

## Milton Keynes Ethnicity of School Age People – Spring 2011

The spring 2011 Schools Census has been used to reveal the following. Overall in Milton Keynes, Black and Minority Ethnic groups\* represent 32.8% of Pupils. This compares with the 2005 findings of 20.7%.

Of those of primary school age 35.1% come from minority ethnic groups and 28.3% of those of secondary school age come from minority ethnic groups.

In the sixth forms there are higher percentages (29.4%) of black and minority ethnic groups than in compulsory secondary education (26.7%).

The Black African Group is the largest minority ethnic group accounting for 8.6% of pupils. This is followed by the Mixed (5.8%) and White other groups (4.4%).


Black Caribbean pupils form just 0.9% of the Milton Keynes pupil population. Black Other pupils now account for 1.7%.

Pakistani pupils now make up the largest population in the Asian ethnic group with 1,117 pupils forming 2.8% of the pupil population in Milton Keynes. Indians make up 2.6% of the pupil population and Bangladeshis 1.5%.

Chinese pupils form just 0.6% of the Milton Keynes pupil population.

Comparison between 2005 and 2011



The graph above outlines the change in the proportions of pupils recorded in each black and minority ethnic group. Black African had the largest increase in numbers (2,060 extra pupils) this is an increase of 143%. Asian Other Group has the highest growth rate of 185% whilst Black Other (152%) also had a high growth rate. White Irish (-17%) Chinese (-15%) and White UK (-7%) all experienced a decline.

The following tables show the 15 estates with the highest proportion for the main black and minority ethnic groups. For confidentiality reasons the figures exclude estates with less than four members of the minority ethnic group or less than 10 pupils in total. Results for the Milton Keynes Academy and The Premier Academy are not included are not included in the estates analysis.

Black African pupils are quite well spread in Milton Keynes, appearing in 80 of the 116 estates and settlements in Milton Keynes. They account for almost a third of pupils in Conniburrow and over a quarter of pupils in Fishermead and Wolverton Mill East & South.

Black Caribbean's form only 0.9% of the overall pupil population Milton Keynes yet in percentage terms they are quite significant in Broughton Gate although only relatively small

numbers are involved. The highest number of Black Caribbean pupils is in West Bletchley with 21. They appear in only 66 of Milton Keynes' estates and settlements.

Estates with the highest proportion of the Black Other group include are Wolverton Mill East and South, Fishermead Broughton and Atterbury, and Oldbrook. They appear in 65 of Milton Keynes' estates and settlements.

Bangladeshi pupils form a highly significant part of Central Bletchley's pupil make-up, accounting for over a quarter of all pupils. They are also in large numbers (138) in Water Eaton. They are, however, the least spread of BME groups in Milton Keynes, appearing only in small numbers in areas other than Central Bletchley and Water Eaton, and in only 46 of Milton Keynes 116 estates and settlements. Only 10 estates have more than 10 Bangladeshi pupils.

Indian pupils are widely spread around Milton Keynes, appearing in 70 of Milton Keynes estates and settlements.

Pakistani pupils are mostly concentrated to the north of the city; especially in Wolverton where just over a fifth of pupils (259) are Pakistani. Pakistani Pupils appear in 67 of the estates and settlements in Milton Keynes.

Asian Other pupils appear in 72 estates in Milton Keynes, there are relatively high proportions in Springfield, Oldbrook, Downs Barn and Eaglestone.

Mixed ethnicity pupils are spread around Milton Keynes, appearing in 92 of the estates and settlements, but this is because it is a combined group of mixed ethnicities and may not be a homogenous group.
