

Whaddon Ward 2011 Census Profile



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Population

- The population of Whaddon in 2011 was 8,460.
- Whaddon experienced a population decline between 2001 and 2011. The population decreased by 140 people (-1.6%) to 8,460 between 2001 and 2011.
- Whaddon had an older age profile than the Milton Keynes average. The average age in Whaddon was 41 compared with 35 for Milton Keynes. It had a larger percentage in the older age groups; 18.0% were aged over 65 compared with 11.1% in Milton Keynes.
- The number of people aged 60-64 grew by 39.3% from 420 people in 2001 to 590 people in 2011. In contrast the number of people aged 5-24 and 30-59 decreased in size.
- 17.0% of the Whaddon population were from a black and minority ethnic group. This compares to 10.5% in 2001 and 26.1% for Milton Keynes as a whole.
- The Black African ethnic group had the highest growth in Whaddon between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 it accounted for 0.6% of the population by 2011 it accounted for 2.5%.
- 11.3% of the population in Whaddon were born outside of the UK. This is significantly lower than Milton Keynes (18.5%).

Health

- 600 residents said their day to day activities were limited a lot because of health issues. This is 7.1% of the population compared with 6.4% for Milton Keynes.
- 930 residents in Whaddon provided some unpaid care a week. This is 11.0% of the population compared with 8.8% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

Housing

- Whaddon had a smaller percentage of households with dependent children than Milton Keynes (31.2% compared to 35.0%).
- The percentage of one person households is smaller in Whaddon (24.4%) than in Milton Keynes as a whole (25.9%).
- Whaddon had a small average household size. It had an average of 2.4 people per household compared with 2.5 in Milton Keynes.
- Whaddon had a larger percentage of semi-detached properties than Milton Keynes as a whole (38.0% compared to 28.1%).

- Whaddon had a higher percentage of owner occupied households and a smaller percentage living in social rented other than from the council and private rented accommodation than Milton Keynes as a whole.
- The percentage of households living in private rented accommodation in Whaddon increased from 4.6% in 2001 to 11.6% in 2011.

Transport

• There were 220 more cars or vans in Whaddon households in 2011 compared with 2001. This is a 5.1% increase compared to the population decrease of 1.6%.

Education

- Levels of qualifications in Whaddon were significantly lower than the Milton Keynes average. 24.2% had no qualifications compared with 18.0% in Milton Keynes.
- Although qualifications were lower than Milton Keynes as a whole, levels of qualifications in the ward increased considerably since 2001. In 2001 29.3% of the population had no qualifications by 2011 this had decreased to 24.2%.

Economic

- A smaller percentage (65.7%) of Whaddon residents aged 16-74 were in employment compared with Milton Keynes (68%).
- There was a fall from 49.0% to 43.5% between 2001 and 2011 in the percentage of the 16-74 year old population working as full time employees in Whaddon.
- 83.1% of Whaddon residents in employment were employed in the service sector compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole. The wholesale and retail trade industrial sector was the largest employer of Whaddon residents.
- Residents in Whaddon were more likely to be classified in intermediate occupations, lower supervisory and technical occupations, semi-routine occupations and routine occupations socio-economic categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.

2. Introduction

This document provides a profile of Whaddon Ward from data released via the 2011 Census. The profile includes data for the ward and comparisons to Milton Keynes and to the 2001 Census figures.

3. Population Size and Age Structure

Whaddon experienced a population decline between 2001 and 2011. The population decreased by 140 people (1.6%) to 8,460 between 2001 and 2011.

In 2011 the population of Whaddon was 8,460. The Whaddon population fell by 140 people; this is a decrease of 1.6% compared with a 17% increase for Milton Keynes as a whole. Out of the 23 wards in Milton Keynes it had the 2nd highest population decline between 2001 and 2011.

Whaddon had an older age profile than the Milton Keynes average. The average age in Whaddon was 41 compared with 35 for Milton Keynes.

Table 2 shows the age structure of Whaddon compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the ward had a higher percentage in the 45+ year old age groups. In Whaddon in 2011 18.2% of the population were aged under 15 compared with 21% in Milton Keynes. 18.0% of the population were aged 65+ compared with 11.1% in Milton Keynes.

Whaddon had the second highest percentage (9.9%) of 65-74 years olds of all wards in Milton Keynes.


