Executive Summary

Although Milton Keynes as a whole is relatively affluent, significant numbers of our residents at present have to: -

- rely on benefits
- * expect poorer health and lower life expectancy
- have a lower standard of education

Over the last few years there have been some improvements in the situation: -

- Milton Keynes has a good employment rate for all groups
- * the number of families claiming Housing benefit has remained fairly stable
- the number of complaints about neighbours has fallen
- the crime rate in Milton Keynes has fallen to below the national average

However, there have also been some situations which have deteriorated: -

- * Children with Special Educational Needs have increased
- * the rate of criminal damage has increased

Estate profiles include a population-weighted estate summary of the relative rankings under the 2004 Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD). This shows the estates with the highest ranking as Beanhill, Netherfield and Coffee Hall. There are some differences between the rankings under the IMD and the Social Atlas 2005, where the highest ranked estates are Netherfield, Stacey Bushes, Beanhill and Tinkers Bridge. This may reflect recent changes, as Stacey Bushes and Tinkers Bridge have moved up from rank 10 and 7 respectively. Beanhill has moved down to rank 3, from a rank of 1. Coffee Hall has moved down from rank 3 to rank 12. Many of the same estates are in both 'top 20 estates' lists, highlighting the ability to target disadvantage using the Social Atlas.

There seems to have been some improvements in Fullers Slade and Central Milton Keynes resulting in these estates not appearing as high in the full ranking of deprived estates as they did in the previous document.

Several other estates are becoming noticeable in terms of some of the indicators:-

- * Astwood for neighbour complaints
- Westcroft for domestic fires and teenage conceptions
- Bradville for Family Referrals and children eligible for free school meals
- Fenny Stratford for teenage conceptions, domestic fires, crime and emergency hospital admissions

FLOOR TARGETS 2003*

Floor targets are indicators aimed at helping government and councils to narrow the gap between deprived areas and the national averages in terms of health, education, crime, employment and housing. It will also flag up areas where progress is not being made. They will enable all those involved in neighbourhood renewal to identify priority areas monitor progress and compare themselves with others.

The table below outlines how Milton Keynes compares to the national and regional average. Data coloured in red indicates Milton Keynes data is worse than the national average.

Netherfield has consistently been ranked as having significant difficulties. There may have been some improvement in Beanhill and Coffee Hall, areas which have previously been ranked at the top of the estates with difficulties. Granby has moved up the ranking for the second year running, as has Tinkers Bridge. Other estates which have got worse are Water Eaton, Stacey Bushes, Greenleys, Hodge Lea, Fenny Stratford, Springfield, Bradville, Heelands and Leadenhall. Estates which have improved over last years ranking are Fishermead, Conniburrow, Fullers Slade, Central Milton Keynes and Stantonbury.

Introduction

The purpose of this series o documents is to enable people working towards Social Inclusion to identify: -

- the most significant social inclusion issues
- geographic concentrations of need
- the relative severity of social exclusion compared with other areas and the national picture
- a snapshot position, against which to gauge changes over time
- geographic areas and issues where development of services and initiatives might be focused

and to prompt discussion on possible causes of inequality and suggestions for actions to achieve improvement.

The data used are primarily locally collected data, intended to highlight areas with a high need for public services. Earlier work included developing a framework to structure information gathering, along the lines of those used by the government in "Opportunity for All" and by bodies such as the Joseph Rowntree Trust. The framework has the following categories:

- income
- children
- young adults
- adults aged 25 to retirement
- older people
- community factors
- health and disability

The indicators used in these categories (see summary of indicator trends) are suggestions rather than definitive. The ideals restricting choices for indicators are that: -

- they should be capable of being collected at ward and/or below ward level,
- they should be commonly available across all local authorities, and
- they should allow for national comparisons.

Useful developments since the first document have been: -

- The setting up of the Office for National Statistics website for the Neighbourhood Statistics Service. Extensive amounts of data, from the 2001 census and other administrative data sources, are available at local level at no cost. The web site can be found at http://www.neighbourhood.statistics.gov.uk/home.asp
- 2. The development and updating of the Index of Multiple Deprivation, a multi-dimensional indicator available to lower-super output area level, in 2000 and 2004.
- 3. The development of floor targets as measures of authority-wide moves to narrow the gap between deprived areas and the national average

Findings

Brief conclusions from available information are that within Milton Keynes, several areas are noticeable in a national context using nationally available figures. This is confirmed with local data.

Figures from the 2004 Index of Multiple Deprivation show us that Woughton Ward stands out as having some residents that are more likely to: -

- rely on benefits,
- expect much poorer health,
- have a lower standard of education, and
- suffer from crime

than the average person in England.

Eaton Manor also shows up in some the indicators especially education, skills and training. Sherington also has issues regarding barriers to housing and services.



