Foreword from Dr N. Hicks, Director of Public Health

Neighbourhoods and estates are where people live. They have a profound impact on both people's quality of life and their health and well being. Everyone who is interested working with local communities to help plan and manage services needs to understand those communities. The social atlas brings together a wide range of social and economic indicators that give a quantitative description of estates across Milton Keynes. It provides an up-to-date snap shot of how things are now and gives some indication of what has changed in the past year. And in doing so it has become, together with the MKi observatory, (www.mkiobservatory.org.uk) a 'must-have' essential resource for anyone who wants to understand the fabric of Milton Keynes and the issues faced by communities in different parts of the city.

As well as being a practical tool to help service planning, I believe the Social Atlas is also an important document of record, which chronicles the social and economic changes of this new and exciting city of Milton Keynes.

In summary, the Social Atlas is an important publication that needs to be widely read and used by all those with an interest in understanding the social and economic circumstances of the communities of Milton Keynes. I commend it to you.

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Social Atlas for Milton Keynes 2005/2006

Executive Summary

Although Milton Keynes as a whole is relatively affluent and most people enjoy a good quality of life significant numbers of residents experience disadvantage in one or more categories. In the Social Atlas these are divided into indicators around income; children & education; older people; community factors and health & disability.

Income

On average 186 out of 1,000 population in Milton Keynes get housing or council tax benefit which is a means tested benefit. The highest rate is 552 out of 1,000 in Beanhill.

Children & Education

There are seven indicators in this category covering a diverse range of topics affecting children. They include family referrals to Children's Social Care where the average across Milton Keynes is 22 per 1,000 population but the maximum is 104 out of 1,000 population in Fullers Slade. Numbers of children getting free school meals is a traditional indicator of disadvantage that shows a large variation across estates. The average is 11% of pupils with the highest, 33%, in Tinkers' Bridge. Other indicators include 3 and 4 year olds who do not take up funded nursery places, and children with statements of special educational needs.

As educational attainment has a strong association with future disadvantage, the remaining 3 indicators focus on this. To try to estimate the proportion of young people not going into higher education we look at the proportion of 18-24 year olds not getting student awards. The average across Milton Keynes is 89% but the highest, 98% can be found in Netherfield and Central Milton Keynes. The final indicators are new this year, looking at educational attainment in schools. Firstly, the proportion attaining below level 4 in Key Stage 2 English. Milton Keynes average is 280 per 1,000 pupils, with great variation across estates. The English average is 210 per 1,000 (test only). Secondly, the proportion gaining less than 5 GCSEs at grade A*-C. The Milton Keynes average is 484 per 1,000 pupils, the highest is 1,000 in 7 estates. The English average is 429 per 1,000 pupils.

Older People

On average 78 out of 1,000 pensioners are clients of Older People's Services.

Community Factors

Community factors include those affecting how people feel about their home environment. There are several different factors in this category including domestic fires; categories of recorded crime; tenure; neighbour complaints and a measure of community involvement.

Domestic fires have been found to correlate strongly with disadvantage. Looking over a rolling 5-year period, on average there were 11 fires per 1,000 dwellings in Milton Keynes from 2000 to 2005. The highest was 140 per 1,000 dwellings in Granby. Crime data has been included for violent crime, burglaries and criminal damage. The highest rates of both violent crime and criminal damage occur in Central Milton Keynes because of the high visitor population.

Considering Neighbour complaints to Environmental Health: on average there were 13 complaints per 1,000 population, the highest rate was in Fishermead with 45 complaints per 1,000.

Health & Disability

There are 5 health and disability indicators listed in the grid profiles, although only 4 of these are used in the calculation of the overall rankings. Teenage conceptions: on average there were 49 conceptions per 1,000 girls aged 15 to 19. The numbers are small so the data is averaged over a 2-year time period. Disabled

How estates have changed since previous document

The table below shows the 20 estates with the most difficulties (from a range of indicators) in Milton Keynes. New data includes educational attainment and hospital admissions. Due to policy changes nationally, all pensioners are now eligible for concessionary travel so this has been dropped as an indicator of material disadvantage.

