

### Introduction

This document provides a set of thematic maps on the **car or van availability** in households by estates and settlements in Milton Keynes from 2011 Census data.

### Methodology

These maps were created by the Research and Intelligence team at Milton Keynes Council based on 2011 Census data published by the Office for National Statistics.

The 2011 Census data was not released at estate level. The Research and Intelligence team at Milton Keynes Council therefore added together Output Area (the smallest census geography) data to provide an estimate at estate level. As Output Areas (OAs) boundaries and estate boundaries do not always match, the data for OAs is weighted to estates. The data in the maps should therefore be seen as estimates based on 2011 Census data rather than actual figures. 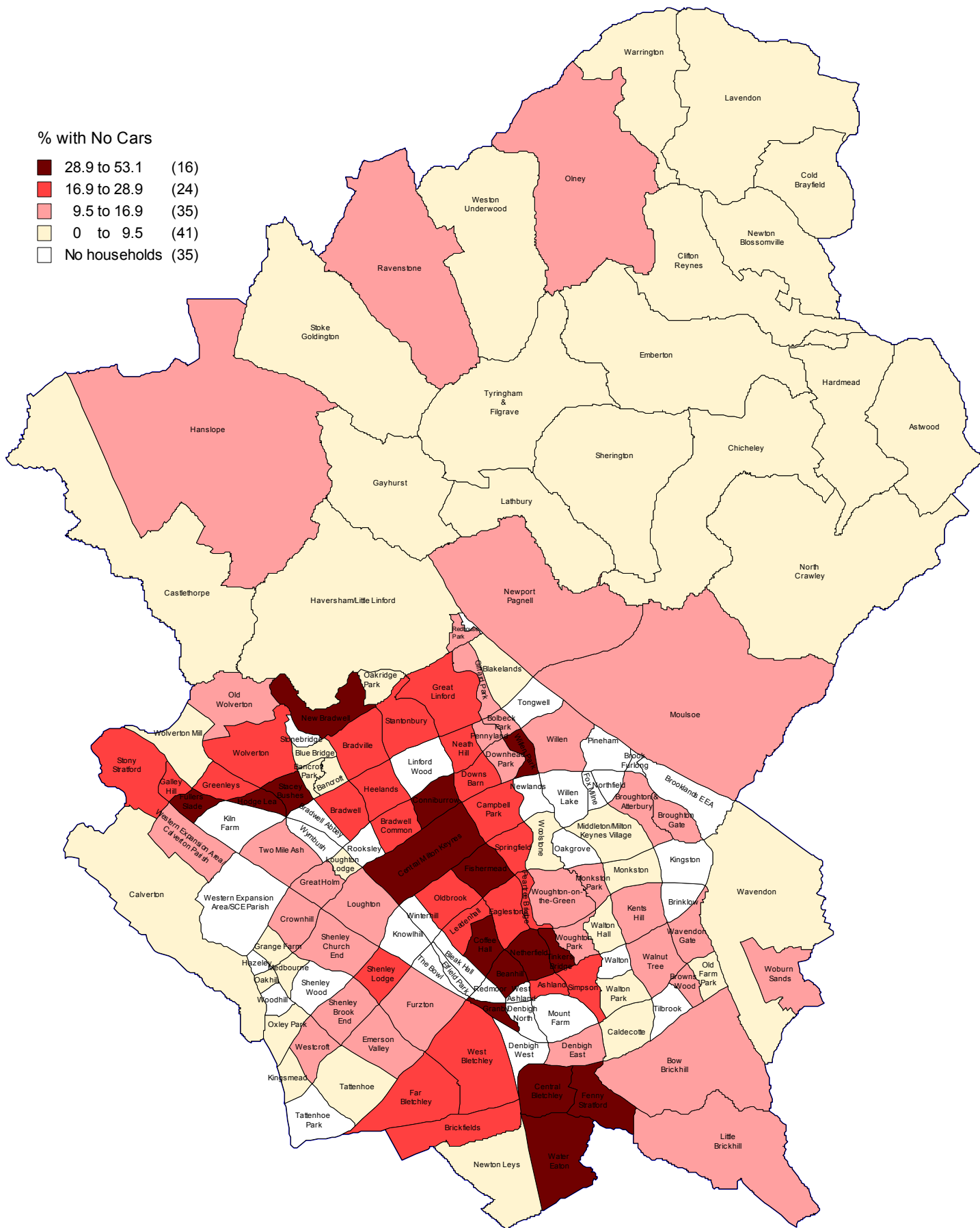

