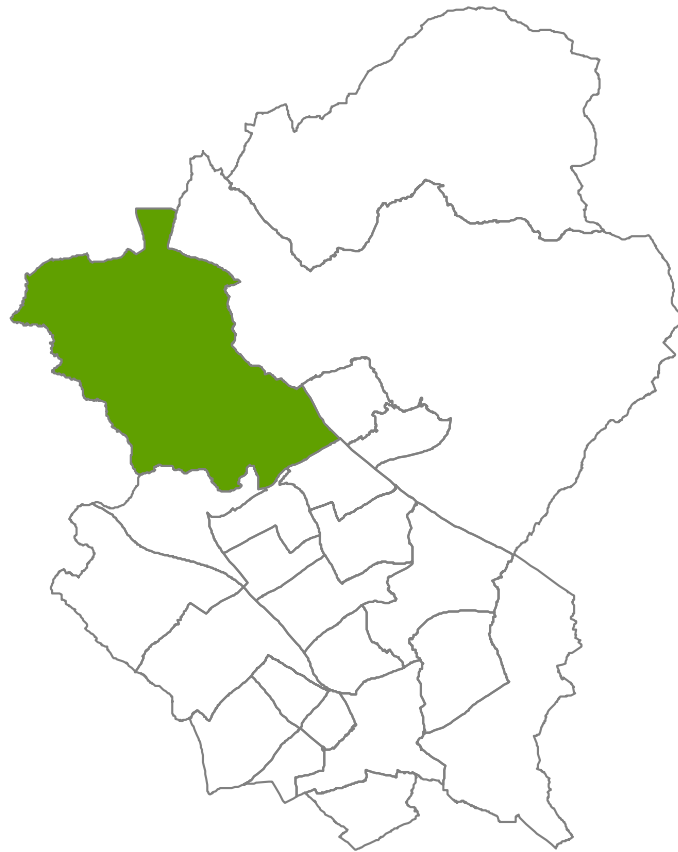

1. Executive Summary

Population

- The population of Hanslope Park in 2011 was 5,130.
- Hanslope Park had a relatively large population growth rate. The population grew by 1,140 people between 2001 and 2011. This is a 28.7% increase, the 5th largest growth rate of all wards in Milton Keynes.
- Hanslope Park had an older age profile than Milton Keynes as a whole. It had a smaller percentage of the population in the younger age groups; 19.6% were aged under 15 compared with 21.0% in Milton Keynes. It had a larger percentage in the older age groups; 14.2% were aged over 65 compared with 11.1% in Milton Keynes.
- The highest growth rate between 2001 and 2011 occurred in the 0-4 year old age group, growing by 93.7%.
- 10.4% of the Hanslope Park population were from a black and minority ethnic group. This compares to 6.0% in 2001 and 26.1% for Milton Keynes as a whole.
- The black and minority ethnic groups that increased the most between 2001 and 2011 were Black African (0.2% of the population in 2001 to 1.6% in 2011) and Mixed (1.1% of the population in 2001 to 2.1% in 2011).
- Just 7.8% of the population in Hanslope Park were born outside of the UK. This is significantly lower than Milton Keynes (18.5%).

Health

- 250 residents said their day to day activities were limited a lot because of health issues. This is 4.9% of the population compared with 6.4% for Milton Keynes.
- 490 residents in Hanslope Park provided some unpaid care a week. This is 9.5% of the population compared with 8.8% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

Housing

- Hanslope Park had a smaller percentage of households with dependent children than Milton Keynes (31.3% compared to 35.0%).
- The percentage of one person households is smaller in Hanslope Park (23.1%) than in Milton Keynes as a whole (25.9%).
- Hanslope Park had a small average household size. It had an average of 2.4 people per household compared with 2.5 in Milton Keynes.
- A larger percentage of dwellings in the ward (39.0%) were semi-detached when compared with Milton Keynes (28.1%).

- A growing percentage of dwellings in Hanslope Park were flats. In 2001 just 4.6% of dwellings in the ward were flats, by 2011 this had increased to 8.8%. However, this is still below the percentage for Milton Keynes as a whole (16.2%).
- Hanslope Park had a significantly higher percentage of owner occupied households and a smaller percentage living in council or private rented accommodation than Milton Keynes as a whole.
- The percentage of households living in private rented accommodation in Hanslope Park increased from 7.2% in 2001 to 9.9% in 2011.

Transport

- 9.3% of households in Hanslope Park had no cars or vans in the household. This is the second lowest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes.

Education

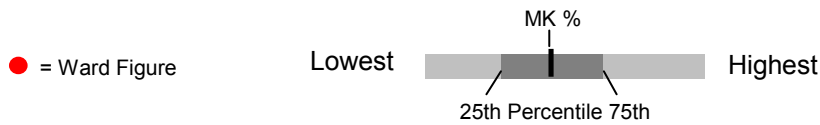
- Levels of qualifications in Hanslope Park were higher than the Milton Keynes average. 33.2% had a degree or higher compared with 28.2% in Milton Keynes. 14.5% had no qualifications compared with 18.0% in Milton Keynes.
- In addition to qualifications being higher than Milton Keynes, levels of qualifications also increased considerably between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 23.4% of residents aged 16+ had a degree or higher qualification by 2011 this had increased to 33.2%.

Economic

- A higher percentage (71.9%) of Hanslope Park residents aged 16-74 were in employment compared with Milton Keynes (68%).
- There was a fall from 47.9% to 46.1% between 2001 and 2011 in the percentage of the 16-74 year old population in Hanslope Park working as full time employees.
- 83.9% of Hanslope Park residents in employment were employed in the service sector compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole. The wholesale and retail trade industrial sector was the largest employer of Hanslope Park residents.
- Residents in Hanslope Park were more likely to be classified in managerial, administrative and professional occupations and small employers and own account workers socio-economic categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.

The Hanslope Park result for each indicator is shown as a red circle, against the range of results for all wards in Milton Keynes which are shown as a grey bar. 2. Introduction

This document provides a profile of Hanslope Park Ward from data released via the 2011 Census. The profile includes data for the ward and comparisons to Milton Keynes and to the 2001 Census figures.