The indicators for which it is possible to make comparisons with the previous document are: -

The range of indicators has changed this year, so the rankings are not directly comparable. The new data were included on the request of the Social Inclusion and Health Inequalities working group to represent more of the causes of inequalities such as educational attainment. Netherfield has consistently been ranked as having significant difficulties as has Beanhill. Fullers Slade, Coffee Hall, Central Milton Keynes and Denbigh East have all moved up some number of places but this may be due to the changes in the indicators used. Greenleys and New Bradwell are among the estates that have moved down the ranking.

Introduction

The purpose of this series of documents is to enable people working towards Social Inclusion to identify:

- the most significant social inclusion issues
- geographic concentrations of need
- the relative severity of social exclusion compared with other areas and the national picture
- a snapshot position
- geographic areas and issues where development of services and initiatives might be focused
- measure change

and to prompt discussion on possible causes of inequality and suggestions for actions to achieve improvement.

The data used are primarily locally collected data, intended to highlight areas with a high need for public services. Earlier work included developing a framework to structure information gathering, along the lines of those used by the government in "Opportunity for All" and by bodies such as the Joseph Rowntree Trust. The framework has the following categories:

- income
- children
- young adults
- adults aged 25 to retirement
- older people
- community factors
- health and disability.

The indicators included this year are different to previous documents. Key changes include:

- Educational attainment data at estate level for Key Stage 2 English and GCSE attainment as there is a strong relationship between poor educational attainment and later disadvantage.
- Nursery school uptake for its association with positive outcomes
- Emergency hospital admissions data, included for the first time last year, plus comparative information on elective hospital admissions.

The ideals restricting choices for indicators are that:-

- they should be capable of being collected at ward and/or below ward level
- they should be commonly available across all local authorities
- they should allow for national comparisons
- they should have an acknowledged relationship with disadvantage.

Useful developments since the first document have been: -

- 1. The setting up of the Office for National Statistics website for the Neighbourhood Statistics Service. Extensive amounts of data, from the 2001 census and other administrative data sources, are available at local level at no cost. The site can be found at www.neighbourhood.statistics.gov.uk
- 2. The development and updating of the Index of Multiple Deprivation, a multi-dimensional indicator available to lower-super output area level, in 2000 and 2004.
- 3. The development of floor targets as measures of authority-wide moves to narrow the gap between deprived areas and the national average
- 4. The development of the Milton Keynes Observatory, a web-based data resource to share, map and visualise data. The web site can be found at: www.mkiobservatory.org.uk

Local Authority Level Data Floor Targets 2006

Floor targets are indicators aimed at helping government and councils to narrow the gap between deprived areas and the national averages in terms of health, education, crime, employment and housing. They will also identify areas where progress is not being made. They will enable all those involved in neighbourhood renewal to identify priority areas monitor progress and compare themselves with others.

The table below outlines how Milton Keynes compares to the national and regional average. Data coloured in red indicates Milton Keynes data is worse than the national average.



Figures from the 2004 Index of Multiple Deprivation indicate that Woughton Ward has more residents who are more likely to rely on benefits, expect much poorer health, have a lower standard of education and suffer from crime than the average person in England.

Eaton Manor also shows up in some of the indicators especially education, skills and training. Sherington also has issues regarding barriers to housing and services.



INCOME


Overall in Milton Keynes a smaller proportion of the population claim income support than for England as a whole. Milton Keynes had a rate of 50 per 1000 population compared to 60 per 1000 in England.

There is significant variation in the rates of income support claimants between the wards in Milton Keynes. Woughton ward maintains having *over twice the national rate* for Income Support Claimants per 1,000 population. Estates covered by this ward include Beanhill, Coffee Hall, Eaglestone, Leadenhall, Netherfield and Tinkers Bridge. Eaton Manor and Campbell Park Wards are also significantly above national average rate of income support claimants.




CHILDREN

In 2005 3,215 Lone Parents families claimed Income Support in Milton Keynes. This is a rate of 23.1 per 1,000 and therefore is slightly higher than that of England as a whole (21.2 per 1,000). There are 9 wards in Milton Keynes which have a higher proportion of lone parents claiming Income Support. Woughton Ward (64.4 per 1,000) is three times the England average and Eaton Manor (54.5 per 1,000), and Campbell Park (38.7 per 1,000) are still exceptionally high.




The 2001 Census included data on a 'language needs indicator'. This showed that Bletchley and Fenny Stratford Ward and Campbell Park Ward had the highest proportion of dependent children who live in a household where English may not be the first language. The Pupil Level Annual Schools Census also collected data on the first language of pupils. Details of this data is shown below and reveals a similar picture.