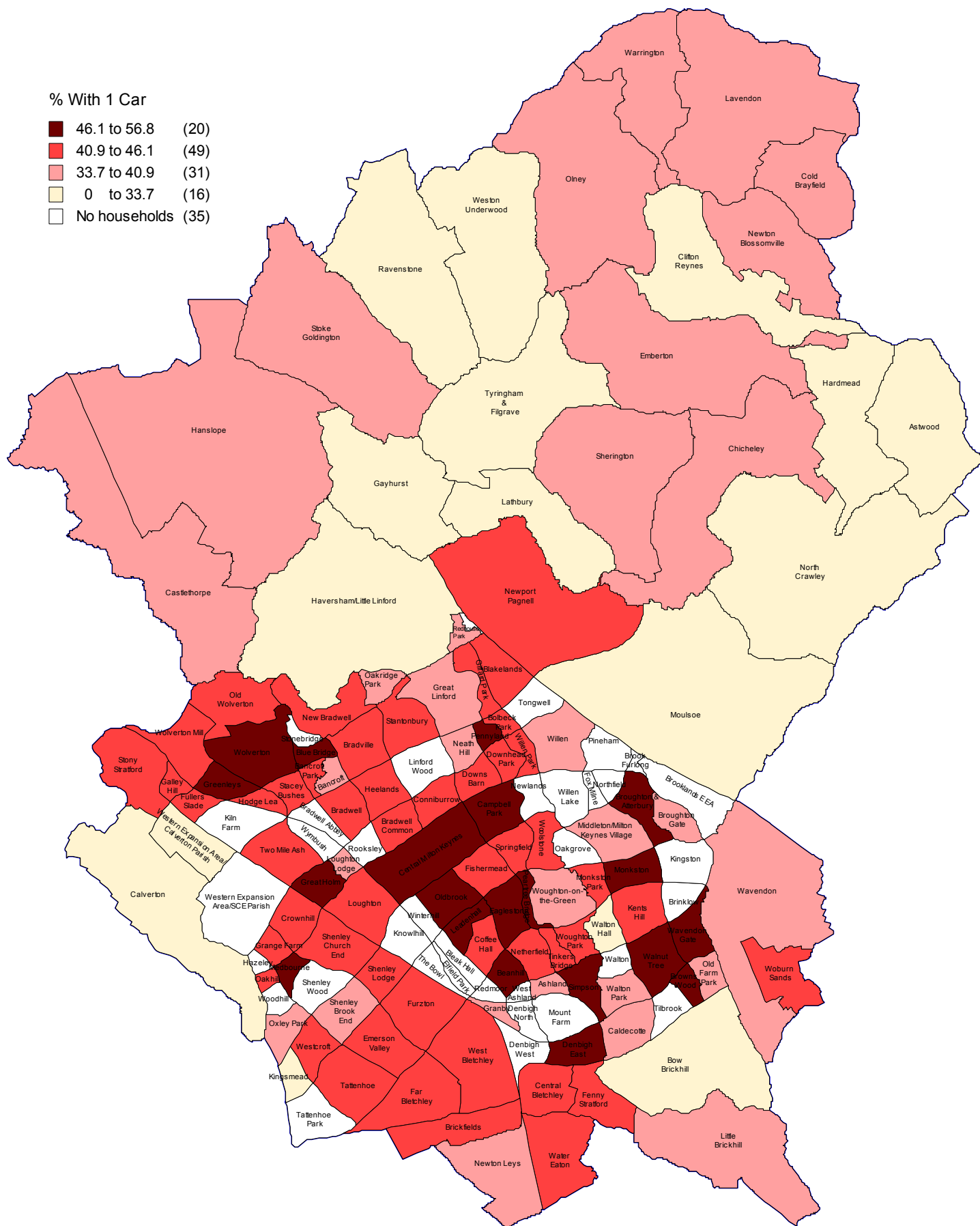
## 2011 Census Atlas: Car or Van Availability

### Map 1: % of Households with No Cars



Granby had the highest percentage (53.1%) of households with no car. Other areas with high percentages include Netherfield (44.5%), Central Milton Keynes (41.9%), Beanhill (40.0%), Conniburrow (39.1%) and Fishermead (39.0%).