* The rank is of the % figure and ranked out of all 23 wards in Milton Keynes, with 1 being the highest % and 23 being the lowest %.

The 60-64 year old age group had a high growth rate between 2001 and 2011 in Whaddon.

Graph 2 shows the change in age structure between 2001 and 2011. It outlines the 60-64 had a high growth rate. The number of people aged 60-64 grew by 39.3% from 420 people in 2001 to 590 people in 2011.

Other age groups that grew significantly include the 85-89 (43.8%) and 75-84 (25.3%) age groups. The number of people aged 0 to 4 also increased significantly; it increased by 14.2% from 510 to 580 people.

The 5-24 and 30-59 year old ages group declined in size between 2001 and 2011.

4. Ethnicity

Overall 17.0% of the population in Whaddon were from a black and minority ethnic group compared with 26.1% in Milton Keynes.


Table 3 shows the number of people in each ethnic group in Whaddon compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the ward had the largest percentage of White Irish residents of all wards in Milton Keynes. 140 people classified themselves as White Irish; this is 1.6% of the population compared with 1.0% in Milton Keynes.

The largest black and minority ethnic group in Whaddon was White Other. 3.2% of the population in classified themselves as White Other compared with 5.1% in Milton Keynes.

The population is becoming more ethnically diverse. In 2001 10.5% of the population were from a black and minority ethnic group compared with 17.0% in 2011.

Graph 3 outlines that there were a number of ethnic groups in Whaddon which experienced very high population growth between 2001 and 2011. The Black African ethnic group had the highest growth in Whaddon between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 it accounted for 0.6% of the population by 2011 it accounted for 2.5%, this is an increase from 50 people to 210. Other ethnic groups which increased significantly between 2001 and 2011 include Mixed (1.3% to 3.0%) and White Other (2.0% to 3.2%).

11.3% of the population in Whaddon were born outside of the UK. This is significantly lower than Milton Keynes as a whole (18.5%).

11.3% of the population in Whaddon were born outside of the UK, this is a total of 955 people. Table 4 shows the country of birth for Whaddon residents compared with Milton Keynes.

1.4% of the Whaddon population were born in Ireland and 1.7% were born in EU member states as at March 2001. 90 people where born in 2001-2011 EU accession countries; this is 1.1% of the population significantly lower than Milton Keynes as a whole (2.5%). 600 people (7.1%) were born outside of the EU, significantly lower than the Milton Keynes figure of 13.0%.

The number of Whaddon residents born outside of the UK increased from 680 people to 955 between 2001 and 2011.

120 people living in Whaddon had been living in the UK for less than five years.

1.5% of the total Whaddon population had lived in the UK for less than five years, significantly lower than Milton Keynes as a whole (5.4%).

6. Household Language

2.8% of households in Whaddon had no adult who had English as their main language compared with 6.4% in Milton Keynes.

94.3% of households in Whaddon had all adults in the household with English as their main language and 97.2% had at least one adult with English as their main language.

100 households had no adult who had English as their main language. This is 2.8% of the population.

7. Religion

59.1% of the Whaddon population stated they were Christian, 2.7% Muslim and 1.3% Hindu. 30.3% of the population in Whaddon stated they had no religion.


Table 7 shows the number of people in each religious group in Whaddon compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the largest religious group in Milton Keynes was Christian which accounted for 59.1% of the population, this is higher than Milton Keynes as a whole (52.8%).

230 people in the ward identified themselves as Muslim this is 2.7% of the population compared with 4.8% in Milton Keynes.

Graph 4 outlines the changes in religion in Whaddon between 2001 and 2011. It shows that there was a decline in the percentage of the population that stated they were Christian (69.4% to 59.1%) and an increase in the percentage that stated they had no religion (17.7% to 30.3%) and Muslim (1.1% to 2.7%).

8. Health

7.1% of residents in Whaddon said their day to day activities were limited a lot because of health issues. This compares to 6.4% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

The 2011 Census asked two questions on the health of residents. Both questions highlight that a slightly larger percentage of the population in Whaddon felt that they had health issues when compared to Milton Keynes.

1. Are your day-to-day activities limited because of a health problem or disability which has lasted, or is expected to last, at least 12 months?

600 people stated their day-today activities were limited a lot due to health; this is 7.1% of population compared with 6.4% in Milton Keynes. This is the eighth highest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes. In total 17.1% of residents in Whaddon stated they were limited a lot or a little. This compares to 13.9% in Milton Keynes.

