Introduction

This document provides a set of thematic maps on the **marital status** data by estate and settlement in Milton Keynes from 2011 Census data.

Methodology

These maps were created by the Research and Intelligence team at Milton Keynes Council based on 2011 Census data published by the Office for National Statistics.

The 2011 Census data was not released at estate level. The Research and Intelligence team at Milton Keynes Council therefore added together Output Area (the smallest census geography) data to provide an estimate at estate level. As Output Areas (OAs) boundaries and estate boundaries do not always match, the data for OAs is weighted to estates. The data in the maps should therefore be seen as estimates based on 2011 Census data rather than actual figures. 



Map 1: % of the population aged 16+ who are single (never married/same-sex civil partnership)




Campbell Park has the highest proportion (60.3%) of people aged 16+ who are single (never married/same-sex civil partnership). Other areas with large proportions include Central Milton Keynes (58.4%), Granby (54.6%), Redhouse Park (52.7%) and Medbourne (51.2%).

Map 2: % of the population aged 16+ who are married in a same-sex civil partnership




Rural areas tend to have the highest proportion of married people. Clifton Reynes (67.1%), Ravenstone (66.3%), Haversham/Little Linford (65.3%), North Crawley (64.0%) and Gayhurst (63.7%) all feature highly. Granby (18.5%), Campbell Park (28.3%) and Central Milton Keynes (29.5%) have the lowest proportions.

Map 3: % of the population aged 16+ who are separated (but still legally married/same-sex civil partnership)




Granby (10.4%), Fishermead (7.2%), Peartree Bridge (5.8%) and Netherfield (5.8%) have the highest percentage of their 16+ population who are separated.



Stacey Bushes (16.1%), Beanhill (15.0%), Granby (14.9%), Blue Bridge (13.6%) and Coffee Hall (13.3%) have the highest percentage of people aged 16+ who are divorced/formerly in a same-sex civil partnership.

Map 5: % of the population aged 16+ who are Widowed



More established area of the city such as Bletchley, Stony Stratford and Great Linford have the highest proportions of people aged 16+ who are widowed. Newly developed areas tend to have the lowest proportions.
