynes average. 37.4% had a degree or higher compared with 28.2% in Milton Keynes.
- In addition to qualifications being higher than Milton Keynes, levels of qualifications increased considerably between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 20.4% of residents aged 16+ had a degree or higher qualification by 2011 this had increased to 37.4%.

Economic

- Sherington had the highest percentage (14.9%) of residents in self employment and the highest (18.3%) who were retired of all wards in Milton Keynes.
- There was a fall from 41.6% to 39.6% between 2001 and 2011 in the percentage of the 16-74 year old population in Sherington working as full time employees.
- 82.4% of Sherington residents in employment were employed in the service sector compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole. The wholesale and retail trade industrial sector was the largest employer of Sherington residents.
- Residents in Sherington were more likely to be classified in managerial and small employers and own account workers socio-economic categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.

2. Introduction

This document provides a profile of Sherington Ward from data released via the 2011 Census. The profile includes data for the ward and comparisons to Milton Keynes and to the 2001 Census figures.

3. Population Size and Age Structure

Sherington had a smaller population growth rate when compared with Milton Keynes as a whole. The population increased by just 150 people (3.8%) to 4,100 between 2001 and 2011.

In 2011 the population of Sherington was 4,100. Table 1 outlines that the population growth in Sherington between 2001 and 2011 was smaller than Milton Keynes as a whole. Sherington grew by 150 people; this is an increase of 3.8% compared with 17% for Milton Keynes. Out of the 23 wards in Milton Keynes it had the fifth smallest population growth rate between 2001 and 2011.

Sherington had a much older age profile than the Milton Keynes average. The average age in Sherington was 47 compared with 35 for Milton Keynes.

Table 2 shows the age structure of Sherington compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the ward had a lower percentage in the younger age groups. In Sherington in 2011 16.0% of the population were aged under 15 compared with 21% in Milton Keynes. 21.0% of the population were aged 65+ compared with 11.1% in Milton Keynes.



The highest growth rate between 2001 and 2011 in Sherington occurred in the 60+ year old age groups.

Graph 2 shows the change in age structure between 2001 and 2011. It outlines that the highest growth occurred in the 60+ year old age groups. The number of people aged 60+ grew by over a third from 870 people in 2001 to 1,190 people in 2011.

The number of people aged 5-14 and 30-44 decreased significantly between 2001 and 2011.

4. Ethnicity

Sherington had the second smallest black and minority ethnic group population of all wards in Milton Keynes. 7.6% of the population classified themselves within a black and minority ethnic group compared with 26.1% in Milton Keynes.

Overall 310 people (7.6%) of the population in Sherington were from a black and minority ethnic group compared with 26.1% in Milton Keynes.

Table 3 shows the number of people in each ethnic group in Sherington compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the ward had lower proportions than Milton Keynes in most black and minority ethnic groups.

The largest black and minority ethnic group in Sherington was White Other. 120 people classified themselves in this category; this is 3.0% of the population, lower than the Milton Keynes figure of 5.1%. 45 people (1.1%) classified themselves Irish (compared with Milton Keynes average of 1.0%). Other black and minority ethnic groups in Sherington appear in small numbers.



The population is becoming more ethnically diverse. In 2001 4.7% of the population were from a black and minority ethnic group compared with 7.6% in 2011.

Graph 3 outlines that there were a number of ethnic groups in Sherington which experienced population growth between 2001 and 2011. The Other White ethnic group had the highest growth in Sherington between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 it accounted for 2.1% of the population by 2011 it accounted for 3.0%, this is an increase from 80 people to 120.

5. Country of Birth

Just 6.9% of the population in Sherington were born outside of the UK. This is significantly lower than Milton Keynes as a whole (18.5%).

6.9% of the population in Sherington were born outside of the UK; this is a total of 280 people. Sherington had the lowest percentage of its population born outside of the UK of all wards in Milton Keynes. Table 4 shows the country of birth for Sherington residents compared with Milton Keynes.

0.6% of the Sherington population were born in Ireland and 1.4% were born in EU member states as at March 2001. 30 people where born in 2001-2011 EU accession countries; this is 0.8% of the population significantly lower than Milton Keynes as a whole (2.5%). 170 people (4.1%) were born outside of the EU, significantly lower than the Milton Keynes figure of 13.0%.

The number of Sherington residents born outside of the UK increased from 200 people to 280 between 2001 and 2011.

70 people living in Sherington had been living in the UK for less than five years.

1.6% of the total Sherington population had lived in the UK for less than five years, significantly lower than Milton Keynes as a whole (5.4%).

6. Household Language

Just 1.4% of households in Sherington had no adult who had English as their main language compared with 6.4% in Milton Keynes.