2. How is your health in general?

380 respondents in Whaddon felt their general health was bad or very bad. This is 4.5% of the population compared with 4.1% of the Milton Keynes population. 81.8% of residents in the ward felt they had good or very good health compared with 85.1% in Milton Keynes.

The 2011 Census questions on health were different to the 2001 Census and therefore can not be directly compared.

Health status is very strongly correlated to age. Residents in the older age groups tend to be less healthy than younger age groups. Therefore to make robust comparisons between areas health by age is needed.

9. Carers

930 residents in Whaddon provided some unpaid care a week. This is 11.0% of the population compared with 8.8% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

The 2011 Census asked respondents if they provided some unpaid care each week to others either because of a long term disability or old age. The results show that around 930 people in Whaddon provided some unpaid care. This is 11.0% of the population, compared to the Milton Keynes figure of 8.8%.

Table 10 shows the number of hours of unpaid care residents undertook each week. It outlines that around 360 people undertook more than 20 hours of unpaid care each week with 220 of those undertaking more than 50 hours.



The number of Whaddon residents providing unpaid care increased by 160 people (21.4%) between 2001 and 2011.

The number of Whaddon residents providing unpaid care grew from 770 in 2001 to 930 in 2011. As a percentage of the Milton Keynes population it increased from 8.9% in 2001 to 11.0% in 2011.

Graph 5 outlines that those that were providing unpaid care were doing so with greater hours. 4.3% of the population provided unpaid care for 20 or more hours a week compared with 2.9% in 2001.

10. Living Arrangements

Whaddon had a higher percentage of residents living in a married couple than Milton Keynes as a whole.

4,190 residents aged 16 and over in Whaddon were living as a couple this is 61.8% compared to 60.4% for Milton Keynes. 1,450 (21.5%) residents were single (never married) whilst 460 people (6.8%) were widowed.

11. Household Composition

Whaddon had a lower percentage of households with dependent children than Milton Keynes as a whole.

There were 3,445 households in Whaddon in 2011. 440 (12.7%) of these households were one person pensioner household, this compares to 8.7% for Milton Keynes as a whole. In total 24.4% of households in the ward were one person households compared with 25.9% for Milton Keynes.

In total 1,080 (31.2%) households in Whaddon had dependent children this compares to 35.0% in Milton Keynes.

280 households, or 8.2%, in Whaddon were lone parent households with dependent children. This compares to 8.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

The percentage of households with dependent children in Whaddon decreased from 33.2% in 2001 to 31.2% in 2011.

Table 13 outlines how household composition changed between 2001 and 2011. The percentage of households with dependent children fell from 33.2% of households to 31.2%.

The number of lone parent households with dependent children increased from 230 to 280 between 2001 and 2011 as a percentage it increased from 6.9% to 8.2%.

12. Rooms and Bedrooms

The ward had a smaller average household size to Milton Keynes. It had an average of 2.4 people per household compared with 2.5 in Milton Keynes.

The ward's average household size of 2.4 was the ninth lowest of all 23 wards in Milton Keynes. The average household size reduced from 2.5 to 2.4 between 2001 and 2011.

Whaddon had a similar number of rooms per household than Milton Keynes. There was an average of 5.6 rooms per household compared with 5.5 in Milton Keynes.

120 households in Whaddon lived in over occupied accommodation.

The 2011 Census also estimates the number of households with a high occupancy rating. An occupancy rating of -1 implies that a household had one less room/bedroom than required. Table 15 shows that Whaddon had around 120 households (3.6%) which were over occupied in terms of bedrooms. This is lower than the Milton Keynes figure of 5.1%.

Over occupancy in terms of rooms stayed roughly the same between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 160 (4.9%) households had an occupancy rating of -1 or less, in 2011 it had remained at 160 residents but fallen to 4.8%.

13. Accommodation Type

A larger percentage of dwellings were classified as semi-detached dwellings and a smaller percentage classified as flats in Whaddon than Milton Keynes as a whole.

There were 3,510 dwellings in Whaddon in 2011. The 2011 Census asked residents what type of dwelling they lived in. Whaddon had a larger percentage of semi-detached properties than Milton Keynes as a whole (38.0% compared to 28.1%).

A smaller percentage (7.4%) of dwellings in the ward were flats compared with Milton Keynes (16.2%).