## Map 2: % of Households with 1 Car

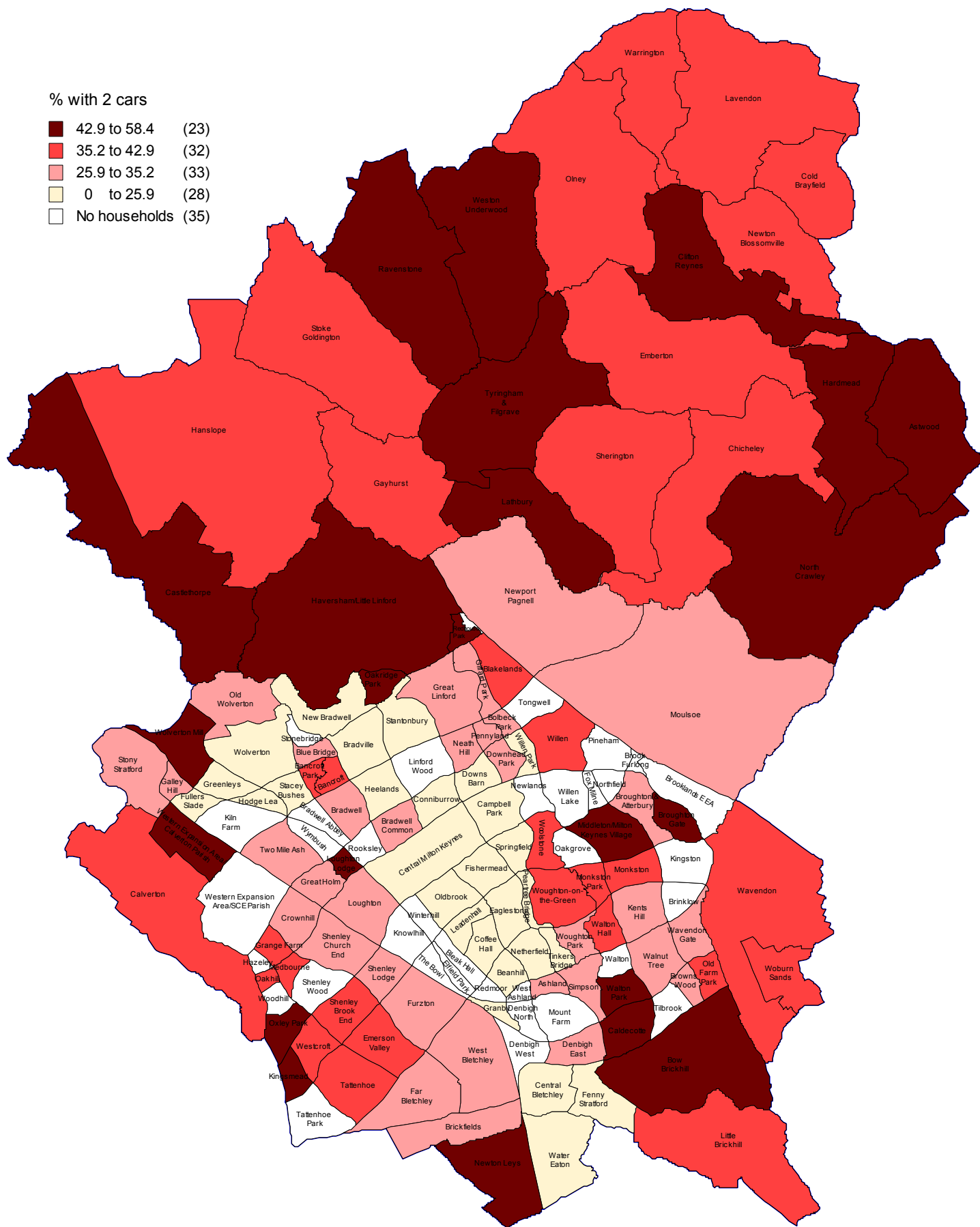


Leadenhall has the highest percentage (56.7%) of households with 1 car. Other areas with more than half of households having one car are Campbell Park (53.7%), Blue Bridge (50.6%) and Walnut Tree (50.3%).