3. Population Size and Age Structure

Hanslope Park had a faster population growth rate when compared with Milton Keynes as a whole. The population increased by 1,140 people (28.7%) to 5,130 between 2001 and 2011.

In 2011 the population of Hanslope Park was 5,130. Table 1 outlines that the population growth in Hanslope Park between 2001 and 2011 was larger than Milton Keynes as a whole. Hanslope Park grew by 1,140 people; this is an increase of 28.7% compared with 17% for Milton Keynes. Out of the 23 wards in Milton Keynes it had the 5th largest population growth rate between 2001 and 2011.

Hanslope Park had an older age profile than the Milton Keynes average. The average age in Hanslope Park was 40 compared with 35 for Milton Keynes.

Table 2 shows the age structure of Hanslope Park compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the ward had a higher percentage in the older age groups. In Hanslope Park in 2011 19.6% of the population were aged under 15 compared with 21% in Milton Keynes. 14.2% of the population were aged 65+ compared with 11.1% in Milton Keynes.

Hanslope Park had the third highest percentage (7.8%) of 60-64 year olds of all wards in Milton Keynes.

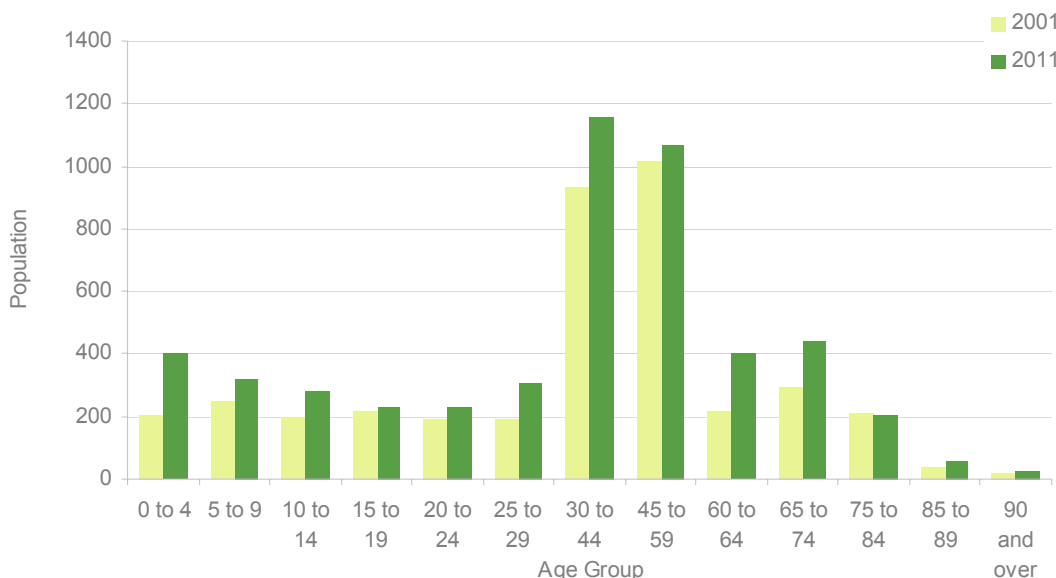

The highest growth rate between 2001 and 2011 in Hanslope Park occurred in the 0-4 year old age group.

Graph 2 shows the change in age structure between 2001 and 2011. It outlines that the highest growth occurred in the 0-4 year old age group. The number of people aged 0-4 grew by 93.7% from 210 people in 2001 to 400 people in 2011.

The 60-64 year old age group had the second fastest growth of 83.1%. It grew from 220 people in 2001 to 400 people in 2011.

4. Ethnicity

Hanslope Park had the sixth smallest black and minority ethnic group population of all wards in Milton Keynes. 10.4% of the population classified themselves in a black and minority ethnic group compared with 26.1% in Milton Keynes.

Overall 530 people (10.4%) of the population in Hanslope Park were from a black and minority ethnic group compared with 26.1% in Milton Keynes.

Table 3 shows the number of people in each ethnic group in Hanslope Park compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the ward had lower proportions than Milton Keynes in all black and minority ethnic groups.

The largest black and minority ethnic group in Hanslope Park was White Other. 140 people classified themselves in this category; this is 2.7% of the population, lower than the Milton Keynes figure of 5.1%. 110 people (2.1%) classified themselves as Mixed (compared with Milton Keynes average of 3.3%). Other black and minority ethnic groups in Hanslope Park appear in small numbers.

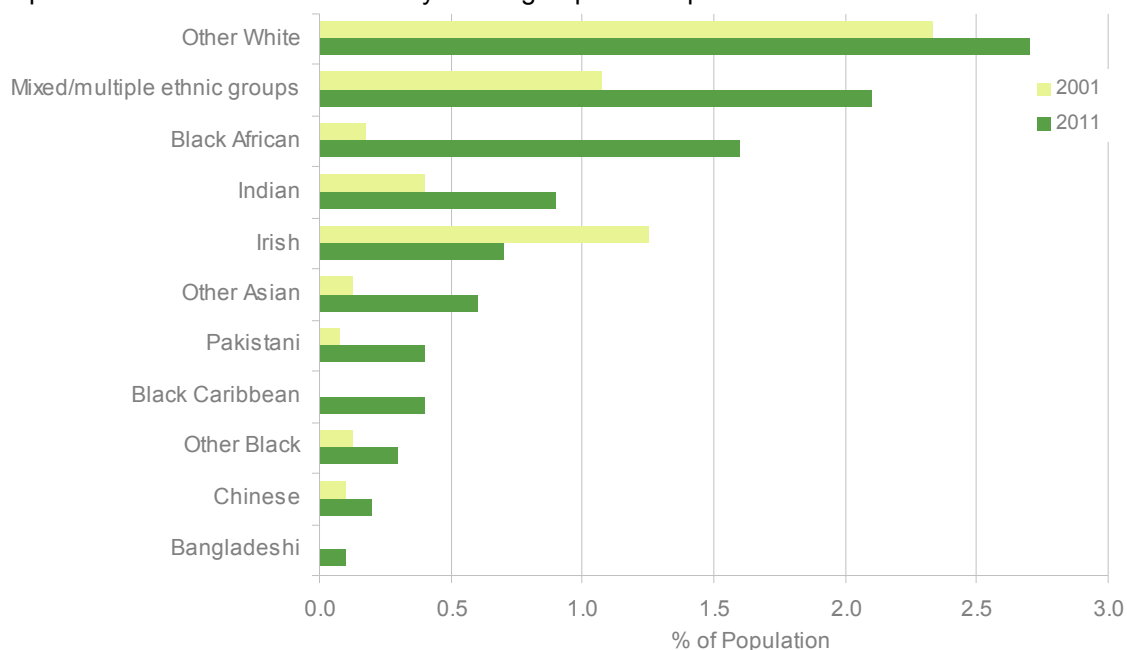

The population is becoming more ethnically diverse. In 2001 6.0% of the population were from a black and minority ethnic group compared with 10.4% in 2011.

