Milton Keynes Ethnicity of School Age People - Spring 2008

The Spring 2008 Schools Census has been used to reveal the following. Overall in Milton Keynes, Black and Minority Ethnic groups represent about 26.9% of Pupils. This compares with the 2006 findings of 24.9%.

According to the schools census data, there is a higher than average proportion of minority ethnic groups in Nursery and Reception years, accounting for 33% of all pupils. Of those of primary school age 29.3% come from minority ethnic groups, and 22.6% of those of secondary school age come from minority ethnic groups.

In the sixth forms there are higher percentages (24.8%) of black and minority ethnic groups than in compulsory secondary education (22.6%).



The Black African Group is now the largest minority ethnic group accounting for 6.5% of pupils. This is followed by the Mixed (4.8%) and White other groups (3.9%).

Indian pupils make up the largest population in the Asian ethnic group with 905 pupils forming 2.4% of the pupil population in Milton Keynes. Pakistanis make up 2.3% of the pupil population and Bangladeshi's 1.5%.

Chinese pupils form just 0.8% of the Milton Keynes pupil population; this is similar to proportions by Black Caribbean pupils (0.9%), Black Other (1.2%) and Other (1.2%).



The graph above outlines the change in the proportions of pupils recorded in each black and minority ethnic group. It illustrates that the Asian Other Group has the highest growth rate of 22.6%. Other Group (18.7%), Black African (15.8%), Black Other (15.6%). Chinese (-3.4%) and White UK (-1.9%) both experienced a decline.

The following tables show the 15 estates with the highest proportion for the main black and minority ethnic groups. For confidentiality reasons the figures exclude estates with less than four members of the minority ethnic group or less than 10 pupils in total.

Black African pupils are also quite well spread in Milton Keynes, appearing in 81 of the 111 estates and settlements in Milton Keynes. They appear in high proportions in Wolverton Mill East and West, Fishermead, Broughton and Atterbury and Conniburrow.

Black Caribbean's form only 0.9% of the overall pupil population Milton Keynes yet in percentage terms they are quite significant in Galley Hill, Oxley Park, Stacey Bushes and Broughton and Atterbury, although only relatively small numbers are involved. The highest

number of Black Caribbean pupils is in Shenley Brook End with 20. They appear in only 62 of Milton Keynes' estates and settlements.

The Black Other group is a relatively small one in terms of Milton Keynes pupil numbers and so the actual numbers involved in the table above are quite small. They appear in just 68 of Milton Keynes' estates and settlements, although only 14 have more than 10 pupils.

Bangladeshi pupils form a highly significant part of Central Bletchley's pupil make-up, accounting for over a quarter of all pupils. They are also in large numbers (155) in Water Eaton. They are, however, the least spread of BME groups in Milton Keynes, appearing only in small numbers in areas other than Central Bletchley and Water Eaton, and in only 49 of Milton Keynes 111 estates and settlements. Only 9 estates have more than 10 Bangladeshi pupils.

Indian pupils are widely spread around Milton Keynes than Black Africans, appearing in 77 of Milton Keynes estates and settlements.

Pakistani pupils are mostly concentrated to the north of the city centre; especially in Wolverton where just over a fifth of pupils (220) are Pakistani. Pakistani Pupils appear in 71 of the estates and settlements in Milton Keynes.

Asian Other pupils appear in 65 estates in Milton Keynes, there are relatively high proportions in Downs Barn, Oldbrook, and Springfield.

Mixed ethnicity pupils are spread around Milton Keynes, appearing in 94 of the estates and settlements, but this is because it is a combined group of mixed ethnicities and may not be a homogenous group.

There are high proportions of White other pupils around the Bletchley areas; Central Bletchley (13.6%), Stony Stratford (8.4%), Caldecotte (7.6%).

Emerson Valley has the largest number of white other pupils (45)

The White Other group are the 2nd most spread around Milton Keynes appearing in 92 of the estates and settlements, the same number as the mixed group.
