Wolverton Ward 2011 Census Profile



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1. Executive Summary

Population

- The population of Wolverton in 2011 was 15,600.
- The population grew by 2,055 people between 2001 and 2011. This is a 15.2% increase, the 10th highest growth rate of all wards in Milton Keynes.
- Wolverton had a younger age profile than the Milton Keynes average. The average age in Wolverton was 32 compared with 35 for Milton Keynes.
- Wolverton had the second highest percentage (6.4%) of 20-24 years olds of all wards in Milton Keynes
- The highest growth occurred in the 90+ year old age group. The number of people aged 90+ grew by 76.9% from 40 people in 2001 to 70 people in 2011.
- 25.3% of the Wolverton population were from a black and minority ethnic group. This compares to 12.8% in 2001 and 26.1% for Milton Keynes as a whole.
- The Other Asian ethnic group had the highest growth in Wolverton between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 it accounted for 0.3% of the population by 2011 it accounted for 2.7%, this is an increase from 40 people to 420.
- 16.4% of the population in Wolverton were born outside of the UK. This is lower than Milton Keynes (18.5%).

Health

- 1,040 residents said their day to day activities were limited a lot because of health issues. This is 6.7% of the population compared with 6.4% for Milton Keynes.
- 1,335 residents in Wolverton provided some unpaid care a week. This is 8.6% of the population compared with 8.8% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

Housing

- The percentage of one person households is larger in Wolverton (28.4%) than in Milton Keynes as a whole (25.9%).
- The ward had the same average household size as Milton Keynes. It had an average of 2.5 people per household.
- Wolverton had a larger percentage of terraced properties than Milton Keynes as a whole (48.7% compared to 27.4%).
- A growing percentage of dwellings in the ward were flats. 15.0% of dwellings in the ward were flats in 2001, this compares to 20.2% in 2011.

- A higher percentage of households were living in the council rented accommodation in Wolverton than Milton Keynes. 1,090 households (17.4%) lived in council rented accommodation compared to 11.0% in Milton Keynes.
- The percentage of households living in private rented accommodation in Wolverton increased from 9.3% in 2001 to 19.7% in 2011.

Transport

• 25.5% of households in Wolverton had no cars or vans in the household. This is the fifth highest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes.

Education

- Levels of qualifications in Wolverton were significantly lower than the Milton Keynes average. 22.1% had no qualifications compared with 18.0% in Milton Keynes.
- Although qualifications were lower than Milton Keynes as a whole, levels of qualifications in the ward increased considerably since 2001. In 2001 14.2% of residents aged 16+ had a degree or higher, by 2011 this had increased to 22.7%.

Economic

- A smaller percentage (65.1%) of Wolverton residents aged 16-74 were in employment compared with Milton Keynes (68%).
- There was a fall from 49.4% to 44.8% between 2001 and 2011 in the percentage of the 16-74 year old population working as full time employees in Wolverton.
- 84.7% of Wolverton residents in employment were employed in the service sector compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole. The wholesale and retail trade industrial sector was the largest employer of Wolverton residents.
- Residents in Wolverton were more likely to be classified in the semi-routine occupations, routine occupations and never worked and long-term unemployed socio-economic categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.

2. Introduction

3. Population Size and Age Structure

Wolverton experienced an average population increase between 2001 and 2011 compared with Milton Keynes as a whole. The population increased by 2,055 people (15.2%) to 15,600 between 2001 and 2011.

In 2011 the population of Wolverton was 15,600. The Wolverton population rose by 2,055 people; this is an increase of 15.2% compared with a 17% increase for Milton Keynes as a whole. Out of the 23 wards in Milton Keynes it had the tenth highest population increase between 2001 and 2011.

Wolverton had a younger age profile than the Milton Keynes average. The average age in Wolverton was 32 compared with 35 for Milton Keynes.

Table 2 shows the age structure of Wolverton compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the ward had a higher percentage in the younger age groups. In Wolverton in 2011 22.6% of the population were aged under 15 compared with 21% in Milton Keynes. 10.1% of the population were aged 65+ compared with 11.1% in Milton Keynes.

Wolverton had the second highest percentage (6.4%) of 20-24 years olds of all wards in Milton Keynes.



The highest growth rate between 2001 and 2011 in Wolverton occurred in the 90+ year old age group.

Graph 2 shows the change in age structure between 2001 and 2011. It outlines that the highest growth occurred in the 90+ year old age group. The number of people aged 90+ grew by 76.9% from 40 people in 2001 to 70 people in 2011.