Graph 3 outlines that there were a number of ethnic groups in Hanslope Park which experienced very high population growth between 2001 and 2011. The Black African ethnic group had the highest growth in Hanslope Park between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 it accounted for 0.2% of the population by 2011 it accounted for 1.6%, this is an increase from 10 people to 80. The Mixed ethnic group also grew in size from 1.1% of the population to 2.1%.

5. Country of Birth

Just 7.8% of the population in Hanslope Park were born outside of the UK. This is significantly lower than Milton Keynes as a whole (18.5%).

7.8% of the population in Hanslope Park were born outside of the UK; this is a total of 400 people. Hanslope Park had the fifth lowest percentage of its population born outside of the UK of all wards in Milton Keynes. Table 4 shows the country of birth for Hanslope Park residents compared with Milton Keynes.

0.6% of the Hanslope Park population were born in Ireland and 1.3% were born in EU member states as at March 2001. 50 people were born in 2001-2011 EU accession countries; this is 0.9% of the population significantly lower than Milton Keynes as a whole (2.5%). 255 people (5.0%) were born outside of the EU, significantly lower than the Milton Keynes figure of 13.0%.

The number of Hanslope Park residents born outside of the UK increased from 210 people to 400 between 2001 and 2011.

100 people living in Hanslope Park had been living in the UK for less than five years.

2.0% of the total Hanslope Park population had lived in the UK for less than five years, significantly lower than Milton Keynes as a whole (5.4%).

6. Household Language

Just 1.4% of households in Hanslope Park had no adult who had English as their main language compared with 6.4% in Milton Keynes.

96.2% of households in Hanslope Park had all adults in the household with English as their main language and 98.6% had at least one adult with English as their main language.

Just 30 households had no adult who had English as their main language. This is 1.4% of the population, the lowest percentage of all Milton Keynes wards.

7. Religion

57.0% of the Hanslope Park population stated they were Christian, 1.1% Muslim and 0.7% Hindu. 32.8% of the population in Hanslope Park stated they had no religion.

Table 7 shows the number of people in each religious group in Hanslope Park compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the largest religious group in Milton Keynes was Christian which accounted for 57.0% of the population, this is significantly higher than Milton Keynes as a whole (52.8%).

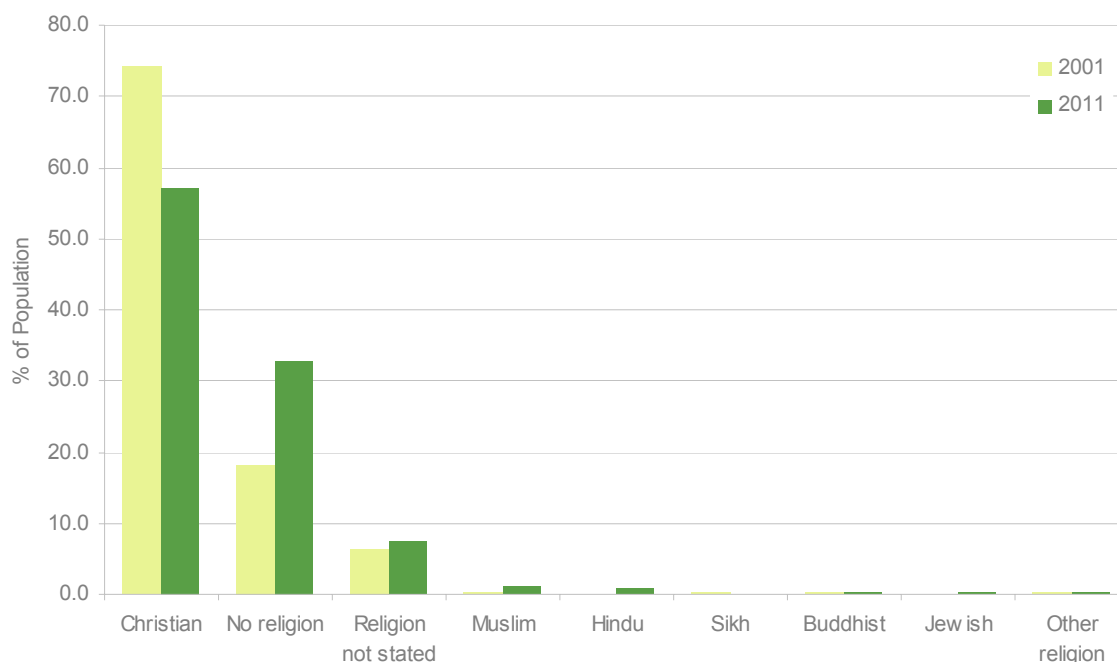
Other religious groups in Hanslope Park appear in very small numbers.

Graph 4 outlines the changes in religion in Hanslope Park between 2001 and 2011. It shows that there was a significant decline in the percentage of the population that stated they were Christian (74.1% to 57.0%) and an increase in the percentage that stated they had no religion (18.3% to 32.8%).

8. Health

4.9% of residents in Hanslope Park said their day to day activities were limited a lot because of health issues. This compares to 6.4% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

The 2011 Census asked two questions on the health of residents. Both questions highlight that a smaller percentage of the population in Hanslope Park felt that they had health issues when compared to Milton Keynes.

1. Are your day-to-day activities limited because of a health problem or disability which has lasted, or is expected to last, at least 12 months?

