Executive Summary

Although Milton Keynes as a whole is relatively affluent, significant numbers of our residents at present have to: -

- rely on benefits
- expect much poorer health
- have a lower standard of education, and
- suffer from higher rates of crime than the average person in England

Over the last few years there have been some improvements in the situation: -

- * the number of families claiming Housing benefit has remained fairly stable
- the number of Income Support claimants has fallen slightly
- * the number of complaints about neighbours has fallen
- the overall crime rate in Milton Keynes has fallen

However, there have also been some situations which have deteriorated: -

- violent crime has increased
- the number of domestic fires has risen

The estates which continue to present themselves as having difficulties with many aspects of social and economic concern are Beanhill, Netherfield, Coffee Hall, Fishermead, Fullers Slade, New Bradwell, Stacey Bushes, Conniburrow, and Water Eaton.

There seems to have been some improvements in Fullers Slade, New Bradwell and Stacey Bushes resulting in these estates not appearing as high in the full ranking of deprived estates as they did in the previous document.

Several other estates are becoming noticeable in terms of some of the indicators:-

- Greenleys and Granby for neighbour complaints
- Westcroft for domestic fires and neighbour complaints
- Bradville for Family Referrals and children eligible for free school meals
- * Leadenhall for children with special educational needs, and for Violent Crime

FLOOR TARGETS

Floor targets are indicators aimed at helping government and councils to narrow the gap between deprived areas and the national averages in terms of health, education, crime, employment and housing. It will also flag up areas where progress is not being made. They will enable all those involved in neighbourhood renewal to identify priority areas monitor progress and compare themselves with others.

The table below outlines how Milton Keynes compares to the national and regional average. Data coloured in pink indicates Milton Keynes data is worse than the national average

The data outlines than Milton Keynes performs worse than the national and regional averages in the educational targets. Teenage conception and road casualty rates are also significantly worse than the national and regional averages, whilst Female life expectancy is slightly worse.

Milton Keynes does perform well in the Crime and Employment indicators.

Estates which have moved significantly up the ranking are Granby, Leadenhall, Oldbrook, Neath Hill and Fishermead.

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Introduction

The purpose of this fourth document in the series is to continue to enable people working towards Social Inclusion to identify: -

- the most significant social inclusion issues
- geographic concentrations of need
- the relative severity of social exclusion compared with other areas and the national picture
- a snapshot position, against which to gauge changes over time
- geographic areas and issues where development of services and initiatives might be focused

and to prompt discussion on possible causes of inequality and suggestions for actions to achieve improvement.

Earlier work included developing a framework to structure information gathering, along the lines of those used by the government in "Opportunity for All" and by bodies such as the Joseph Rowntree Trust. The framework has the following categories:

- income
- children
- young adults
- adults aged 25 to retirement
- older people
- community factors
- health and disability

The indicators used in these categories (see summary of indicator trends) are suggestions rather than definitive as yet. The ideals restricting choices for indicators are that: -

- they should be capable of being collected at ward and/or below ward level,
- they should be commonly available across all local authorities, and
- they should allow for national comparisons.

Some of the indicators included here fulfil these conditions, and some do not, but are included to prompt further discussion and development.

Two very useful developments since the first document have been: -

- The setting up of the Office for National Statistics website for the Neighbourhood Statistics Service. At
 present, data such as Family Credit and Disability Living Allowance claimants, University entrants
 and Key Stage 2 results are available at ward level for England at no cost. The web site can be found
 at http://www.neighbourhood.statistics.gov.uk/home.asp
 The site also provides access to data from
 the 2001 Census of population
- 2. The development by Milton Keynes Council of a **Toolkit of Sustainability Indicators**, which has been piloted on a Milton Keynes estate.

Findings

Brief conclusions from available information are that within Milton Keynes, several wards are noticeable in a national context using nationally available figures. The latest available data with national comparisons includes the data mentioned above from Neighbourhood Statistics and the DETR Index of Multiple Deprivation 2000. The Index of Multiple Deprivation has recently been updated and the position will be updated in the light of this new data in a supplementary publication.

These show us that for wards such as Campbell Park, Eaton Manor, Fenny Stratford, Linford South, Wolverton and Woughton, some residents are more likely to have to: -

- · rely on benefits,
- expect much poorer health,
- have a lower standard of education, and
- have poorer housing standards

than the average person in England.



