Middleton Ward 2011 Census Profile



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1. Executive Summary

Population

- The population of Middleton in 2011 was 15,775.
- Middleton had the highest population growth rate of all wards in Milton Keynes. The population increased by 10,330 people (190%) to 15,775 between 2001 and 2011.
- Middleton had a younger age profile than the Milton Keynes average. The average age in Middleton was 31 compared with 35 for Milton Keynes.
- 25.3% of the population were aged under 15 compared with 21% in Milton Keynes. Middleton had the highest percentage (10.6%) of 0-4 year olds of all wards in Milton Keynes.
- The highest growth rate between 2001 and 2011 occurred in the 10-14 year old age groups. The number of people aged 10-14 grew by 285% from 275 people in 2001 to 1,060 people in 2011.
- 33.2% of the Middleton population were from a black and minority ethnic group. This compares to 14.0% in 2001 and 26.1% for Milton Keynes as a whole.
- The black and minority ethnic groups that grew the most between 2001 and 2011 were Black African (1.4% of the population in 2001 to 8.4% in 2011) and Other White (4.0% of the population in 2001 to 7.5% in 2011).
- 23.4% of the population in Middleton were born outside of the UK. This is significantly higher than Milton Keynes (18.5%).

Health

- 450 residents said their day to day activities were limited a lot because of health issues. This is 2.9% of the population compared with 6.4% for Milton Keynes.
- 965 residents in Middleton provided some unpaid care a week. This is 6.1% of the population compared with 8.8% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

Housing

- Middleton had a larger percentage of households with dependent children than Milton Keynes (43.8% compared to 35.0%).
- The percentage of one person households was smaller in Middleton (19.4%) than in Milton Keynes as a whole (25.9%).
- Middleton had a large average household size. It had an average of 2.7 people per household compared with 2.5 in Milton Keynes.
- A larger percentage of dwellings in the ward (22.2%) were flats when compared with Milton Keynes (16.2%).

- A growing percentage of dwellings in the ward were flats. 6.0% of dwellings in the ward were flats in 2001, this compares to 22.2% in 2011.
- Middleton had a higher percentage of households in other social rented accommodation than Milton Keynes. There were 780 households in social rented housing other than from the council accounting for 13.4% of households compared with 7.1% in Milton Keynes.
- The number of households in Middleton living in private rented accommodation increased from 155 in 2001 to 1,220 in 2011.

Transport

- Just 10% of households in Middleton had no cars or vans in the household. This is the fourth lowest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes.

Education


- Levels of qualifications in Middleton were higher than the Milton Keynes average. 40.1% had a degree or higher compared with 28.2% in Milton Keynes. 8.6% had no qualifications compared with 18.0% in Milton Keynes.
- In addition to qualifications being higher than Milton Keynes, levels of qualifications also increased considerably between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 28.3% of residents aged 16+ had a degree or higher qualification by 2011 this had increased to 40.1%.

Economic

- A higher percentage (75.2%) of Middleton residents aged 16-74 are in employment compared with Milton Keynes (68%).
- There was a fall from 58.7% to 54.9% between 2001 and 2011 in the percentage of the 16-74 year old population in Middleton working as full time employees.
- 87.5% of Middleton residents in employment were employed in the service sector compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole. The wholesale and retail trade industrial sector was the largest employer of Middleton residents.
- Residents in Middleton were more likely to be classified in managerial socio-economic categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.

The chart below shows how Middleton ward compares with the rest of Milton Keynes in a range of indicators from the 2011 Census. The Middleton result for each indicator is shown as a red circle, against the range of results for all wards in Milton Keynes which are shown as a grey bar. The black line indicates the Milton Keynes %.

2. Introduction

This document provides a profile of Middleton Ward from data released via the 2011 Census. The profile includes data for the ward and comparisons to Milton Keynes and to the 2001 Census figures.

3. Population Size and Age Structure

Middleton had the highest population growth rate of all wards in Milton Keynes. The population increased by 10,330 people (189.9%) to 15,775 between 2001 and 2011.

In 2011 the population of Middleton was 15,775. Table 1 outlines that the population growth in Middleton between 2001 and 2011 was significantly higher than Milton Keynes as a whole. Middleton grew by 10,330 people; this is an increase of 189.9% compared with 17% for Milton Keynes. Out of the 23 wards in Milton Keynes it had the largest population growth rate between 2001 and 2011.