### Map 3: % of Households with 2 Cars

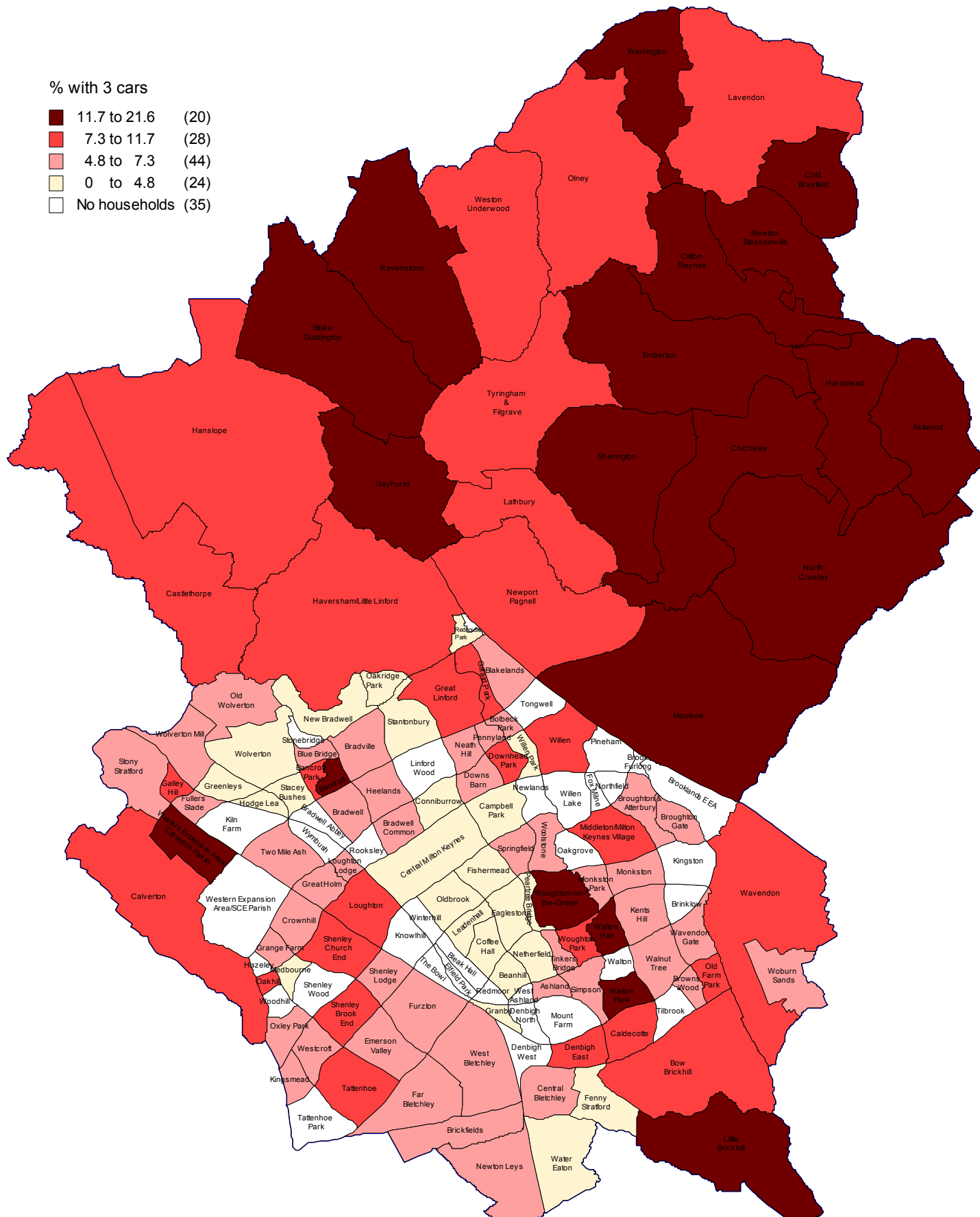


Lathbury has the highest proportion (58.3%) of households with 2 cars. Other areas with over half of households having two cars are Kingsmead (56.2%), Weston Underwood (52.0%), Hardmead (51.9%) and Astwood (51.3%).