A growing percentage of dwellings in the ward were flats. 6.6% of dwellings in the ward were flats in 2001, this compares to 7.4% in 2011.

Overall the number of dwellings in Whaddon grew slightly from 3,450 in 2001 to 3,510 in 2011. This is an increase of 60 dwellings or 1.8%.

The number of flats in Whaddon grew by 13.1% between 2001 and 2011 from 230 to 260 in 2011. Graph 6 outlines that the percentage of dwelling which were flats increased from 6.6% in 2001 to 7.4% in 2011; this is a trend which is observed nationally.

The percentage of houses/bungalows in Whaddon decreased from 93.3% of all dwellings to 92.6%.

14. Tenure

30.5% of households own their dwelling outright. This compares to 21.5% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

Overall 68.0% of households in Whaddon lived in owner occupied properties; this is higher than the figure for Milton Keynes as a whole of 57.7%.

A higher percentage of households lived in council rented accommodation in Whaddon than Milton Keynes. 545 households (15.8%) lived in council rented accommodation compared to 11.0% in Milton Keynes.

Whaddon had the smallest percentage of households in other social rented accommodation of all wards in Milton Keynes. There were just 30 households in social rented housing other than from the council accounting for 1.0% of households compared with 7.1% in Milton Keynes. 400 households were in private rented accommodation (including living rent free); this is 11.6% of households compared with 18.3% in Milton Keynes.



The percentage of households living in private rented accommodation in Whaddon increased from 4.6% in 2001 to 11.6% in 2011.

Between 2001 and 2011 the number of households in Whaddon living in private rented accommodation increased by 157% from 155 households to 400. It increased from 4.6% of all households in 2001 to 11.6% in 2011.

The number of households living in social rented accommodation decreased in percentage from 19.1% to 16.8%.

There was a large decrease in the percentage of households living in owner occupied properties in Whaddon from 72.8% in 2001 to 68.0% in 2011. The percentage of households in shared ownership increased from 3.4% to 3.7%.

16. Car or Van Availability

18.8% of households in Whaddon had no cars or vans in the household. This is similar to Milton Keynes as a whole (18.9%).


In total in 2011 there were 4,550 cars or vans in Whaddon compared with 4,330 in 2001. However 650 households in the ward had no car or van. This is 18.8% of all households, similar to Milton Keynes as a whole (18.9%).

18. Qualifications and Students

Levels of qualifications in Whaddon were significantly lower than the Milton Keynes average. 24.2% had no qualifications compared with 18.0% in Milton Keynes.

Table 20 shows the highest level of qualifications for residents aged 16+. It outlines that roughly 1,650 people aged 16+ in Whaddon had no qualifications. This is 24.2% of the population and is higher than Milton Keynes (18.0%).

About 1,290 people aged 16+ in the ward had a degree or higher qualification. This is 18.9% of the population, lower than the Milton Keynes average of 28.2%. It had the fourth lowest percentage of people with level 4 qualifications of all wards in Milton Keynes.

17.8% of residents aged 16+ had a level 2 qualification this is the third highest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes.



Levels of qualifications in Whaddon increased significantly since 2001.

Although qualifications were lower than Milton Keynes as a whole, levels of qualifications in the ward increased considerably since 2001. Graph 9 outlines how levels of qualifications changed since 2001. In 2001 12.5% of residents aged 16+ had a degree or higher, by 2011 this had increased to 18.9%. In 2001 29.3% of the population had no qualifications by 2011 this had decreased to 24.2%.

Whaddon had a smaller percentage of students aged 18+ than Milton Keynes.

Table 21 shows that there were 150 people aged 18 and over in full time education resident in the ward. This is 2.2% of the population, lower than the Milton Keynes average of 3.5%.

19. Economic Activity

A smaller percentage (65.7%) of Whaddon residents aged 16-74 were in employment compared with Milton Keynes (68%).

Table 22 outlines that the population aged 16-74 can be broken down into two broad categories:

1. Economically Active: People that were in work or looking and available for work.

4,470 people in the Whaddon were economically active. This is 72.7% of the 16-74 year old population smaller than the Milton Keynes figure of 75.9%. The percentage of the population working as full time employees is lower in Whaddon compared with Milton Keynes as a whole. 2,670 residents in the ward were full time employees; this is 43.5% of the 16-74 year old population lower than the Milton Keynes average of 46.3%. 14.5% of Whaddon residents aged 16-74 were part time employees this is the second highest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes.