The graph shows that, 22% (490) of all pupils living in Campbell Park Ward may have a first language other than English. Bletchley and Fenny Stratford also stands out as having a large proportion (19%) of pupils whose first language may not be English. Wolverton (17%) also has a significantly higher proportion of pupils whose first language may not be English.

YOUNG ADULTS

2001 Census data on the number of students, including those living away from home, indicate how wards in Milton Keynes compare.




A significant number Milton Keynes wards fall beneath the MK average (24.9%) for the number of students. Wards with particularly low proportions of students include; Woughton (9.8%), Eaton Manor (12.6%) and Bletchley (15.5%).

Locally available data for 18-24 year olds not getting student awards are interesting. Granby, Netherfield, Central Milton Keynes and Kingsmead are most noticeable.

OLDER PEOPLE

6,600 people aged 60 and over were in households claiming Pension Credit. This is 206.5 per 1,000 population slightly lower than the England average of 214.8 per 1,000.

10 out of 23 wards in Milton Keynes are above the national average with Woughton (394 per 1,000) standing out as significantly higher than the other wards. Furzton, Eaton Manor, and Bradwell Wards also have much higher than average numbers claiming Pension Credit.



The **Older People** indicator we have locally, Clients of the Council's Older People Services data, highlight estates such as Westcroft, Hardmead, Great Linford, and Lathbury.


COMMUNITY INDICATORS

Some data sets are collected locally. These can then be presented at ward level, or at estate level as this is the commonly used geography in Milton Keynes. Estate-level information can help highlight small areas of disadvantage or need. However, it can also have the disadvantage of making a small 'blip' in the data seem more significant than it truly is: it may be just natural variation in the data. Neighbour complaints to Environmental Services are an example of a dataset which can be presented at ward level or at estate level. A ward-level analysis can be seen overleaf, with estate summaries in each estate profile, and also contributing to the overall Social Atlas score and rank.

Other community indicators that can be seen at estate level include information on domestic fires and on crimes. These can be seen presented in the estates section of the publication, and in each estate profile. These also form part of the overall score.


Neighbour Complaints at Ward Level

Neighbour complaints are an important tool for assessing the quality of life enjoyed in a neighbourhood. These are complaints by residents about their neighbours made to the Environmental Health service. Historically, the greatest numbers of complaints are about excessive and untimely noise. The rate of neighbour complaints per 1,000 dwellings shows some large differences when examined at ward level. The rural areas show lower complaints about neighbours, after accounting for the number of dwellings. Olney ward has the lowest number of complaints per 1,000 dwellings; nearby Sherington is also low but has seen an increase from the previous year. This could be a result of the lower housing density in these areas. Campbell Park and Eaton Manor are the wards with consistently high rates of complaints. Stantonbury ward has also seen a high number of complaints this year, a large increase from the previous year. These wards all have around 20 complaints per 1,000 dwellings. Looking at the data for 2 years illustrates that the overall rate of complaints has fallen, with Stantonbury being the area that has shown the largest rise. Bletchley & Fenny Stratford has shown a substantial reduction in complaints.



HEALTH AND DISABILITY

Life expectancy is a focus of national government targets to reduce inequalities in health outcomes. Life expectancy is linked to social circumstances, and despite improvements the gap is large, and in some areas is widening. Specifically by 2010, the target is to reduce the gap in life expectancy at birth, by area, by 10%. Life expectancy at birth does not reflect the life experience of any individual. Instead, it provides a summary of the mortality experience of the individuals living in a particular area, over a period of time. Gaps in life expectancy can be observed between local authority areas. For example, in 2002/2004 a difference of 8.5 years was observed between areas with the highest life expectancy at birth for boys, and areas with the lowest. The gap for girls was 7.9 years. The gaps within these areas can be even wider. The current situation for Milton keynes can be seen from the chart below.



The average life expectancy in Milton Keynes for 2001-2005 was 78.4 years, slightly lower than the previous year but this may be due to statistical fluctuations. The range was 9.4 years. Middleton has the highest life expectancy for persons for the second year in succession with a life expectancy at birth of 81.7 years. Woughton has the lowest life expectancy of 72.3 years.