250 people stated their day-to-day activities were limited a lot due to health; this is 4.9% of population compared with 6.4% in Milton Keynes. This is the fifth lowest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes. In total 12.6% of residents in Hanslope Park stated they were limited a lot or a little. This compares to 13.9% in Milton Keynes.

2. How is your health in general?

180 respondents in Hanslope Park felt their general health was bad or very bad. This is 3.4% of the population compared with 4.1% of the Milton Keynes population. 86.4% of residents in the ward felt they had good or very good health compared with 85.1% in Milton Keynes.

The 2011 Census questions on health were different to the 2001 Census and therefore can not be directly compared.

Health status is very strongly correlated to age. Residents in the older age groups tend to be less healthy than younger age groups. Therefore to make robust comparisons between areas health by age is needed.

9. Carers

490 residents in Hanslope Park provided some unpaid care a week. This is 9.5% of the population compared with 8.8% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

The 2011 Census asked respondents if they provided some unpaid care each week to others either because of a long term disability or old age. The results show that around 490 people in Hanslope Park provided some unpaid care. This is 9.5% of the population, similar to the Milton Keynes figure of 8.8%.

Table 10 shows the number of hours of unpaid care residents undertook each week. It outlines that around 120 people undertook more than 20 hours of unpaid care each week with 90 of those undertaking more than 50 hours.

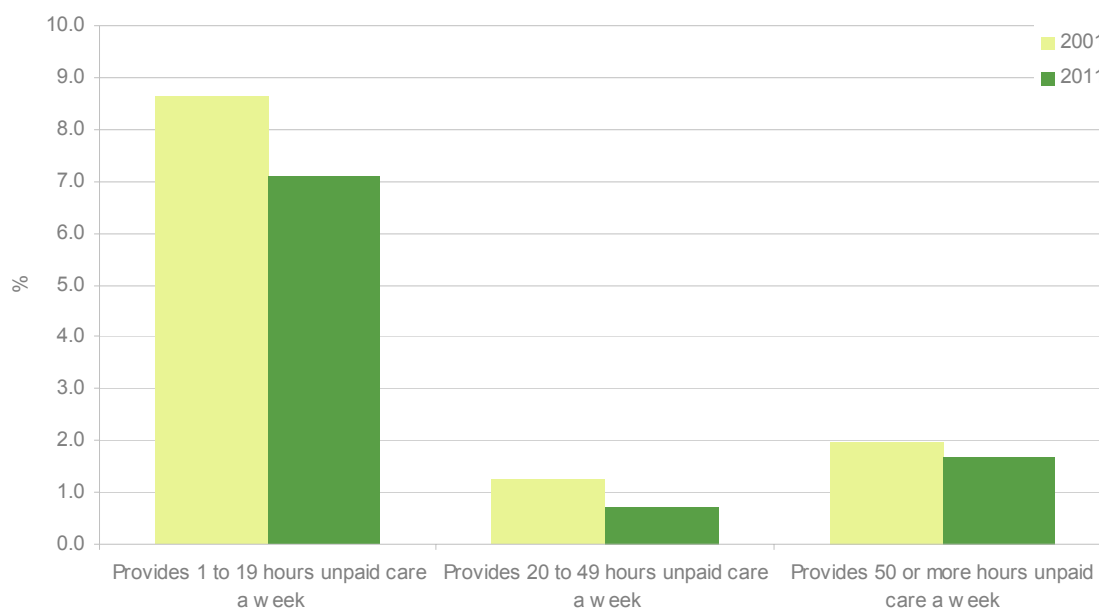

The percentage of Hanslope Park residents providing unpaid care decreased from 11.9% to 9.5% between 2001 and 2011.

The number of Hanslope Park residents providing unpaid care grew from slightly 470 in 2001 to 490 in 2011. However as a percentage of the ward’s population it decreased from 11.9% in 2001 to 9.5% in 2011.

Graph 5 outlines that those that were providing unpaid care declined between 2001 and 2011.

10. Living Arrangements

Hanslope Park had the third highest percentage of married couples living together of all wards in Milton Keynes and a lower percentage of people who were single.

2,890 residents aged 16 and over in Hanslope Park were living as a couple this is 70.7% compared to 60.4% for Milton Keynes. 700 (17.0%) residents were single (never married) whilst 200 people (4.8%) were widowed.

11. Household Composition

Hanslope Park had a lower percentage of households with dependent children than Milton Keynes as a whole and a higher percentage of pensioner households.

There were 2,125 households in Hanslope Park in 2011. 200 (9.3%) of these households were one person pensioner household, this compares to 8.7% for Milton Keynes as a whole. In total 23.1% of households in the ward were one person households compared with 25.9% for Milton Keynes.

In total 670 (31.3%) households in Hanslope Park had dependent children this compares to 35.0% in Milton Keynes.

120 households, or 5.5%, in Hanslope Park were lone parent households with dependent children. This compares to 8.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

The percentage of households with dependent children in Hanslope Park increased from 27.6% in 2001 to 31.3% in 2011.

Table 13 outlines how household composition changed between 2001 and 2011. The percentage of households with dependent children rose from 27.6% of households to 31.3%.

The number of lone parent households with dependent children increased from 3.0% to 5.5% between 2001 and 2011.

12. Rooms and Bedrooms

The ward had a relatively small average household size. It had an average of 2.4 people per household compared with 2.5 in Milton Keynes.

The ward's average household size of 2.4 was the sixth smallest of all 23 wards in Milton Keynes. The average household size in the ward remained the same between 2001 and 2011.

Hanslope Park had a larger average number of rooms per household than Milton Keynes. There was an average of 6.1 rooms per household compared with 5.5 in Milton Keynes.

30 households in Hanslope Park lived in over occupied accommodation.

The 2011 Census also estimates the number of households with a high occupancy rating. An occupancy rating of -1 implies that a household had one less room/bedroom than required. Table 15 shows that Hanslope Park had around 30 households (1.6%) which were over occupied in terms of bedrooms. This is significantly lower than the Milton Keynes figure of 5.1%.