INCOME

Overall in Milton Keynes a smaller proportion of the population claim income support than for England as a whole. Milton Keynes had a rate of 52.2 per 1000 population compared to 66.6 per 1000 in England.

There is significant variation in the rates of income support claimants between the wards in Milton Keynes. Woughton ward maintains having *over twice the national rate* for Income Support Claimants per 1,000 population. Estates covered by this ward include the Beanhill, Coffee Hall, Eaglestone, Leadenhall, Netherfield, Peartree Bridge, Tinkers Bridge, Woughton on the Green and Woughton Park. Eaton Manor and Campbell Park Wards are also significantly above national average rate of income support claimants.




CHILDREN


The proportion of dependent children in families claiming Income Support has fallen in Milton Keynes and is below that of England as a whole. There are, however, 6 wards in Milton Keynes which have a higher proprotion of dependent children in families claiming Income Support than the England average. Woughton Ward is over double the England average and Eaton Manor, Campbell Park and Wolverton Wards are still exceptionally high.

17.9% of England's under 19s were in families claiming income support in 1998, this has dropped slightly to 17.8% in 2001. In comparison, Milton Keynes has fallen from 16.0% to 15.4%

Social Atlas for Milton Keynes 2003/2004




The census included data on a 'language needs indicator'. This indicator is produced for use within the Standard Spending Assessments for England and provides an approximate indication for a person in a household that a language other than English might be the first language spoken. Using the 'language needs indicators' from the census there are thought to be 7,082 dependent children in Milton Keynes living in households in which a language other than English maybe the first language.



The graph shows that, 20% (465) of all dependant children in Bletchley & Fenny Stratford ward live in a household where English may not be the first language used. Campbell Park (20.3%) and Linford South (18.7%) also have a large proportion of depdendent children living in a household where English may not be the first language. In Bradwell ward, even more children may have language needs, but as the ward is larger, this forms a smaller proportion of the total population, with 15% of all dependant children having a language need by this definition.

YOUNG ADULTS

National data on university entrants indicate how wards in Milton Keynes compare.



A significant number of our wards fall beneath the national average for university entrants, as does Milton Keynes authority as a whole.


Locally available data for 18-24 year olds not getting student awards are interesting. Granby, Netherfield, Central Milton Keynes, and Kingsmead are most noticeable.

OLDER PEOPLE

Both the Milton Keynes and England rates for income support pensioners as percentage of 60+ year olds had increased very slightly between 1998-2001. The MK increase (13.3% to 13.5%) was slightly more than that of England (13.9% to 14%).

8 out of 24 wards in Milton Keynes are above the national average and Woughton is almost twice the national value.

This must be viewed as a worrying statistic, particularly as the proportion of the Milton Keynes population which is of pensionable age is set to show higher than average growth into the future.



The **Older People** indicator we have locally, Clients of the Council's Older People Services data, highlight estates such as Lathbury, Kingsmead, Kents Hill and Neath Hill.

COMMUNITY INDICATORS

Fire Data at Estate Level

Another example of a locally collected data set is domestic fires data. Since 1994 in Milton Keynes, average annual numbers of domestic fires have fallen from almost 300 fires a year to just over 200.


An analysis by locality reveals that during the last five years, certain estates have become especially noticeable for domestic fires. Between April 1998 and March 2003, there have been 12.6 domestic fires per 1,000 dwellings in Milton Keynes borough, but certain localities have much higher than average rates for domestic fires.

Granby stands out because although it has only 228 dwellings it has had 34 domestic fires during the last five years, giving it the highest rate of all estates in Milton Keynes. Furthermore, Granby has seen an increase in the number of fires per year.

Fullers Slade, Fishermead, Central Milton Keynes and Beanhill have seen significant decreases in domestic fires during this period, whereas Conniburrow and Netherfield have remained fairly steady in the number of fires, though still have significantly higher rates of domestic fires than average.

Water Eaton (the Lakes estate) has seen an increase in domestic fires in the past year. However there has been reduction in its number of domestic fires over thepast 5 years in the area.

Neighbour Complaints at Ward Level

Neighbour complaints are an important way of assessing the quality of life enjoyed in a neighbourhood. These are complaints by residents about their neighbours. Historically, the greatest number of complaints are about excessive and untimely noise. The rate of neighbour complaints per 1,000 dwellings shows some large differences when examined at ward level.