Using nationally available benefits figures, the following situation emerges: -

INCOME


Overall in Milton Keynes a smaller proportion of the population claim income support than for England as a whole. Milton Keynes had a rate of 50 per 1000 population compared to 62 per 1000 in England.

There is significant variation in the rates of income support claimants between the wards in Milton Keynes. Woughton ward maintains having *over twice the national rate* for Income Support Claimants per 1,000 population. Estates covered by this ward include Beanhill, Coffee Hall, Eaglestone, Leadenhall, Netherfield and Tinkers Bridge. Eaton Manor and Campbell Park Wards are also significantly above national average rate of income support claimants.




CHILDREN

In 2004 3,170 Lone Parents families claimed Income Support in Milton Keynes. This is a rate of 22.9 per 1,000 and therefore is below that of England as a whole (23.3 per 1,000). There are, however, 8 wards in Milton Keynes which have a higher proportion of dependent children in families claiming Income Support. Woughton Ward (63.8 per 1,000) is over double the England average and Eaton Manor (57 per 1,000), and Campbell Park (37.8.5 per 1,000) are still exceptionally high.




The 2001 Census included data on a 'language needs indicator'. This showed that Bletchley and Fenny Stratford Ward and Campbell Park Ward had the highest proportion of dependent children who live in a household where English may not be the first language. The Pupil Level Annual Schools Census also collected data on the first language of pupils. Details of this data is shown below and reveals a similar picture.



The graph shows that, 22% (507) of all pupils living in Campbell Park Ward may have a first language other than English. Bletchley and Fenny Stratford also stands out as having a large proportion (18%) of pupils whose first language may not be English. Wolverton (16%) and Linford South also have a significantly higher proportion of pupils whose first language may not be English.

YOUNG ADULTS

2001 Census data on the number of students, including those living away from home, indicate how wards in Milton Keynes compare.




A significant number Milton Keynes wards fall beneath the MK average (24.9%) for the number of students. Wards with particularly low proportions of students include; Woughton (9.8%) , Eaton Manor (12.6%) and Bletchley (15.5%).

Locally available data for 18-24 year olds not getting student awards are interesting. Granby, Netherfield, Central Milton Keynes, and Kingsmead are most noticeable.

OLDER PEOPLE

6,270 people aged 60 and over were in households claiming Pension Credit. This is 208.3 per 1,000 population slightly lower than the England average of 210.1 per 1,000.

There are, however, 10 out of 23 wards in Milton Keynes which are above the national average with Woughton (375.6 per 1,000) standing out as significantly higher than the other wards. Eaton Manor, Furzton, and Bradwell Wards also have much higher than average numbers claiming Pension Credit.



The **Older People** indicator we have locally, Clients of the Council's Older People Services data, highlight estates such as Lathbury, Kingsmead, Kents Hill and Neath Hill.

COMMUNITY INDICATORS


Another example of a locally collected data set is domestic fires data. Since 1994 in Milton Keynes, average annual rates of domestic fires have fallen from almost 300 fires a year to just over 200.

An analysis by locality reveals that during the last five years, certain estates have become especially noticeable for domestic fires. Between April 1999 and March 2004, there have been 11.7 domestic fires per 1,000 dwellings in Milton Keynes borough, but certain localities have much higher than average rates for domestic fires.

Granby stands out because although it has only 228 dwellings it has had 40 domestic fires during the last five years, giving it the highest rate of all estates in Milton Keynes. Its rate of 175.8 dwelling fires per 1000 dwellings is 15 times higher than the Milton Keynes average.

Fullers Slade, Conniburrow and Fishermead have seen decreases in domestic fires during this period, whereas Netherfield has increased in the number of fires, though all still have higher rates of domestic fires than average.

Neighbour Complaints at Ward Level

Neighbour complaints are an important way of assessing the quality of life enjoyed in a neighbourhood. These are complaints by residents about their neighbours. Historically, the greatest numbers of complaints are about excessive and untimely noise. The rate of neighbour complaints per 1,000 dwellings shows some large differences when examined at ward level.

The rural areas show lower complaints about neighbours, after accounting for the number of dwellings. Olney ward has the lowest number of complaints per 1,000 dwellings; nearby Sherington is similar. This could be a result of the lower housing density in these areas. At the other end of the scale, Campbell Park and Bletchley & Fenny Stratford are the wards with the highest rate of complaints. These wards have around 20 complaints per 1,000 dwellings. Looking at the data for 2 years illustrates how the rate of complaints in most areas has fallen, with Sherington being the only area where the rate of complaints has risen slightly, but from a low base.

Crime at Estate Level 2004-2005

Criminal Damage levels have increased since the 2000-2001 period, going up from 19.0 incidents per 1,000 population in 2000/1 to 24.5 in 2004/5. Criminal Damage accounts for around 19.5% of all crime in Milton Keynes.