Over occupancy in terms of rooms increased slightly between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 40 (2.6%) households had an occupancy rating of -1 or less, in 2011 it had risen to 95 (4.5%). This is a trend that is seen nationally.

13. Accommodation Type

A larger percentage of dwellings were classified as detached or semi-detached properties in Hanslope Park than Milton Keynes as a whole.

There were 2,240 dwellings in Hanslope Park in 2011. The 2011 Census asked residents what type of dwelling they lived in. A larger percentage (39.0%) of dwellings in the ward were semi-detached when compared with Milton Keynes (28.1%).

Hanslope Park Ward had a smaller percentage of terraced properties and flats than Milton Keynes as a whole.

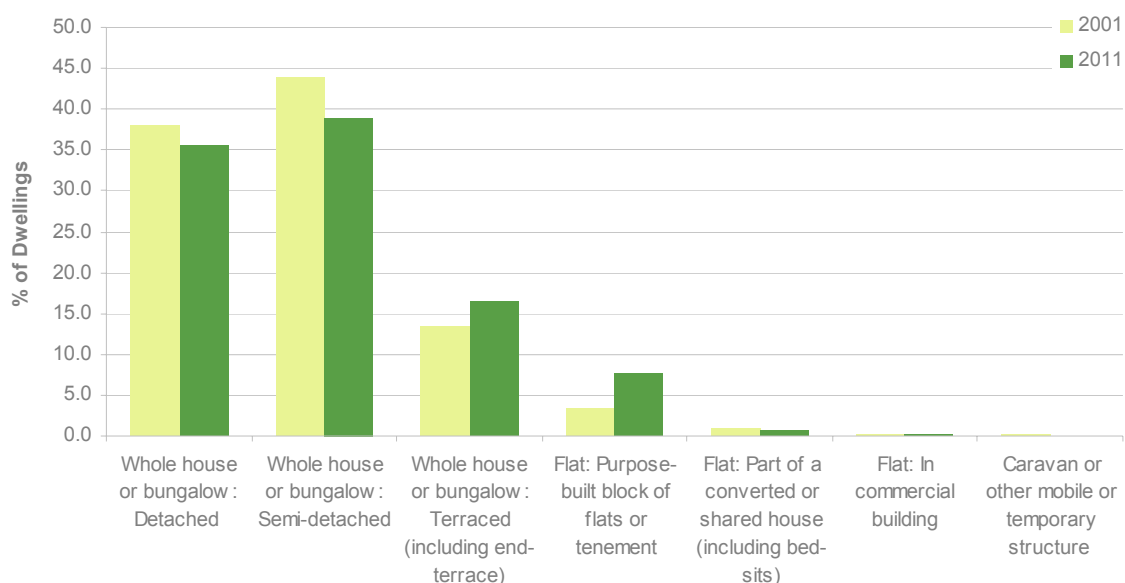
A growing percentage of dwellings in the ward were flats. 4.6% of dwellings in the ward were flats in 2001, this compares to 8.8% in 2011.

Overall the number of dwellings in Hanslope Park grew from 1,610 in 2001 to 2,240 in 2011. This is an increase of 545 dwellings or 32.2%.

The number of flats in Hanslope Park more than doubled between 2001 and 2011 from 80 to 200 in 2011. Graph 6 outlines that the percentage of dwelling which were flats increased from 4.6% in 2001 to 8.8% in 2011; this is a trend which is observed nationally.

The percentage of houses/bungalows in Hanslope Park decreased from 95.2% of all dwellings to 91.1%.

14. Tenure

31.5% of households in Hanslope Park own their dwelling outright. This compares to 21.5% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

Overall 74.9% of households in Hanslope Park were owner occupied; this is significantly higher than the figure for Milton Keynes as a whole of 57.7%.

A smaller percentage of households lived in the council rented accommodation in Hanslope Park than Milton Keynes. 120 households (5.5%) lived in council rented accommodation compared to 11.0% in Milton Keynes.

Hanslope Park also had a lower percentage of in private rented accommodation. 210 households were in private rented accommodation (including living rent free); this is 9.9% of households compared with 18.3% for Milton Keynes as a whole.

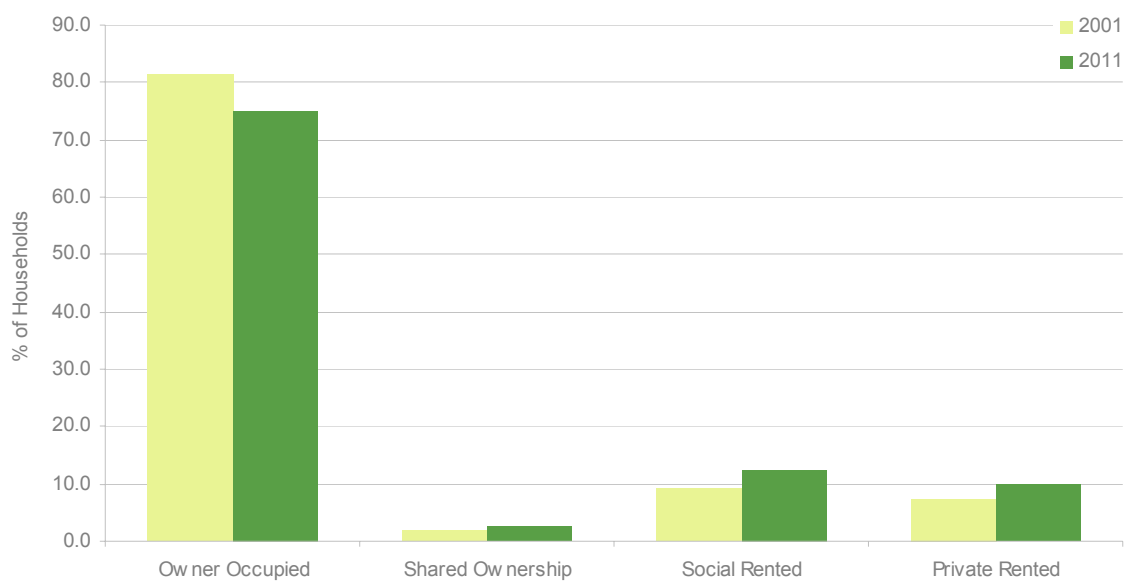
The percentage of households living in private rented accommodation in Hanslope Park increased from 7.2% in 2001 to 9.9% in 2011.