Middleton had a younger age profile than the Milton Keynes average. The average age in Middleton was 31 compared with 35 for Milton Keynes.

Table 2 shows the age structure of Middleton compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the ward had a higher percentage in the younger children and younger adults and a smaller percentage in the older age groups. In Middleton in 2011 25.3% of the population were aged under 15 compared with 21% in Milton Keynes. Middleton had the highest percentage (10.6%) of 0-4 year olds of all wards in Milton Keynes.

Just 3.9% of the population were aged 65+ compared with 11.1% in Milton Keynes. It had the lowest or second lowest percentage of all age groups older than 45 years of age of all wards in Milton Keynes.


* The rank is of the % figure and ranked out of all 23 wards in Milton Keynes, with 1 being the highest % and 23 being the lowest %.

The highest growth rate between 2001 and 2011 in Middleton occurred in the 10-14 year old age group.

Graph 2 shows the change in age structure between 2001 and 2011. It outlines that all age groups grew significantly. The highest growth occurred in the 10-14 year old age group. The number of people aged 10-14 grew by 285% from 275 people in 2001 to 1,060 people in 2011.

The number of people aged 5-9 and 0-4 also increased significantly; they both more than tripled in size between 2001 and 2011.

4. Ethnicity

Middleton had a relatively large 'White Other' population. Overall 33.2% of the population classified themselves in a black and minority ethnic group compared with 26.1% in Milton Keynes.

Overall 5,240 people (33.2%) of the population in Middleton were from a black and minority ethnic group compared with 26.1% in Milton Keynes.

Table 3 shows the number of people in each ethnic group in Middleton compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the largest black and minority ethnic group in Middleton was Black African. 1,320 people classified themselves in this category; this is 8.4% of the population, the fourth highest percentage of all wards in the Milton Keynes. 1,190 people (7.5%) classified themselves as White Other (compared with Milton Keynes average of 5.1%).



The population is becoming more ethnically diverse. In 2001 14.0% of the population were from a black and minority ethnic group compared with 33.2% in 2011.

Graph 3 outlines that there were a number of ethnic groups in Middleton which experienced very high population growth between 2001 and 2011. The Black African ethnic group had the highest growth in Middleton between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 it accounted for 1.4% of the population by 2011 it accounted for 8.4%, this is an increase from 80 people to 1,320. The Other White ethnic group also grew significantly in size from 4.0% of the population to 7.5%.

5. Country of Birth

23.4% of the population in Middleton were born outside of the UK. This is higher than Milton Keynes as a whole (18.5%).

23.4% of the population in Middleton were born outside of the UK, this is a total of 3,695 people. Middleton had the fourth highest percentage of its population born outside of the UK of all wards in Milton Keynes. Table 4 shows the country of birth for Middleton residents compared with Milton Keynes.

0.5% of the Middleton population were born in Ireland and 2.7% were born in EU member states as at March 2001. 610 people were born in 2001-2011 EU accession countries; this is 3.9% of the population, higher than Milton Keynes as a whole (2.5%). 2,580 people (16.3%) were born outside of the EU, higher than the Milton Keynes figure of 13.0%.

The number of Middleton residents born outside of the UK increased from 590 people to 3,695 between 2001 and 2011.

1,210 people living in Middleton had been living in the UK for less than five years.

7.7% of the total Middleton population had lived in the UK for less than five years, higher than Milton Keynes as a whole (5.4%).

6. Household Language

7.7% of households in Middleton had no adult who had English as their main language compared with 6.4% in Milton Keynes.

84.8% of households in Middleton had all adults in the household with English as their main language and 92.3% had at least one adult with English as their main language.

450 households had no adult who had English as their main language. This is 7.7% of the population.

7. Religion

50.1% of the Middleton population stated they were Christian, 4.7% Muslim and 3.5% Hindu. 33.5% of the population in Middleton stated they had no religion.


Table 7 shows the number of people in each religious group in Middleton compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the largest religious group in Milton Keynes was Christian which accounted for 50.1% of the population, this is lower than Milton Keynes as a whole (52.8%). Relatively high proportions of the population stated they were Hindu (3.5%), Sikh (0.7%) and Buddhist (0.8%).