97.0% of households in Sherington had all adults in the household with English as their main language and 98.6% had at least one adult with English as their main language.

Just 20 households had no adult who had English as their main language. This is 1.4% of the population.

7. Religion

66.8% of the Sherington population stated they were Christian and 24.7% of the population in Sherington stated they had no religion.


Table 7 shows the number of people in each religious group in Sherington compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the largest religious group in Milton Keynes was Christian which accounted for 66.8% of the population, this is significantly higher than Milton Keynes as a whole (52.8%).

Other religious groups in Sherington appear in very small numbers.

Graph 4 outlines the changes in religion in Sherington between 2001 and 2011. It shows that there was a significant decline in the percentage of the population that stated they were Christian (76.0% to 66.8%) and an increase in the percentage that stated they had no religion (15.8% to 24.7%).

8. Health

6.1% of residents in Sherington said their day to day activities were limited a lot because of health issues. This compares to 6.4% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

The 2011 Census asked two questions on the health of residents. Both questions highlight that a slightly smaller percentage of the population in Sherington felt that they had health issues when compared to Milton Keynes.

1. Are your day-to-day activities limited because of a health problem or disability which has lasted, or is expected to last, at least 12 months?

250 people stated their day-today activities were limited a lot due to health; this is 6.1% of population compared with 6.4% in Milton Keynes. In total 15.0% of residents in Sherington stated they were limited a lot or a little. This compares to 13.9% in Milton Keynes.

2. How is your health in general?

150 respondents in Sherington felt their general health was bad or very bad. This is 3.7% of the population compared with 4.1% of the Milton Keynes population. 85.4% of residents in the ward felt they had good or very good health compared with 85.1% in Milton Keynes.

The 2011 Census questions on health were different to the 2001 Census and therefore can not be directly compared.

Health status is very strongly correlated to age. Residents in the older age groups tend to be less healthy than younger age groups. Therefore to make robust comparisons between areas health by age is needed.

9. Carers

455 residents in Sherington provided some unpaid care a week. This is 11.1% of the population compared with 8.8% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

The 2011 Census asked respondents if they provided some unpaid care each week to others either because of a long term disability or old age. The results show that around 455 people in Sherington provided some unpaid care. This is 11.1% of the population, similar to the Milton Keynes figure of 8.8%.

Table 10 shows the number of hours of unpaid care residents undertook each week. It outlines that around 120 people undertook more than 20 hours of unpaid care each week with 70 of those undertaking more than 50 hours.



The percentage of Sherington residents providing unpaid care remained roughly the same between 2001 and 2011.

The number of Sherington residents providing unpaid care grew from 440 in 2001 to 455 in 2011. As a percentage of the ward's population it decreased slightly from 11.2% in 2001 to 11.1% in 2011.

Graph 5 outlines that those that were providing unpaid care were doing so with greater hours.

10. Living Arrangements

Sherington had the highest percentage of married couples living together of all wards in Milton Keynes and the lowest percentage of people who were single.

2,390 residents aged 16 and over in Sherington were living as a couple this is 71.6% compared to 60.4% for Milton Keynes. 500 (15.0%) residents were single (never married) whilst 210 people (6.3%) were widowed.

11. Household Composition

Sherington had a lower percentage of households with dependent children than Milton Keynes as a whole and a higher percentage of pensioner households.

There were 1,680 households in Sherington in 2011. 195 (11.6%) of these households were one person pensioner household, this compares to 8.7% for Milton Keynes as a whole. In total 22.2% of households in the ward were one person households compared with 25.9% for Milton Keynes.

In total 470 (27.7%) households in Sherington had dependent children this compares to 35.0% in Milton Keynes.

65 households, or 3.9%, in Sherington were lone parent households with dependent children. This compares to 8.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

The percentage of households with dependent children in Sherington decreased from 29.6% in 2001 to 27.7% in 2011.

Table 13 outlines how household composition changed between 2001 and 2011. The percentage of households with dependent children fell from 29.6% of households to 27.7%.

The number of lone parent households with dependent children increased between 2001 and 2011, it grew from 3.1% to 3.9%.

12. Rooms and Bedrooms

The ward had a relatively small average household size. It had an average of 2.4 people per household compared with 2.5 in Milton Keynes.

The ward's average household size of 2.4 was the eighth smallest of all 23 wards in Milton Keynes. The average household size in the ward decrease from 2.5 to 2.4 between 2001 and 2011.

Sherington had the largest average number of rooms per household of all wards in Milton Keynes. There was an average of 6.8 rooms per household compared with 5.5 in Milton Keynes.

20 households in Sherington lived in over occupied accommodation.