The life expectancy at birth was 76.5 years for males, range 10.0 years. This is higher than previously with a lower range and is equivalent to the 76.5 years average male life expectancy for England & Wales. Middleton had the highest life expectancy for males for the second year of 80.7 years. Woughton has the lowest life expectancy for males of 70.6 years.

The life expectancy at birth for females in Milton Keynes has fallen slightly to 80.2 years, and the range has risen to 11.5 years. This is significantly below the female life expectancy in England & Wales, 2002/2004 which was 80.8 years although these are not directly comparable because of the different time periods covered. Stantonbury had the highest life expectancy of 85.1 years with Bradwell second with 83.8 years. Woughton again had the lowest at 73.6 years, a fall from the previous year.

There is a reasonably high level of consistency between the rankings of life expectancy (the relative position of wards) for the three most recent calculations. There is some variation due to statistical uncertainty surrounding such small-area calculations which is to be expected.


Nationally available disability benefits data provide us with results at ward level. Milton Keynes has a lower proportion of residents claiming Severe Disability Living Allowance, Incapacity Benefits and Disability Living Allowance than for England as a whole. Woughton ward is consistently higher than the national average for both disability benefits. It has over twice the average Incapacity Benefit/Severe DLA rate and double the average for Disability Living Allowance. Eaton Manor Ward and Campbell Park Ward have higher than the national average in both benefits.



Local **Health and Disability** indicators such as Disabled Concessionary Fares, Physically Disabled Clients, Learning Disabled Clients and Mental Health Clients of Milton Keynes Council are useful at looking at health and disability. They have been useful in pointing out several areas of need, such as Granby, Stacey Bushes, Beanhill, Coffee Hall, and Simpson. These can be seen in the estate indicators section.


As the table on page 15 shows, the Index of Multiple Deprivation 2004 outlined deprivation levels relating to Health and Disability. This is at Super Output Area level which is a sub-division of the ward boundaries effective in 2004. The map opposite shows the rank of Milton Keynes's Super Output Areas (SOAs) compared to other SOA's in England. It clearly shows areas in Woughton ward and on area in Eaton Manor Ward as having the most deprivation relating to health and disability in Milton Keynes.

Health Deprivation and Disability Domain from IMD 2004




This domain from the Index of Multiple Deprivation identifies small geographic units called Super Output Areas (SOAs) with relatively high rates of people who die prematurely or whose quality of life is impaired by poor health or who are disabled, across the whole population. The indicator is made up of:

- 1. Years of Potential Life Lost (1997-2001)
- 2. Comparative Illness and Disability Ratio (2001)
- 3. Measures of emergency admissions to hospital (1999-2002)
- 4. Adults under 60 suffering from mood or anxiety disorders (1997-2002)




Smoking Prevalence estimates by Estate per 1,000 15plus Population*

Definitions and Methods

Describing the source of the data used in the estate profiles and how this has been expressed.

INCOME

Housing/Council Tax Benefit March 2006

Postcoded information on claimants was aggregated to estates/settlements and expressed per 1,000 dwellings. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 186.2 per 1,000 dwellings claim benefit.

CHILDREN

Family Referrals 2005/2006

Counts of families referred to Social Services by estate have been made, and expressed per 1,000 dwellings. Milton Keynes Average = 21.7 per 1,000 dwellings.

Nursery Place Funding Non-uptake 2006

Count of 3 and 4 year olds not in receipt of nursery education funding. Milton Keynes average = 570.2 per 1,000 3 and 4 year olds.

Children with Special Educational Needs (4 to 18 year olds) March 2006

Postcoded data on children statemented with special educational needs is aggregated and expressed per 1,000 4 to 18 year olds. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 34.9 per 1,000 4 to 18 year olds.

Free School Meals March 2006

Postcoded information was aggregated to estates and settlements and expressed per 1,000 pupils. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 109.8 per 1,000 pupils.

Educational attainment 2005

The proportion of eligible pupils attaining BELOW Key Stage 2 level 4+ in English expressed per 1,000. Milton Keynes average: 280.0 per 1,000 pupils.

The proportion of eligible pupils gaining LESS THAN 5 GCSEs at grade A*-C expressed per 1,000. Milton Keynes average: 483.6 per 1,000 pupils.

