Introduction

This document provides a set of thematic maps on the **occupation** data by estate and settlement in Milton Keynes from 2011 Census data.

Methodology

These maps were created by the Research and Intelligence team at Milton Keynes Council based on 2011 Census data published by the Office for National Statistics.

The 2011 Census data was not released at estate level. The Research and Intelligence team at Milton Keynes Council therefore added together Output Area (the smallest census geography) data to provide an estimate at estate level. As Output Areas (OAs) boundaries and estate boundaries do not always match, the data for OAs is weighted to estates. The data in the maps should therefore be seen as estimates based on 2011 Census data rather than actual figures. 


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Map 1: % aged 16-74 who are in managers, directors and senior officials occupations




Rural areas tend to have the highest percentage of residents employed in manager, director & senior official occupations. These include Clifton Reynes (27.1%), Lathbury (26.3%), Moulsoe (24.7%) and Tyringham & Filgrave (23.3%).

Map 2: % aged 16-74 who are in professional occupations




Areas with a high percentage of residents working in professional occupations include Loughton Lodge (28.9%), Ravenstone (28.7%), Oxley Park (27.9%), Oakhill (27.7%), Cold Brayfield (27.5%) and Central Milton Keynes (27.2%).

Map 3: % aged 16-74 who are in associate professional and technical occupations




Areas with the highest percentage of residents working in associate professional and technical occupations includes Campbell Park (21.5%), Calverton (21.3%), Westcroft (20.3%), Redhouse Park (20.2%) and Loughton Lodge (20.0%).

Map 4: % aged 16-74 who are in administrative and secretarial occupations




Areas with the highest percentage of residents working in administrative and secretarial occupations include Bancroft (17.6%), Pennyland (16.6%), Blue Bridge (16.1%), Newport Pagnell (15.6%), Downhead Park (15.6%) and Blakelands (15.4%).

Map 5: % aged 16-74 who are in skilled trades occupations




The highest percentages of residents who are in skilled trades occupation tend to be in rural areas and Bletchley. These include Calverton (14.9%), Ravenstone (14.8%), Central Bletchley (14.2%), Moulsoe (14.0%), Castlethorpe (12.6%) and Denbigh East (12.5%).

Map 6: % aged 16-74 who are in caring, leisure and other service occupations




Areas with the highest percentage of residents working in caring, leisure and other service occupations include Leadenhall (16.0%), Eaglestone (12.7%), Beanhill (12.0%), Coffee Hall (11.3%), Stantonbury (11.1%), Water Eaton (11.0%) and Fullers Slade (11.0%).

Map 7: % aged 16-74 who are in sales and customer service occupations




Estates with the highest proportion of residents who are working in sales and customer service occupations include Beanhill (14.4%), Fullers Slade (13.1%), Tinkers Bridge (12.9%), Springfield (12.5%), Water Eaton (12.4%), and Netherfield (12.3%).

Map 8: % aged 16-74 who are in process, plant and machine operative occupations



Estates with the highest proportion of residents who are working in process, plant and machine operative occupations include Granby (18.7%), Stacey Bushes (17.9%), Hodge Lea (13.6%), Coffee Hall (13.0%), Eaglestone (12.1%) and Tinkers Bridge (11.1%).

Map 9: % aged 16-74 who are in elementary occupations



Estates with high proportions of residents aged 16-74 who work in elementary occupations include Fishermead (30.2%), Conniburrow (28.5%), Netherfield (27.8%), Beanhill (27.3%) Granby (26.7%).