Graph 4 outlines the changes in religion in Middleton between 2001 and 2011. It shows that there had been a significant decline in the percentage of the population that stated they were Christian (61.6% to 50.1%) and an increase in the percentage that stated they had no religion (26.0% to 33.5%).

8. Health

2.9% of residents in Middleton said their day to day activities were limited a lot because of health issues. This compares to 6.4% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

The 2011 Census asked two questions on the health of residents. Both questions highlight that a smaller percentage of the population in Middleton felt that they had health issues when compared to Milton Keynes.

1. Are your day-to-day activities limited because of a health problem or disability which has lasted, or is expected to last, at least 12 months?

450 people stated their day-to-day activities were limited a lot due to health; this is 2.9% of population compared with 6.4% in Milton Keynes. This is the lowest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes. In total 7.2% of residents in Middleton stated they were limited a lot or a little. This compares to 13.9% in Milton Keynes.

2. How is your health in general?

335 respondents in Middleton felt their general health was bad or very bad. This is 2.1% of the population compared with 4.1% of the Milton Keynes population. 92.2% of residents in the ward felt they had good or very good health compared with 85.1% in Milton Keynes.

The 2011 Census questions on health were different to the 2001 Census and therefore can not be directly compared.

Health status is very strongly correlated to age. Residents in the older age groups tend to be less healthy than younger age groups. Therefore to make robust comparisons between areas health by age is needed.

9. Carers

965 residents in Middleton provided some unpaid care a week. This is 6.1% of the population compared with 8.8% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

The 2011 Census asked respondents if they provided some unpaid care each week to others either because of a long term disability or old age. The results show that 965 people in Middleton provided some unpaid care. This is 6.1% of the population the lowest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes.

Table 10 shows the number of hours of unpaid care residents undertook each week. It outlines that around 310 people undertook more than 20 hours of unpaid care each week with 190 of those undertaking more than 50 hours.



The percentage of Middleton residents providing unpaid care decreased slightly from 6.4% to 6.1% between 2001 and 2011.

The number of Middleton residents providing unpaid care increased by 179% from 350 in 2001 to 965 in 2011. As a percentage of the ward’s population it decreased slightly from 6.4% in 2001 to 6.1% in 2011.

Graph 5 outlines that those undertaking unpaid care were doing so with greater hours.

10. Living Arrangements

Middleton had the highest percentage of cohabiting couples living together of all wards in Milton Keynes and the lowest percentage of people who were widowed.

7,390 residents aged 16 and over in Middleton were living as a couple this is 63.8% compared to 60.4% for Milton Keynes. 2,910 (25.1%) residents were single (never married) whilst 200 people (1.7%) were widowed.

11. Household Composition

Middleton had a higher percentage of households with dependent children than Milton Keynes as a whole and a lower percentage of pensioner households.

There were 5,830 households in Middleton in 2011. Just 140 (2.5%) of these households were one person pensioner household, this compares to 8.7% for Milton Keynes as a whole. In total 19.4% of households in the ward were one person households compared with 25.9% for Milton Keynes.

In total 2,550 (43.8%) households in Middleton had dependent children this compares to 35.0% in Milton Keynes.

530 households, or 9.1%, in Middleton were lone parent households with dependent children. This compares to 8.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

12. Rooms and Bedrooms

The ward had a relatively large average household size. It had an average of 2.7 people per household compared with 2.5 in Milton Keynes.

The ward's average household size of 2.7 was the third largest of all 23 wards in Milton Keynes. The average household size in the ward increased from 2.4 to 2.7 between 2001 and 2011.

Middleton had a larger average number of rooms per household than Milton Keynes. There was an average of 5.7 rooms per household compared with 5.5 in Milton Keynes.

330 households in Middleton lived in over occupied accommodation.

The 2011 Census also estimates the number of households with a high occupancy rating. An occupancy rating of -1 implies that a household had one less room/bedroom than required. Table 15 shows that Middleton had around 330 households (5.7%) which were over occupied in terms of bedrooms. This is higher than the Milton Keynes figure of 5.1%.

Over occupancy in terms of rooms increased between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 120 (5.1%) households had an occupancy rating of -1 or less, in 2011 it had risen to 620 (10.7%). This is a trend that is seen nationally.

13. Accommodation Type

A larger percentage of dwellings were classified as flats and detached properties in Middleton than Milton Keynes as a whole.