There were 280 unemployed people in Whaddon which accounted for 4.5% of the population, higher than the Milton Keynes rate of 4.8%.

2. Economically Inactive: People that were not in work and were not looking and available for work.

Whaddon had a larger percentage of the 16-74 population who were economically inactive. 27.3% of the ward's 16-74 population were economically inactive compared with 24.1% in Milton Keynes as a whole, this mainly due to a larger percentage of the 16-74 year old population being retired. 15.6% of 16-74 year old population were retired compared with 10.3% in Milton Keynes. 3.7% of 16-74 year old population were looking after home or family compared with 4.6% in Milton Keynes.



There was a fall in the percentage of 16-74 year old population working as full time employees in Whaddon.

Graph 10 outlines that the percentage of the 16-74 population employed as full time employees decreased from 49.0% in 2001 to 43.5% in 2011. However, there was an increase in the percentage of people in part time employment and self employment which offsets this decrease to some degree. This is a trend experienced nationally.

The percentage of people who were unemployed increased from 2.4% to 4.5%, whilst the percentage of people who were economically inactive increased from 26.3% to 27.3% between 2001 and 2011.

Economic activity is strongly correlated to age. Middle aged people tend to be more economically active than younger people (who may be students) and older people (who were more likely to be retired etc). Therefore to make robust comparisons between areas economic activity by age is needed.

20. Hours Worked


Almost three quarters of Whaddon residents in employment worked full time hours whilst a quarter worked part time.

The 2011 Census asked those in employment how many hours they worked a week. Table 23 outlines that in total 1,120 the ward's residents worked part time hours this is 27.0%, higher than the Milton Keynes average of 24.7%.

21. Industry

83.1% of Whaddon residents were employed in the service sector compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

3,460 Whaddon residents were employed in the service sector. This is 83.1% of employment compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole. A larger percentage of residents were employed in the manufacturing sector than Milton Keynes as a whole. 370 Whaddon residents were employed in the manufacturing sector; this is 8.9% of those in employment.

The wholesale and retail trade industrial sector was the largest employer of Whaddon residents.

Table 24 provides more detail on the industry of employment in Whaddon and Milton Keynes. It shows that the wholesale and retail trade was the largest employer of residents in the ward. 900 residents were employed in this sector; this is 21.6% of people in employment compared with 20.6% in Milton Keynes. Education, health and social work and public administration, defence and compulsory social security employs 1,080 people (26.0%).

The wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles/cycles, manufacturing, transport and storage, construction were larger in Whaddon than Milton Keynes as a whole. The professional, scientific and technical activities, information and communication and finance and insurance activities were in smaller proportions compared with Milton Keynes.

22. Occupation

8.3% of residents in Whaddon were employed in manager, director and senior official occupations and 13.1% in elementary occupations.

A lower percentage of employees (8.3%) were employed in the managerial occupations in Whaddon compared with Milton Keynes as a whole (10.9%). 550 residents were employed in elementary occupations. This is 13.1% of those in employment and is higher than the Milton Keynes average of 12.3%.


Whaddon had the third highest percentage of residents in employment in caring, leisure and other service occupations and administrative and secretarial occupations of all wards in Milton Keynes.

The largest increase in employment between 2001 and 2011 in Whaddon occurred in professional occupations the largest decrease occurred in managers, directors and senior officials.

Graph 12 outlines that the largest increase in employment between 2001 and 2011 in Whaddon occurred in professional occupations. 7.8% of those in employment in 2001 were employed in professional occupations by 2011 this increased to 12.4%. The largest decrease occurred in managers, directors and senior officials from 14.0% to 8.3%.

23. National Statistics – Socio-Economic Classification

Residents in Whaddon were more likely to be classified in intermediate occupations, lower supervisory and technical occupations, semi-routine occupations and routine occupations socio-economic categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.

510 residents aged 16-74 in the ward were in the higher managerial and professional category. This is 8.4% of the population compared with 12.2% in Milton Keynes. Whaddon also had a smaller percentage of people in the lower managerial, administrative and professional occupation category.

Whaddon had a higher percentage of residents in the intermediate occupations, lower supervisory and technical occupations, semi-routine occupations and routine occupation categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.