The rural areas show lower complaints about neighbours, after accounting for the number of dwellings. Sherington ward has the lowest rate of complaints, with less than 2 complaints per 1,000 dwellings, followed by Olney. This could be a result of the lower housing density in these areas. At the other end of the scale, Wolverton, Bradwell and Woughton are the wards with the highest rate of complaints. These wards have around 20 complaints per 1,000 dwellings. These can be seen in the chart overleaf.

Crime at Estate Level 2002-2003

Criminal Damage levels have stayed constant since the 2001-2002 period, at a rate of 20.9 indicents per 1,000 population. It has incsreased from 19 per 1000 population in 2000-2001. Criminal damage accounts for around 20.9% of all crime in Milton Keynes.

Central Milton Keynes and Granby are the estates which have seen the highest proportion of criminal damage incidents since 1998, though Fenny Stratford, Coffee Hall and Fishermead also experience more than their fair share of these incidents.

Burglary (Dwellings) in 2002-2003 have risen slightly from 13.7 per 1,000 dwellings to 14.6. Granby, Fishermead, Beanhill, Tinkers Bridge and Stantonbury feature as the estates with the highest rates for burglaries of dwellings.

Violent Crime in Milton Keynes rose from 13.3 incidents per 1000 popultion in 2001-2 to 17.2 2003-3.


The table here shows the estates and settlements in Milton Keynes which were above the Milton Keynes average (17.2 per 1000 population) in terms of Violent Crime during 2002-2003. Whereas the average rate for Milton Keynes was 17.2 violent crimes per 1,000 people, Central Milton Keynes had an extremely high figure (309 per 1000), because of its relatively low population compared with its massive number of visitors.

Fishermead and Coffe Hall were over double the Milton Keynes average, Campbell Park was three times, Granby almost five time and Leadenhall almost 6 time the Milton Keynes average.


HEALTH AND DISABILITY

Life expectancy is the focus of national government targets to reduce inequalities in health outcomes. Life expectancy is linked to social circumstances, and despite improvements the gap is large, and in some areas is widening. Specifically by 2010, the target is to reduce the gap in life expectancy at birth, by area, by 10%. Life expectancy at birth does not reflect the life experience of any individual. Instead, it provides a summary of the mortality experience of the individuals living in a particular area, over a period of time. Gaps in life expectancy can be observed between local authority areas. For example, in 1999/2001 a difference of 9.5 years was observed between areas with the highest life expectancy at birth for boys, and areas with the lowest. The gap for girls was 6.9 years. The gaps within these areas can be even wider. The situation for Milton keynes can be seen from the chart below.



To get a reasonable estimate of life expectancy within a small area, such as a ward, data relating to deaths over 5 years was used. The differences are marked. For example, the ward with the lowest life expectancy, Woughton, is 5.2 years below the average for Milton Keynes, of 77.9 years. The ward with the highest life expectancy is Emerson Valley, exceeding the Milton Keynes average by 7.6 years. This disguises other differences however. For example, women throughout the western world have higher life expectancy than men, and Milton Keynes is no exception! Over the 1997-2001 period, female life expectancy has been calculated to 80.1 years, in comparison to the male expectancy of 75.5 years.


Nationally available disability benefits data provide us with results at ward level. Milton Keynes has a lower porportion of residents claiming Severe Disability Living Allowance, Incapacity Benefits and Disability Lving Allowance than for England as a whole. Woughton ward is consistently higher than the national average for all three disability benefits for 2001. Campbell Park was also higher than the national average on all three benefits in 2001. Eaton Manor Wards was higher in two out of three benefits. The only other wards with one disability benefit higher than national rates are Denbugh and Stantonbury for Disability Living Allowance and Linford South and Loughton Park for Ssvere Disability Allowance.



Local **Health and Disability** indicators such as Disabled Concessionary Fares, Physically Disabled Clients, Learning Disabled Clients and Mental Health Clients of Milton Keynes Council are helpful in looking at health and disability. They have been useful in pointing out several areas of need, such as Granby, Stacey Bushes, Beanhill, Coffee Hall, and Simpson.