The number of households in Hanslope Park living in private rented accommodation increased from 120 in 2001 to 210 in 2011, this is a 77.3% increase. It increased from 7.2% of all households in 2001 to 9.9% in 2011.

The number of households living in social rented accommodation also increased significantly between 2001 and 2011. As a percentage of all dwellings it increased from 9.4% to 12.6%.

There was a large decrease in the percentage of households living in owner occupied properties in Hanslope Park from 81.5% in 2001 to 74.9% in 2011. The percentage of households in shared ownership increased from 1.9% to 2.6%.

16. Car or Van Availability

9.3% of households in Hanslope Park had no cars or vans in the household. This is the second lowest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes

In total in 2011 there were 3,440 cars or vans in households in Hanslope Park compared with 2,610 in 2001. Just 200 households in the ward had no car or van. This is 9.3% of all households, significantly lower than Milton Keynes (18.9%).

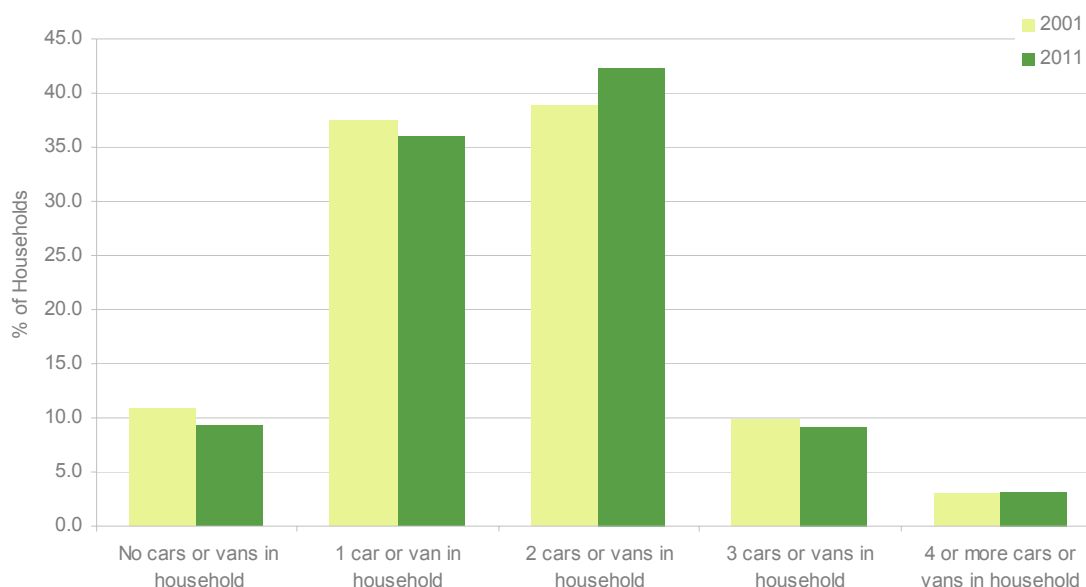

18. Qualifications and Students

Levels of qualifications in Hanslope Park were significantly higher than the Milton Keynes average; 33.2% had a degree or higher qualification compared with 28.2% in Milton Keynes.

Table 20 shows the highest level of qualifications for residents aged 16+. It outlines that roughly 590 people aged 16+ in Hanslope Park had no qualifications. This is 14.5% of the population and is lower than the Milton Keynes average of 18.0%.

1,355 people aged 16+ in the ward had a degree or higher qualification. This is 33.2% of the population, significantly higher than the Milton Keynes average of 28.2%.

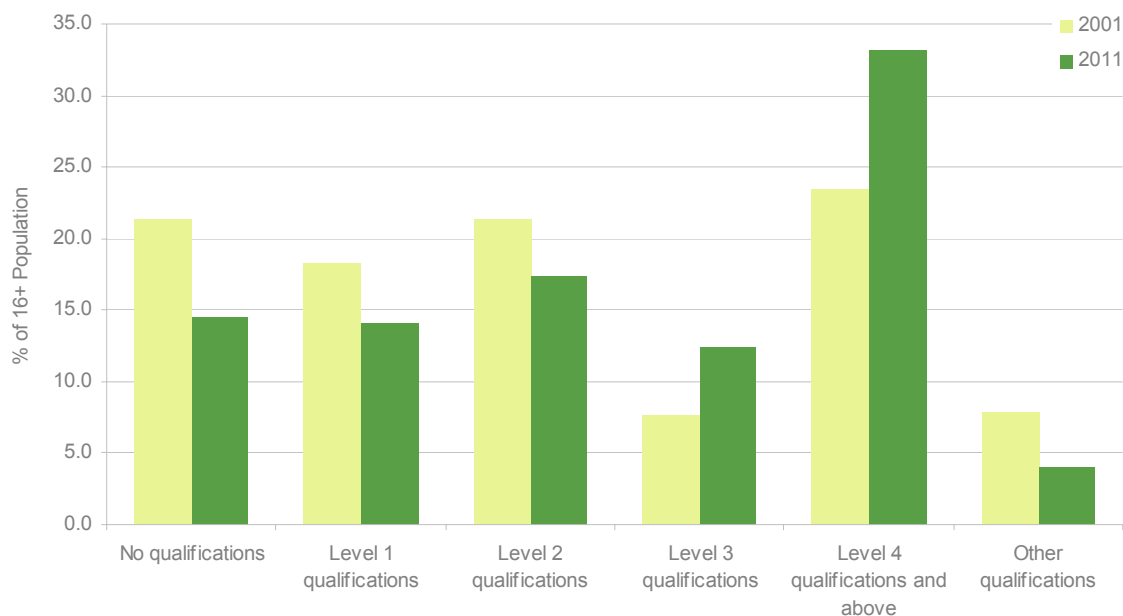

Levels of qualifications in Hanslope Park increased significantly between 2001 and 2011.

Graph 9 outlines how levels of qualifications changed between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 23.4% of residents aged 16+ had a degree or higher, by 2011 this had increased to 33.2%. In 2001 21.4% of the population had no qualifications by 2011 this had decreased to 14.5%.