There were 6,030 dwellings in Middleton in 2011. The 2011 Census asked residents what type of dwelling they lived in. A larger percentage (22.2%) of dwellings in the ward were flats when compared with Milton Keynes (16.2%). There were also a larger percentage of detached properties (33.7% compared to 28.2% in Milton Keynes)

A lower percentage of dwellings in Middleton were semi-detached or terraced properties (22.5% compared with 28.1% in Milton Keynes).


A growing percentage of dwellings in the ward were flats. 6.0% of dwellings in the ward were flats in 2001, this compares to 22.2% in 2011.

Overall the number of dwellings in Middleton grew from 2,380 in 2001 to 6,030 in 2011. This was an increase of 3,650 dwellings or 153%.

The number of flats in Middleton in 2011 was almost ten times larger than in 2001. Between 2001 and 2011 the number of flats grew from 140 to 1,340 in 2011. Graph 6 outlines that the percentage of dwellings which were flats increased from 6.0% in 2001 to 22.2% in 2011.

The percentage of houses/bungalows in Middleton decreased from 93.8% of all dwellings to 77.8%.

14. Tenure

11.0% of households in Middleton were shared ownership properties. This compares to 6.1% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

Overall 3,100 households in Middleton were owner occupied; this is 53.1% of dwellings significantly lower than the figure for Milton Keynes as a whole of 57.7%. A much smaller percentage of households were living in council rented accommodation in Middleton than Milton Keynes. 90 households (1.6%) live in council rented accommodation compared to 11.0% in Milton Keynes.

Middleton had a higher percentage of households in other social rented accommodation than Milton Keynes. There were 780 households in social rented housing other than from the council accounting for 13.4% of households compared with 7.1% in Milton Keynes. 1,220 households were in private rented accommodation (including living rent free); this is 20.8% of households.

640 households were in shared ownership properties this is 11.0% of all households compared with 6.1% in Milton Keynes.


The number of households living in private rented accommodation in Middleton increased from 155 in 2001 to 1,220 in 2011.

The number of households in Middleton living in private rented accommodation increased from 155 in 2001 to 1,220 in 2011, this is a 684% increase. It increased from 6.8% of all households in 2001 to 20.8% in 2011.

The number of households living in social rented accommodation increased between 2001 and 2011 but as a percentage of all dwellings it decreased from 16.1% to 15.0%.

There was a large decrease in the percentage of households living in owner occupied properties in Middleton from 64.6% in 2001 to 53.1% in 2011.

16. Car or Van Availability

Just 10% of households in Middleton had no cars or vans in the household. This is the fourth lowest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes

In 2011 there were 8,550 cars or vans in households in Middleton compared with 3,260 in 2001. Just 580 households in the ward had no car or van. This is 10.0% of all households, significantly lower than Milton Keynes (18.9%).



18. Qualifications and Students

Levels of qualifications in Middleton were significantly higher than the Milton Keynes average; 40.1% had a degree or higher qualification compared with 28.2% in Milton Keynes.

Table 20 shows the highest level of qualifications for residents aged 16+. It outlines that roughly 990 people aged 16+ in Middleton had no qualifications. This is 8.6% of the population and is the lowest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes.

About 4,640 people aged 16+ in the ward had a degree or higher qualification. This is 40.1% of the population the highest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes.



Levels of qualifications in Middleton increased significantly between 2001 and 2011.

Graph 9 outlines how levels of qualifications changed between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 28.3% of residents aged 16+ had a degree or higher, by 2011 this had increased to 40.1%. In 2001 14.0% of the population had no qualifications by 2011 this had decreased to 8.6%.

Middleton had the second highest percentage of students aged 18+ of all wards in Milton Keynes.

Table 21 shows that there were 560 people aged 18+ in full time education resident in the ward. This is 4.8% of the population, higher than the Milton Keynes average of 3.5%.

19. Economic Activity

Middleton had a higher economic activity rate (82.5%) than Milton Keynes (75.9%).

Table 22 outlines that the population aged 16-74 can be broken down into two broad categories:

1. Economically Active: People that were in work or looking and available for work.

9,390 people in the Middleton were economically active. This is 82.5% of the 16-74 year old population, the second highest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes and significantly higher than the Milton Keynes figure of 75.9%. The percentage of the population who were in employment is higher in Middleton compared with Milton Keynes as a whole. 8,560 residents in the ward were in employment, this is 75.2% of the 16-74 year old population higher than the Milton Keynes average of 68.0%.