Central Milton Keynes and Granby are the estates which have seen the highest proportion of criminal damage incidents in 2004/5, though Fenny Stratford, Conniburrow and Leadenhall and Peartree Bridge also experience more than their fair share of these incidents.

Burglary (Dwellings) in 2004/5 have fallen from 14.6 per 1,000 dwellings in 2002/3 to 10.6. Granby, Netherfield, Tinkers Bridge, Leadenhall and Tinkers Bridge feature as the estates with the highest rates for burglaries of dwellings.

Violent Crime in Milton Keynes rose from 17.2 per 1000 population in 2002/3 to 25.4 per 1,000 in 2004/5.

The table here shows some estates and settlements in Milton Keynes in terms of Violent Crime during 2001-2002. Whereas the average rate for Milton Keynes was 25.4 violent crimes per 1,000 people, Central Milton Keynes had an extremely high figure, because of its massive number of visitors. Leadenhall has almost seven times the average of violent crimes and Granby over 6 times the Milton Keynes average.

HEALTH AND DISABILITY

Life expectancy is a focus of national government targets to reduce inequalities in health outcomes. Life expectancy is linked to social circumstances, and despite improvements the gap is large, and in some areas is widening. Specifically by 2010, the target is to reduce the gap in life expectancy at birth, by area, by 10%. Life expectancy at birth does not reflect the life experience of any individual. Instead, it provides a summary of the mortality experience of the individuals living in a particular area, over a period of time. Gaps in life expectancy can be observed between local authority areas. For example, in 1999/2001 a difference of 9.5 years was observed between areas with the highest life expectancy at birth for boys, and areas with the lowest. The gap for girls was 6.9 years. The gaps within these areas can be even wider. The situation for Milton keynes can be seen from the chart below.




The average life expectancy in Milton Keynes was 78.44 years, slightly higher than the previous year but with a range of 9,05 years. Middleton has the highest life expectancy for persons, rising from 8th rank previously, with a life expectancy at birth of 81.57 years. Woughton has the lowest life expectancy of 72.52 years.

The life expectancy at birth was 76.28 years for males, range 12.04 years. Middleton had the highest life expectancy for males, of 82.61 years. This is quite exceptional, because the life expectancy for females in this ward is below that for males. Woughton has the lowest life expectancy for males of 70.57 years. The life expectancy at birth for females in Milton Keynes was 80.45 years, range 10.23. Bradwell had the highest life expectancy of 84.42 years and Woughton the lowest at 74.19 years.

Although the average life expectancies had increased slightly from the previous figure, the range has increased for persons, and for males. Life expectancies in Woughton have fallen slightly for males and for persons. There is a reasonably high level of consistency between the rankings of life expectancy (the relative position of wards) for the two most recent calculations.

Social Atlas for Milton Keynes 2004/2005


Nationally available disability benefits data provide us with results at ward level. Milton Keynes has a lower proportion of residents claiming Severe Disability Living Allowance, Incapacity Benefits and Disability Living Allowance than for England as a whole. Woughton ward is consistently higher than the national average for both disability benefits. It has over twice the average Incapacity Benefit/Severe DLA rate and almost double the average for Disability Living Allowance. Eaton Manor Ward was higher than the national average in both benefits. The only other ward with one disability benefit higher than national rates is Campbell Park for Incapacity Benefit/Severe DLA.



Local **Health and Disability** indicators such as Disabled Concessionary Fares, Physically Disabled Clients, Learning Disabled Clients and Mental Health Clients of Milton Keynes Council are useful at looking at health and disability. They have been useful in pointing out several areas of need, such as Granby, Stacey Bushes, Beanhill, Coffee Hall, and Simpson.

As the table on page 2 shows the Index of Multiple Deprivation 2004 outlined deprivation levels relating to Health and Disability. The map on page 11 shows the rank of Milton Keynes's Super Output areas compared to other SOA's in England. It clearly shows areas in Woughton ward and on area in Eaton Manor Ward as having the most deprivation relating to health and disability in Milton Keynes.

Social Atlas for Milton Keynes 2004/2005





This domain from the Index of Multiple Deprivation identifies small geographic units called Super Output Areas (SOAs) with relatively high rates of people who die prematurely or whose quality of life is impaired by poor health or who are disabled, across the whole population. The indicator is made up of:

- 1. Years of Potential Life Lost (1997-2001)
- 2. Comparative Illness and Disability Ratio (2001)
- 3. Measures of emergency admissions to hospital (1999-2002)
- 4. Adults under 60 suffering from mood or anxiety disorders (1997-2002)



Definitions and Methods INCOME

Housing/Council Tax Benefit March 2005

Postcoded information on claimants was aggregated to estates/settlements and expressed per 1,000 dwellings. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 171.5 per 1,000 dwellings claim benefit.