# Map 4: % of Households with 3 Cars

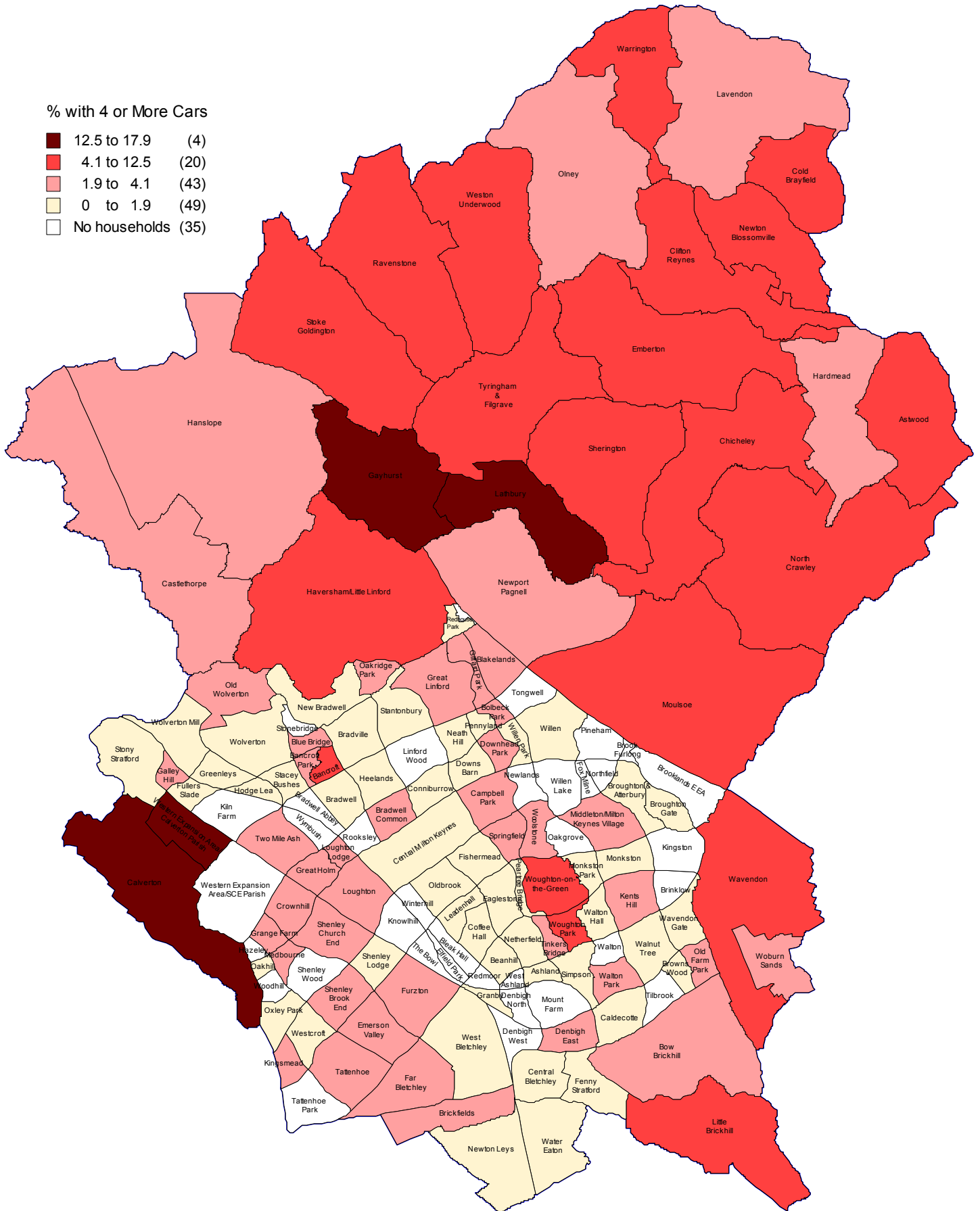

Rural areas tend to have the highest percentage of households with 3 cars. The highest of these include Clifton Reynes (21.5%), Moulsoe (19.7%), Chicheley (16.7%) and Gayhurst (16.1%).

## Map 4: % of Households with 4 or More Cars



Rural areas tend to have the highest percentages of households with 4 or more cars. The highest of these include Gayhurst (17.9%), Calverton (14.9%), Western Expansion Area/Calverton Parish (12.5%) and Lathbury (12.5%).
