Milton Keynes Ethnicity of School Age People - Spring 2010

The Spring 2010 Schools Census has been used to reveal the following. Overall in Milton Keynes, Black and Minority Ethnic groups* represent 31.0% of Pupils. This compares with the 2005 findings of 20.7%.

Of those of primary school age 33.2% come from minority ethnic groups and 26.7% of those of secondary school age come from minority ethnic groups.

In the sixth forms there are higher percentages (28.9%) of black and minority ethnic groups than in compulsory secondary education (26.7%).

The Black African Group is the largest minority ethnic group accounting for 7.8% of pupils. This is followed by the Mixed (5.4%) and White other groups (4.3%).


Black Caribbean pupils form just 0.9% of the Milton Keyes pupil population. Black Other pupils now account for 1.5%.

Pakistani pupils now make up the largest population in the Asian ethnic group with 1,044 pupils forming 2.6% of the pupil population in Milton Keynes. Indians make up 2.5% of the pupil population and Bangladeshis 1.5%.

Chinese pupils form just 0.7% of the Milton Keynes pupil population.

Comparison between 2005 and 2010



The graph above outlines the change in the proportions of pupils recorded in each black and minority ethnic group. It illustrates that the Asian Other Group has the highest growth rate of 144.7%. Black Other (116.5%) and Black African (116%) also have high growth rates. White Irish (-19.1%) Chinese (-9.2%) and White UK (-7.5%) all experienced a decline.

The following tables show the 15 estates with the highest proportion for the main black and minority ethnic groups. For confidentiality reasons the figures exclude estates with less than four members of the minority ethnic group or less than 10 pupils in total.

Results for Milton Keynes Academy are not included in the estates analysis.

Black African pupils are quite well spread in Milton Keynes, appearing in 83 of the 115 estates and settlements in Milton Keynes. They appear in high proportions in Ashland, Wolverton Mill East and South, Fishermead, and Conniburrow.

Black Caribbean's form only 0.9% of the overall pupil population Milton Keynes yet in percentage terms they are quite significant in Galley Hill although only relatively small

numbers are involved. The highest number of Black Caribbean pupils is in West Bletchley with 17. They appear in only 63 of Milton Keynes' estates and settlements.

Estates with the highest proportion of the Black Other group are Broughton and Atterbury, Fishermead, Peartree Bridge and Oldbrook. They appear in 70 of Milton Keynes' estates and settlements.

Bangladeshi pupils form a highly significant part of Central Bletchley's pupil make-up, accounting for over one fifth of all pupils. They are also in large numbers (162) in Water Eaton. They are, however, the least spread of BME groups in Milton Keynes, appearing only in small numbers in areas other than Central Bletchley and Water Eaton, and in only 49 of Milton Keynes 115 estates and settlements. Only 10 estates have more than 10 Bangladeshi pupils.

Indian pupils are widely spread around Milton Keynes, appearing in 70 of Milton Keynes estates and settlements.

Pakistani pupils are mostly concentrated to the north of the city centre; especially in Wolverton where just over a fifth of pupils (254) are Pakistani. Pakistani Pupils appear in 69 of the estates and settlements in Milton Keynes.

Asian Other pupils appear in 71 estates in Milton Keynes, there are relatively high proportions in Springfield, Oldbrook, Eaglestone and Downs Barn.

Mixed ethnicity pupils are spread around Milton Keynes, appearing in 97 of the estates and settlements, but this is because it is a combined group of mixed ethnicities and may not be a homogenous group.

There are high proportions of White other pupils in Central Milton Keynes (14.6%), Central Bletchley (12.2%), and Stony Stratford (10.5%).

Water Eaton has the largest number of white other pupils (98)

The White Other group are the most dispersed around Milton Keynes appearing in 98 of the estates and settlements.