Hanslope Park had a smaller percentage of students aged 18+ than Milton Keynes.

Table 21 shows that there were 80 people aged 18 and over in full time education resident in the ward. This is 1.9% of the population, lower than the Milton Keynes average of 3.5%.

19. Economic Activity

Hanslope Park had a higher percentage (71.9%) of the population in employment than Milton Keynes as a whole (68.0%).

Table 22 outlines that the population aged 16-74 can be broken down into two broad categories:

1. Economically Active: People that were in work or looking and available for work.

2,940 people in the Hanslope Park were economically active. This is 77.4% of the 16-74 year old population higher than the Milton Keynes figure of 75.9%. The percentage of the population who were in employment was higher in Hanslope Park compared with Milton Keynes as a whole. 2,730 residents in the ward were in employment, this is 71.9% of the 16-74 year old population compared with the Milton Keynes average of 68.0%. 480 residents (12.8%) in Milton Keynes were self employed; this is a larger percentage than the Milton Keynes average (8.7%).

There were 130 unemployed people in Hanslope Park which accounted for 3.5% of the population, lower than the Milton Keynes rate of 4.8%.

2. Economically Inactive: People that were not in work and were not looking and available for work.

Hanslope Park had a smaller percentage of the 16-74 population who were economically inactive. 22.6% of the ward's 16-74 population were economically inactive compared with 24.1% in Milton Keynes as a whole. The ward had a higher percentage of residents who were retired (14.1% of the population compared with 10.3% for Milton Keynes). However it had a smaller percentage who were students (including full-time students), looking after home or family, long-term sick or disabled or other economically inactive compared with Milton Keynes.

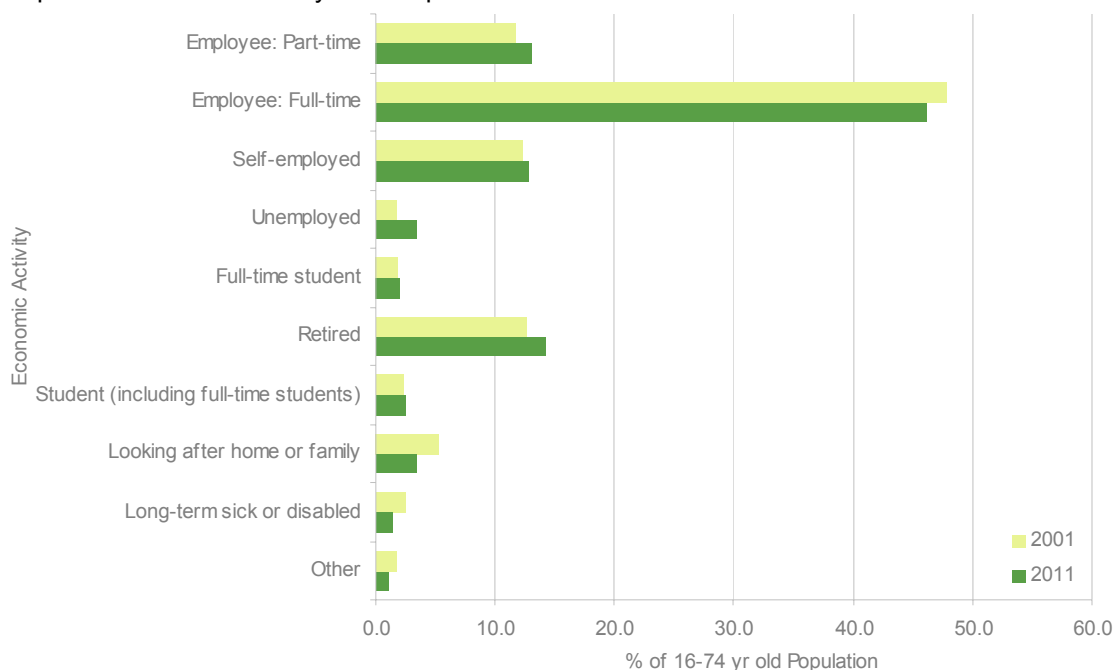

There was a fall in the percentage of 16-74 year old population working as full time employees in Hanslope Park.

Graph 10 outlines that the percentage of the 16-74 population working as full time employees decreased from 47.9% in 2001 to 46.1% in 2011. However, there was an increase in the percentage of people in part time employment and self employment which offsets this decrease. This is a trend experienced nationally.

The percentage of people who were unemployed increased from 1.8% to 3.5%, whilst the percentage of people who were economically inactive decreased slightly from 24.5% to 22.6% between 2001 and 2011.

Economic activity is strongly correlated to age. Middle aged people tend to be more economically active than younger people (who may be students) and older people (who were more likely to be retired etc). Therefore to make robust comparisons between areas economic activity by age is needed.

20. Hours Worked

Three quarters of Hanslope Park residents in employment worked full time hours whilst a quarter worked part time.

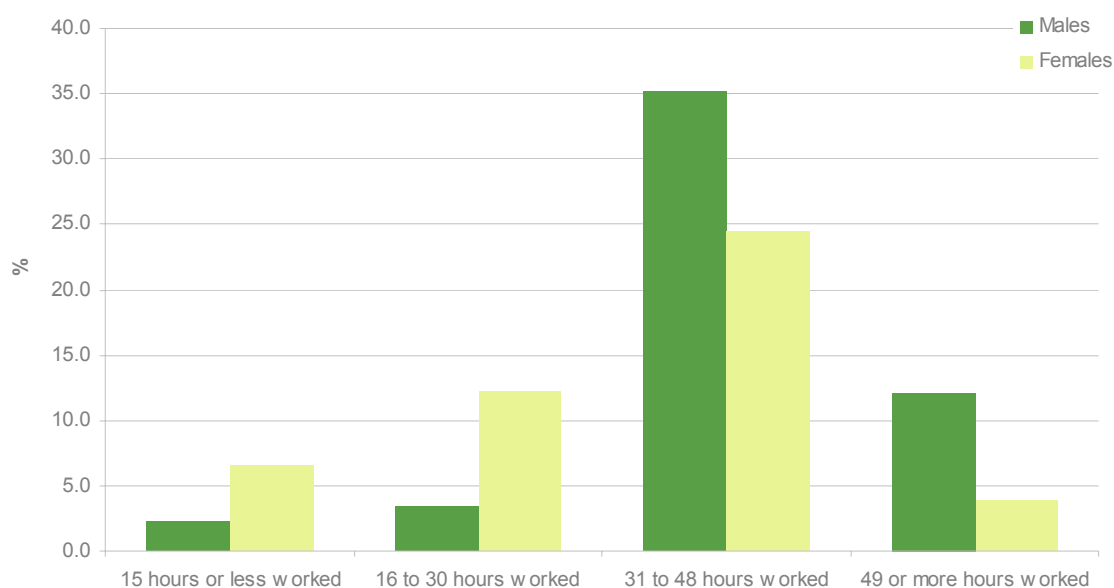
The 2011 Census asked those in employment how many hours they worked a week. Table 23 outlines that in total 680 of the ward’s residents worked part time hours this is 24.3%.