There were 460 unemployed people in Middleton which accounted for 4.0% of the population, lower than the Milton Keynes rate of 4.8%.

2. Economically Inactive: People that were not in work and were not looking and available for work.

17.5% of the ward's 16-74 population were economically inactive compared with 24.1% in Milton Keynes as a whole. It had the lowest percentage of economically inactive retired people of all wards in Milton Keynes (4.9% of the population compared with 10.3% for Milton Keynes). The percentage who were long-term sick was also smaller than the Milton Keynes average (1.8% of the population compared with 3.2% for Milton Keynes).



There was a fall in the percentage of 16-74 year old population working as full time employees in Middleton.

Graph 10 outlines that the percentage of the 16-74 population working as full time employees decreased from 58.7% in 2001 to 54.9% in 2011. However, there was an increase in the percentage of people in part time employment and self employment which offsets this decrease to some degree. This is a trend experienced nationally.

The percentage of people who were unemployed increased from 3.1% to 4.0%, whilst the percentage of people who were economically inactive decreased from 19.0% to 17.5% between 2001 and 2011.

Economic activity is strongly correlated to age. Middle aged people tend to be more economically active than younger people (who may be students) and older people (who were more likely to be retired etc). Therefore to make robust comparisons between areas economic activity by age is needed.

20. Hours Worked

Over three quarters of Middleton residents in employment worked full time hours whilst just under a quarter worked part time.


The 2011 Census asked those in employment how many hours they worked a week. Table 23 outlines that in total 1,800 Middleton residents worked part time hours this is 20.3%.

21. Industry

87.5% of Middleton residents in employment were employed in the service sector compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

7,750 Middleton residents were employed in the service sector. This is 87.5% of employment compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole. 655 Middleton residents were employed in the manufacturing sector; this is 7.4% of those in employment.

The wholesale and retail trade industrial sector was the largest employer of Middleton residents.

Table 24 provides more detail on the industry of employment in Middleton and Milton Keynes. It shows that the wholesale and retail trade was the largest employer of residents in the ward. 1,750 residents were employed in this sector; this is 19.8% of people in employment compared with 20.6% in Milton Keynes.

Education, health and social work and public administration, defence and compulsory social security employs 2,200 people (24.9%).

The information and communication, education and professional, scientific and technical industries were larger in Middleton than Milton Keynes as a whole. The wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles/cycles, accommodation and food service activities, manufacturing and construction were in smaller proportions compared with Milton Keynes.

22. Occupation

13.2% of residents in Middleton were employed in manager, director and senior official occupations and 9.2% in elementary occupations.

A larger percentage of employees (13.2%) were employed in the managerial occupations in Middleton compared with Milton Keynes as a whole (10.9%). 810 residents were employed in elementary occupations. This is 9.2% of those in employment and is significantly lower than the Milton Keynes average of 12.3%.

A smaller percentage of people in employment in Middleton were employed in administrative and secretarial occupations, skilled trades occupations, caring, leisure and other service occupations, sales and customer service occupations, process, plant and machine operatives and elementary occupations than Milton Keynes as a whole. Larger proportions were employed in managers, directors and senior officials, professional occupations and associate professional and technical occupations.



The largest increase in employment between 2001 and 2011 in Middleton occurred in professional occupations the largest decrease occurred in manager, directors and senior officials occupations.

Graph 12 outlines that the largest increase in employment between 2001 and 2011 in Middleton occurred in professional occupations. 13.6% of those in employment in 2001 were employed in professional occupations by 2011 this increased to 23.4%. The largest decrease occurred in managers, directors and senior officials from 23.3% to 13.2%.

23. National Statistics – Socio-Economic Classification

Residents in Middleton were more likely to be classified in managerial socio-economic categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.

1,980 residents aged 16-74 in the ward were in the higher managerial and professional category. This is 17.4% of the population compared with 12.2% in Milton Keynes. Middleton also had a higher percentage of people in the lower managerial, administrative and professional occupations category.

Middleton had a smaller percentage of residents in the small employers and own account workers, lower supervisory and technical occupations, semi-routine occupations and routine occupations categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.