CHILDREN

Teenage Conceptions (Under 18 year olds) 2003/2005 annualised.

Births and terminations data to teenage girls aged under 18 are aggregated to estate and settlement and expressed per 1,000 15 to 17 year old girls. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 27.0 per 1,000 15 to 17 year old girls. Concerns over data volatility mean that extreme caution should be used in the use of this indicator.

Family Referrals 2004/2005

Counts of families referred to Social Services by estate have been made, and expressed per 1,000 dwellings. Milton Keynes Average = 25.6 per 1,000 dwellings.

Children with Special Educational Needs (4 to 18 year olds) March 2005

Postcoded data on children statemented with special educational needs is aggregated and expressed per 1,000 4 to 18 year olds. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 38.9 per 1,000 4 to 18 year olds.

Free School Meals March 2005

Postcoded information was aggregated to estates and settlements and expressed per 1,000 pupils. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 108.5 per 1,000 pupils.

Non-White Pupils September 2004

Pupils ethnicity is expressed as per 1,000 pupils. Milton Keynes Average = 224.0 per 1,000 pupils

YOUNG ADULTS

18-24 year olds Not Receiving Student Awards September 2004

Postcoded information is aggregated and expressed per 1,000 18 to 24 year olds. Milton Keynes Average = 851.3 per 1,000 18 to 24 year olds.

OLDER PEOPLE

Pensioner Concessionary Fares 2004-2005

Postcoded data on pensioners claiming concessionary fares is aggregated and expressed per 1,000 pensioners. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 839.9 per 1,000 pensioners. NOTE: these data have been provided as at August 2005, retrospective data are not available.

OLDER PEOPLE

Older People Clients of Neighbourhood Services April 2004 - March 2005

Postcoded data on clients is aggregated and expressed per 1,000 pensioners. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 62.2 per 1,000 pensioners.

COMMUNITY FACTORS

Domestic Fires Data April 1999 to March 2004

Bucks Fire and Rescue Services postcoded data on domestic fires is aggregated to estates and settlements and expressed per 1,000 households. Milton Keynes Average = 11.7 per 1,000 households over 5 years.

Neighbour Complaints April 2004 - March 2005

Milton Keynes Council Environmental Health postcoded data on domestic nuisance complaints is aggregated to estate and settlement and expressed per 1,000 dwellings. Milton Keynes Average = 13.3 per 1,000 dwellings.

Council Rented Housing March 2005

Tenure data at estate and settlement is expressed per 1,000 dwellings. Milton Keynes Average = 129.0 per 1,000 dwellings

Violent Crime April 2004 - March 2005

Recorded Violent crime at estate and settlement level is expressed per 1,000 total population. Milton Keynes Average = 25.4 per 1,000 people.

Burglary (Dwellings) April 2004 - March 2005

Recorded Burglary of dwellings at estate and settlement level is expressed per 1,000 dwellings. Milton Keynes Average = 10.6 per 1,000 dwellings.

Criminal Damage April 2004 - March 2005

Recorded Criminal Damage is expressed per 1,000 population at estate and settlement level. Milton Keynes Average = 24.5 per 1,000 people.

Adult Continuing Education April 2004 - March 2005

Postcodes of clients enrolled in Adult Continuing Education courses were aggregated to estate and settlement level and expressed per 1,000 population not enrolled on ACE. Milton Keynes Average = 969.2 per 1,000 people.

HEALTH AND DISABILITY

Disabled Concessionary Fares 2004 - 2005

Postcoded data is aggregated to estate and settlement and expressed per 1,000 population. Milton Keynes Average = 13.3 per 1,000 people. NOTE: these data have been provided as at August 2005, retrospective data are not available.

Disabled Clients of Neighbourhood Services April 2004 - March 2005

Postcoded data from Neighbourhood Services on teams for Learning disability, Physical disability, Mental Health, Duty Team, Joint Elderly and Mental Health, and the Hospital is aggregated to estate and settlement and expressed per 1,000 population. Milton Keynes Average = 5.2 per 1,000 people.

Emergency Admissions 2003 - 2004

The number of Emergency Admissions into hospital are expressed as per 1000 population. Milton Keynes Average = 67.8 per 1,000 people




The Data at Estate/Settlement Level

The information contained in this atlas is derived from the work done for Milton Keynes Council's Social Inclusion Working Group. The profiles at estate and settlement level were prepared to highlight the extent of 'social exclusion' in Milton Keynes and its concentration in particular areas, with a view to targeting areas to improve local services and community networks. The intention is to continue to develop using these indicators, so that the effects of any actions tackling the many aspects of social exclusion can be monitored.

The Social Inclusion Working Group has now been disbanded. A new group is being formed to meet the needs of the Social Inclusion and Health Inequalities framework. The new group will be multi-disciplinary, led jointly by the Primary Care Trust and the Council. 