21. Industry

83.9% of Hanslope Park residents in employment were employed in the service sector compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

2,340 Hanslope Park residents were employed in the service sector. This is 83.9% of employment compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole. 210 Hanslope Park residents in employment were employed in the manufacturing sector; this is 7.4% of those in employment. A larger percentage of residents were employed in 'other' industries such as construction in the ward compared with Milton Keynes.

The wholesale and retail trade industrial sector was the largest employer of Hanslope Park residents.

Table 24 provides more detail on the industry of employment in Hanslope Park and Milton Keynes. It shows that the wholesale and retail trade was the largest employer of residents in the ward. 490 residents were employed in this sector; this is 17.4% of people in employment compared with 20.6% in Milton Keynes.

Education, health and social work and public administration, defence and compulsory social security employs 730 people (26.1%).

The education, professional, scientific and technical activities, construction, public administration and defence; compulsory social security and agriculture, forestry and fishing sectors were larger in Hanslope Park than Milton Keynes as a whole. The wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles/cycles and transport and storage sectors were in smaller proportions compared with Milton Keynes.

22. Occupation

15.2% of residents in Hanslope Park were employed in manager, director and senior official occupations and 7.4% in elementary occupations.

A larger percentage of employees were employed in the managerial occupations in Hanslope Park (15.2%) compared with Milton Keynes as a whole (10.9%). 210 residents were employed in elementary occupations. This is 7.4% of those in employment and is significantly lower than the Milton Keynes average of 12.3%.

A smaller percentage of people in employment in Hanslope Park were employed in caring, leisure and other service occupations, sales and customer service occupations, process, plant and machine operatives and elementary occupations than Milton Keynes as a whole. Larger proportions were employed in managers, directors and senior officials, professional occupations, associate professional and technical occupation and skilled trade occupations.

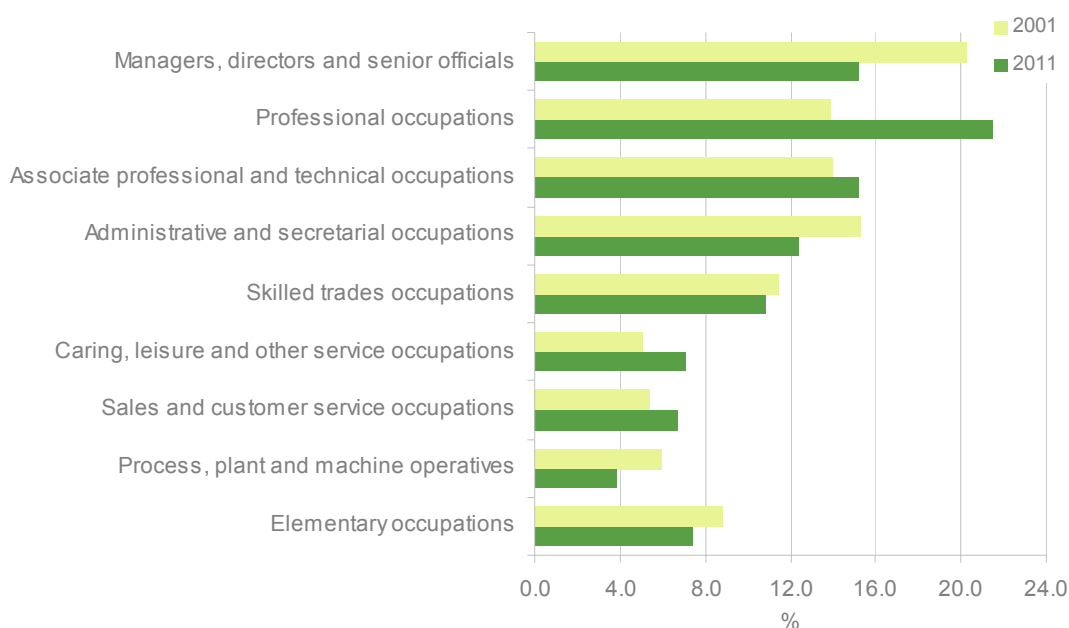

The largest increase in employment between 2001 and 2011 in Hanslope Park occurred in professional occupations the largest decrease occurred in skilled trade occupations.

Graph 12 outlines that the largest increase in employment between 2001 and 2011 in Hanslope Park occurred in professional occupations. 13.8% of those in employment in 2001 were employed in professional occupations by 2011 this increased to 21.5%. The largest decrease occurred in managers, directors and senior officials from 20.3% to 15.2%.

23. National Statistics – Socio-Economic Classification

Residents in Hanslope Park were more likely to be classified in managerial, administrative and professional occupations and small employers and own account workers socio-economic categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.

660 residents aged 16-74 in the ward were in the higher managerial and professional category. This is 17.3% of the population compared with 12.2% in Milton Keynes. Hanslope Park also had a higher percentage of people in the lower managerial, administrative and professional occupation category and small employers and own account workers.

Hanslope Park had a smaller percentage of residents in the lower supervisory and technical occupations, semi-routine occupations, routine occupations and never worked and long-term unemployed categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.