The 2011 Census also estimates the number of households with a high occupancy rating. An occupancy rating of -1 implies that a household had one less room/bedroom than required. Table 15 shows that Sherington had around 20 households (1.3%) which were over occupied in terms of bedrooms. This is significantly lower than the Milton Keynes figure of 5.1%.

Over occupancy in terms of rooms decreased slightly between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 30 (2.2%) households had an occupancy rating of -1 or less, in 2011 it had remained at 30 (1.8%).

13. Accommodation Type

A larger percentage of dwellings were classified as detached properties in Sherington than Milton Keynes as a whole.

There were 1,745 dwellings in Sherington in 2011. The 2011 Census asked residents what type of dwelling they lived in. A larger percentage (51.3%) of dwellings in the ward were detached compared with Milton Keynes (28.2%).

Just 60 dwellings in Sherington were flats this is 3.6% of dwellings in the wards compared with 16.2% for Milton Keynes as a whole.



A smaller percentage of dwellings in the ward were flats. 5.2% of dwellings in the ward were flats in 2001, this compares to 3.6% in 2011.

Overall the number of dwellings in Sherington grew from 1,650 in 2001 to 1,745 in 2011. This is an increase of 90 dwellings or 5.5%.

The number of flats in Sherington fell by 26.7% between 2001 and 2011 from 90 to 60 in 2011. Graph 6 outlines that the percentage of dwelling which were flats decreased from 5.2% in 2001 to 3.6% in 2011.

14. Tenure

37.3% of households in Sherington own their dwelling outright. This compares to 21.5% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

Overall 74.0% of households in Sherington were owner occupied; this is significantly higher than the figure for Milton Keynes as a whole of 57.7%.

A smaller percentage of households were living in the council rented accommodation in Sherington than Milton Keynes. 140 households (8.5%) live in council rented accommodation compared to 11.0% in Milton Keynes.

Sherington also had a lower percentage of households in other social rented accommodation than Milton Keynes. There were just 40 households in social rented housing other than from the council accounting for 2.6% of households compared with 7.1% in Milton Keynes. 240 households were in private rented accommodation (including living rent free); this is 14.5% of households.



The percentage of households living in private rented accommodation in Sherington increased from 11.1% in 2001 to 14.5% in 2011.

The number of households in Sherington living in private rented accommodation increased from 175 in 2001 to 240 in 2011, this is an increase of 38.9%. It increased from 11.1% of all households in 2001 to 14.5% in 2011.

There was a large decrease in the percentage of households living in owner occupied properties in Sherington from 76.9% in 2001 to 74.0% in 2011.

15. Communal Establishments and Residents

There were 50 residents of communal establishments in Sherington Ward.

There were 4 communal establishments in the ward with 50 residents. The majority of these residents live within care homes without nursing establishments.

16. Car or Van Availability

6.7% of households in Sherington had no cars or vans in the household. This is the lowest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes


In total in 2011 there were 3,080 cars or vans in households in Sherington compared with 2,720 in 2001. Just 110 households in the ward had no car or van. This is 6.7% of all households, significantly lower than Milton Keynes (18.9%).

18. Qualifications and Students

Levels of qualifications in Sherington were significantly higher than the Milton Keynes average. 37.4% had a degree or higher qualification compared with 28.2% in Milton Keynes.

Table 20 shows the highest level of qualifications for residents aged 16+. It outlines that roughly 590 people aged 16+ in Sherington had no qualifications. This is 17.4% of the population and is lower than the Milton Keynes average of 18.0%.

1,270 people aged 16+ in the ward had a degree or higher qualification. This is 37.4% of the population, significantly higher than the Milton Keynes average of 28.2%.



Levels of qualifications in Sherington increased significantly between 2001 and 2011.

Graph 9 outlines how levels of qualifications changed between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 28.3% of residents aged 16+ had a degree or higher, by 2011 this had increased to 37.4%. In 2001 20.4% of the population had no qualifications by 2011 this had decreased to 17.4%.

Sherington had a smaller percentage of students aged 18+ than Milton Keynes.

Table 21 shows that there were 60 people aged 18 and over in full time education resident in the ward. This is 1.9% of the population, lower than the Milton Keynes average of 3.5%.

19. Economic Activity

Sherington had the highest percentage (14.9%) of residents in self employment and the highest (18.3%) who were retired of all wards in Milton Keynes.

Table 22 outlines that the population aged 16-74 can be broken down into two broad categories:

1. Economically Active: People that were in work or looking and available for work.

2,160 people in the Sherington were economically active. This is 71.8% of the 16-74 year old population, smaller than the Milton Keynes figure of 75.9%. The percentage of the population who were in employment is lower in Sherington compared with Milton Keynes as a whole. 2,010 residents in the ward were in employment, this is 66.6% of the 16-74 year old population higher than the Milton Keynes average of 68.0% 450 residents (14.9%) in Milton Keynes were self employed; this is a larger percentage than the Milton Keynes average (8.7%).