YOUNG ADULTS

18-24 year olds Not Receiving Student Awards September 2005

Postcoded information is aggregated and expressed per 1,000 18 to 24 year olds. Milton Keynes Average = 851.3 per 1,000 18 to 24 year olds.

OLDER PEOPLE

Older People Clients of Neighbourhood Services April 2005 - March 2006

Postcoded data on clients is aggregated and expressed per 1,000 pensioners. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 78.1 per 1,000 pensioners.

COMMUNITY FACTORS

Domestic Fires Data April 2000 to March 2005

Bucks Fire and Rescue Services postcoded data on domestic fires is aggregated to estates and settlements and expressed per 1,000 households. Milton Keynes Average = 11.2 per 1,000 households over 5 years.

Violent Crime April 2005 - March 2006

Recorded Violent crime at estate and settlement level is expressed per 1,000 total population. Milton Keynes Average = 27.3 per 1,000 people.

Burglary (Dwellings) April 2005 - March 2006

Recorded Burglary of dwellings at estate and settlement level is expressed per 1,000 dwellings. Milton Keynes Average = 10.6 per 1,000 dwellings.

Criminal Damage April 2005 - March 2006

Recorded Criminal Damage is expressed per 1,000 population at estate and settlement level. Milton Keynes Average = 23.6 per 1,000 people.

Social Rented Housing March 2006

MKC Council and Registered Social Landlored rented stock at estate and settlement is expressed per 1,000 dwellings. Milton Keynes Average = 198.5 per 1,000 dwellings

Neighbour Complaints April 2005 - March 2006

Milton Keynes Council Environmental Health postcoded data on domestic nuisance complaints is aggregated to estate and settlement and expressed per 1,000 dwellings. Milton Keynes Average = 13.4 per 1,000 dwellings.

Adult Continuing Education April 2005 - March 2006

Postcodes of clients enrolled in Adult Continuing Education courses were aggregated to estate and settlement level and expressed per 1,000 population not enrolled on ACE. Milton Keynes Average = 973.4 per 1,000 people.

HEALTH AND DISABILITY

Teenage Conceptions (Under 20 year olds) 2004/2006 annualised.

Births and terminations data to teenage girls aged under 20 are aggregated to estate and settlement and expressed as an annual average per 1,000 15 to 19 year old girls. Estates and settlements are then ranked according to this figure. Milton Keynes Average = 49.2 per 1,000 15 to 19 year old girls. Concerns over data volatility mean that extreme caution should be used in the use of this indicator.

Disabled Concessionary Fares 2005 - 2006

Postcoded data is aggregated to estate and settlement and expressed per 1,000 population. Milton Keynes Average = 11.7 per 1,000 people.

Disabled Clients of Neighbourhood Services April 2005 - March 2006

Postcoded data from Neighbourhood Services on teams for Learning disability, Physical disability, Mental Health, Duty Team, Joint Elderly and Mental Health, and the Hospital is aggregated to estate and settlement and expressed per 1,000 population. Milton Keynes Average = 5.2 per 1,000 people.

HEALTH AND DISABILITY

Emergency Admissions 2004 - 2006

The number of Emergency Admissions into hospital are expressed as per 1,000 population. Milton Keynes Average = 191.6 per 1,000 people.

Non Emergency Admissions 2004-6


The number of Non Emergency Admissions into hospital are expressed as per 1,000 population. Milton Keynes Average = 151 per 1,000 people.

Population Denominators - Population figures used in this publication are estimates from the 2005/6 Population Bulletin. Age specific populations are estimates based on postcoded figures from Bucks Health Authority Patient Registration data from the Sept 2006 patient register, these figures were then adjusted to match the 2005/6 Population Bulletin figures.

The Data at Estate/Settlement Level

The information contained in this atlas is derived from the work done for Milton Keynes Council's Social Inclusion Working Group. The profiles at estate and settlement level were prepared to highlight the extent of 'social exclusion' in Milton Keynes and its concentration in particular areas, with a view to targeting areas to improve local services and community networks. The intention is to continue to develop using these indicators, so that the effects of any actions tackling the many aspects of social exclusion can be monitored.

The Social Inclusion Working Group has now been disbanded. A new group is being formed to meet the needs of the Social Inclusion and Health Inequalities framework. The new group will be multi-disciplinary, led jointly by the Primary Care Trust and the Council.
