Introduction

This document provides a set of thematic maps on the **qualifications** data by estate and settlement in Milton Keynes from 2011 Census data.

Methodology

These maps were created by the Research and Intelligence team at Milton Keynes Council based on 2011 Census data published by the Office for National Statistics.

The 2011 Census data was not released at estate level. The Research and Intelligence team at Milton Keynes Council therefore added together Output Area (the smallest census geography) data to provide an estimate at estate level. As Output Areas (OAs) boundaries and estate boundaries do not always match, the data for OAs is weighted to estates. The data in the maps should therefore be seen as estimates based on 2011 Census data rather than actual figures. 

Map 1 % of Residents aged 16+ with No Qualifications



Beanhill has the highest percentage (38.9%) of residents with no qualifications. Other areas of Woughton ward with a high percentage include Coffee Hall (35.0%), Netherfield (29.4%) and Eaglestone (29.3%). A large proportion of Bletchley also has a high percentage. Other areas with a high percentage include Stacey Bushes (33.7%) and Hodge Lea (29.7%).



Fullers Slade has the highest percentage (23.1%) of residents with level 1 qualifications. Other areas with high percentages include Netherfield (21.5%) and Beanhill (20.8%). Rural areas, Loughton Lodge and Campbell Park have the lowest percentage with level 1 qualifications.


Areas with the highest percentage of residents with level 2 as their highest qualification are spread across the district. Estates with the highest % include Bancroft Park (21.2%), Granby (20.5%), Redhouse Park (20.2%) and Bolbeck Park (20.1%).

Map 4: % of residents aged 16+ with highest qualification – Level 3



Areas with the highest percentage of residents with level 3 as their highest qualification are spread across the district. Estates with the highest % include Newton Leys (16.8%), Oakridge Park (16.5%), Kingsmead (16.2%) and Browns Wood (15.3%).

Map 5: % of residents aged 16+ with highest qualification – Level 4



Rural areas, the City Centre and some estates in Middleton ward tend to have a higher % of people with a level 4 qualification. The estates with the highest percentage include Gayhurst (50.4%), Loughton Lodge (49.2%), Ravenstone (48.9%) and Campbell Park (48.1%).

Map 6: % of residents aged 16+ with highest qualification – Apprenticeship % with Apprentice 6.1 to 9.8 (4) 3.9 to 6.1 (34) 2.7 to 3.9 (40)1.2 to 2.7 (38)No population (35) Tyringham & Filgrave Gayhurst

Rural areas and Bletchley tend to have a higher proportion of residents with an apprenticeship as their highest qualification.