There were 90 unemployed people in Sherington which accounted for 2.9% of the population, higher than the Milton Keynes rate of 4.8%.

2. Economically Inactive: People that were not in work and were not looking and available for work.

Sherington had a higher percentage of the 16-74 population who were economically inactive. 28.2% of the ward's 16-74 population were economically inactive compared with 24.1% in Milton Keynes as a whole. This is because the ward had a higher percentage of residents who were retired (18.3% of the population compared with 10.3% for Milton Keynes). However it had a smaller percentage who were students (including full-time students), looking after home or family, long-term sick or disabled or other economically inactive compared with Milton Keynes.



There was a fall in the percentage of 16-74 year old population working as full time employees in Sherington.

Graph 10 outlines that the percentage of the 16-74 population working as full time employees decreased from 41.6% in 2001 to 39.6% in 2011. However, there was an increase in the percentage of people in part time employment and self employment which offsets this decrease to some degree. This is a trend experienced nationally.

The percentage of people who were unemployed increased from 1.9% to 2.9%, whilst the percentage of people who were retired increased from 14.3% to 18.3% between 2001 and 2011.

Economic activity is strongly correlated to age. Middle aged people tend to be more economically active than younger people (who may be students) and older people (who were more likely to be retired etc). Therefore to make robust comparisons between areas economic activity by age is needed.

20. Hours Worked

Just under three quarters of Sherington residents in employment worked full time hours whilst a quarter worked part time.


The 2011 Census asked those in employment how many hours they worked a week. Table 23 outlines that in total 560 the ward's residents worked part time hours, this is 27.1%.

Graph 11 outlines that females were more likely to be in part time employment than males. 43.3% of female Sherington residents in employment were in part time employment compared with just 12.6% of males.

21. Industry

82.4% of Sherington residents in employment were employed in the service sector compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

1,700 Sherington residents were employed in the service sector. This is 82.4% of employment compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole. 170 Sherington residents were employed in the manufacturing sector; this is 8.2% of those in employment. A larger percentage of residents were employed in 'other' industries such as construction and agriculture in the ward compared with Milton Keynes.

The wholesale and retail trade industrial sector was the largest employer of Sherington residents.

Table 24 provides more detail on the industry of employment in Sherington and Milton Keynes. It shows that the wholesale and retail trade was the largest employer of residents in the ward. 340 residents were employed in this sector; this is 16.6% of people in employment compared with 20.6% in Milton Keynes. Education, health and social work and public administration, defence and compulsory social security employs 510 people (24.7%).

The professional, scientific and technical activities, public administration and defence; compulsory social security, construction and agriculture, forestry and fishing were larger in Sherington than Milton Keynes as a whole. The wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles/cycles, transport and storage, financial and insurance activities and accommodation and food service activities were in smaller proportions compared with Milton Keynes.

22. Occupation

20.6% of residents in Sherington were employed in manager, director and senior official occupations and 7.5% in elementary occupations.

A larger percentage (20.6%) of employees were employed in the managerial occupations in Sherington compared with Milton Keynes as a whole (10.9%). 155 residents were employed in elementary occupations. This is 7.5% of those in employment, the third lowest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes and is significantly lower than the Milton Keynes average of 12.3%.

A smaller percentage of people in employment in Sherington were employed in caring, leisure and other service occupations, sales and customer service occupations, process, plant and machine operatives and elementary occupations than Milton Keynes as a whole. Larger proportions were employed in managers, directors and senior officials and professional occupations.



The largest increase in employment between 2001 and 2011 in Sherington occurred in professional occupations the largest decrease occurred in managers, directors and senior official occupations.

Graph 12 outlines that the largest increase in employment between 2001 and 2011 in Sherington occurred in professional occupations. 16.6% of those in employment in 2001 were employed in professional occupations by 2011 this increased to 20.5%. The largest decrease occurred in managers, directors and senior officials from 23.2% to 20.6%.

23. National Statistics – Socio-Economic Classification

Residents in Sherington were more likely to be classified in managerial, administrative and professional occupations and small employers and own account workers socio-economic categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.

545 residents aged 16-74 in the ward were in the higher managerial and professional category. This is 18.1% of the population compared with 12.2% in Milton Keynes. Sherington also had a higher percentage of people in the lower managerial, administrative and professional occupation category and small employers and own account workers.

Sherington had a smaller percentage of residents in the intermediate occupations, lower supervisory and technical occupations, semi-routine occupations, routine occupations and never worked and long-term unemployed categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.