The 2001 Census collected data on health across the country. The map over the page shows the proportion of households with a child aged under 15 years of age who has a limiting long term illness. Woughton, Eaton Manor, Denbigh and Emerson Valley wards stand out as having large proportions of their 0-15 year olds with a limiting long term illness.


The Data at Estate/Settlement Level

The information contained in this atlas is derived from the work done for Milton Keynes Council's Social Inclusion Working Group. The profiles at estate and settlement level were prepared to highlight the extent of 'social exclusion' in Milton Keynes and its concentration in particular areas, with a view to targeting areas to improve local services and community networks. The intention is to continue to develop using these indicators, so that the effects of any actions tackling the many aspects of social exclusion can be monitored.

However, availability and comparability of indicators over time is a problem at this small area level, so only 16 of the indicators' changes over time are able to be analysed (see pages vi to viii).

The Social Inclusion Working Group has now been disbanded. A new group is being formed to meet the needs of the Social Inclusion and Health Inequalities framework. The new group will be multi-disciplinary, led jointly by the Primary Care Trust and the Council. Definitions and Methods

INCOME

Housing/Council Tax Benefit Jan 2004

Postcoded information on claimants was aggregated to estates/settlements and expressed per 1,000 dwellings. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 165.2 per 1,000 dwellings claim benefit.

Concessionary Fares November 2002

Postcoded information was aggregated to estates and settlements and expressed per 1,000 population. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 87.7 per 1,000 people. The data were not available to update this indicator.

CHILDREN

Teenage Conceptions (Under 18 year olds) 2002/2003

Births and terminations data to teenage girls aged under 18 are aggregated to estate and settlement and expressed per 1,000 15 to 17 year old girls. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 26.7 per 1,000 15 to 17 year old girls. Concerns over data quality mean that extreme caution should be used in the use of this indicator.

Family Referrals 2003

Counts of families referred to Social Services by estate have been made, and expressed per 1,000 dwellings. Milton Keynes Average = 37.5 per 1,000 dwellings.

Children with Special Educational Needs (4 to 18 year olds) October 2003

Postcoded data on children statemented with special educational needs is aggregated and expressed per 1,000 4 to 18 year olds. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 35.2 per 1,000 4 to 18 year olds.

Free School Meals November 2003

Postcoded information was aggregated to estates and settlements and expressed per 1,000 pupils. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 74.9 per 1,000 pupils.

YOUNG ADULTS

18-24 year olds Not Receiving Student Awards September 2003

Postcoded information is aggregated and expressed per 1,000 18 to 24 year olds. Milton Keynes Average = 840.3 per 1,000 18 to 24 year olds.

OLDER PEOPLE

Pensioner Concessionary Fares November 2002

Postcoded data on pensioners claiming concessionary fares is aggregated and expressed per 1,000 pensioners. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 630.1 per 1,000 pensioners.

Older People Clients of Neighbourhood Services October 2003

Postcoded data on clients is aggregated and expressed per 1,000 pensioners. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 57.6 per 1,000 pensioners. The data were not available to update this indicator.

COMMUNITY FACTORS

Domestic Fires Data April 1998 to March 2003

Bucks Fire and Rescue Services postcoded data on domestic fires is aggregated to estates and settlements and expressed per 1,000 households. Milton Keynes Average = 12.6 per 1,000 households over 5 years.

Neighbour Complaints April 2002 - March 2003

Milton Keynes Council Environmental Health postcoded data on domestic nuisance complaints is aggregated to estate and settlement and expressed per 1,000 dwellings. Milton Keynes Average = 17.6 per 1,000 dwellings.

Council Rented Housing April 2003

Tenure data at estate and settlement is expressed per 1,000 dwellings. Milton Keynes Average = 140.1 per 1,000 dwellings

Violent Crime April 2002 - March 2003

Recorded Violent crime at estate and settlement level is expressed per 1,000 total population. Milton Keynes Average = 17.2 per 1,000 people.

Burglary (Dwellings) April 2002 - March 2003

Recorded Burglary of dwellings at estate and settlement level is expressed per 1,000 dwellings. Milton Keynes Average = 14.6 per 1,000 dwellings.



Population Denominators - Population figures used in this publication are estimates. The estimates are base on postcoded figures from Bucks Health Authority Patient Registration data from the April 2002 patient register, these figures were then adjusted to match the 2001 census headline results.