The second highest growth occurred in the 60-64 year old age group. The number of people aged 60-64 grew by 48.9% from 485 people in 2001 to 720 people in 2011. The 0-4 year old age group also grew significantly; it increased by 48.3% from 980 to 1,450 people.

4. Ethnicity

Overall 25.3% of the population in Wolverton were from a black and minority ethnic group compared with 26.1% in Milton Keynes.

Table 3 shows the number of people in each ethnic group in Wolverton compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the Ward had the largest percentage of Pakistani residents of all wards in Milton Keynes. 970 people classified themselves as Pakistani; this is 6.2% of the population compared with 1.5% in Milton Keynes. A quarter (25.2%) of all Pakistani residents in Milton Keynes live in Wolverton ward.

The second largest black and minority ethnic group in Wolverton is White Other. 4.0% of the population in classified themselves as White Other compared with 5.1% in Milton Keynes.



The population is becoming more ethnically diverse. In 2001 12.8% of the population were from a black and minority ethnic group compared with 25.3% in 2011.

Graph 3 outlines that there were a number of ethnic groups in Wolverton which experienced very high population growth between 2001 and 2011. The Other Asian ethnic group had the highest growth in Wolverton between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 it accounted for 0.3% of the population by 2011 it accounted for 2.7%, this is an increase from 40 people to 420. Other ethnic groups which increased significantly between 2001 and 2011 include Pakistani (3.5% to 6.2%), Black African (1.3% to 4.0%) and Bangladeshi (0.3% to 0.9%).

5. Country of Birth

16.4% of the population in Wolverton were born outside of the UK. This is lower than Milton Keynes as a whole (18.5%).

16.4% of the population in Wolverton were born outside of the UK, this is a total of 2,560 people. Table 4 shows the country of birth for Wolverton residents compared with Milton Keynes.

0.6% of the Wolverton population were born in Ireland and 1.9% were born in EU member states as at March 2001. 320 people where born in 2001-2011 EU accession countries; this is 2.1% of the population lower than Milton Keynes as a whole (2.5%). 1,840 people (11.8%) were born outside of the EU, lower than the Milton Keynes figure of 13.0%.

The number of Wolverton residents born outside of the UK increased from 870 people to 2,560 between 2001 and 2011.

690 people living in Wolverton had been living in the UK for less than five years.

4.4% of the total Wolverton population had lived in the UK for less than five years, significantly lower than Milton Keynes as a whole (5.4%).

6. Household Language

6.1% of households in Wolverton had no adult who had English as their main language compared with 6.4% in Milton Keynes.

88.5% of households in Wolverton had all adults in the household with English as their main language and 93.9% had at least one adult with English as their main language. 380 households had no adult who had English as their main language. This is 6.1% of the population.

7. Religion

46.6% of the Wolverton population stated they were Christian and 10.0% Muslim. 35.0% of the population in Wolverton stated they had no religion.


Table 7 shows the number of people in each religious group in Wolverton compared with Milton Keynes. It outlines that the largest religious group in Milton Keynes was Christian which accounted for 46.6% of the population; this is the lowest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes. 35.0% of the population stated they had no religion; this is the highest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes.

1,555 people in the ward identified themselves as Muslim this is 10.0% of the population compared with 4.8% in Milton Keynes.

Graph 4 outlines the changes in religion in Wolverton between 2001 and 2011. It shows that there was a decline in the percentage of the population that stated they were Christian (62.5% to 46.6%) and an increase in the percentage that stated they had no religion (23.6% to 35.0%) and Muslim (4.4% to 10.0%).

8. Health

6.7% of residents in Wolverton said their day to day activities were limited a lot because of health issues. This compares to 6.4% in Milton Keynes.

The 2011 Census asked two questions on the health of residents. Both questions highlight that a slightly larger percentage of the population in Wolverton felt that they had health issues when compared to Milton Keynes.

1. Are your day-to-day activities limited because of a health problem or disability which has lasted, or is expected to last, at least 12 months?

1,040 people stated their day-today activities were limited a lot due to health; this is 6.7% of population compared with 6.4% in Milton Keynes. This is the 11th highest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes. In total 14.6% of residents in Wolverton stated they were limited a lot or a little. This compares to 13.9% in Milton Keynes.

2. How is your health in general?

730 respondents in Wolverton felt their general health was bad or very bad. This is 4.7% of the population compared with 4.1% of the Milton Keynes population. 83.3% of residents in the ward felt they had good or very good health compared with 85.1% in Milton Keynes.

The 2011 Census questions on health were different to the 2001 Census and therefore can not be directly compared.

Health status is very strongly correlated to age. Residents in the older age groups tend to be less healthy than younger age groups. Therefore to make robust comparisons between areas health by age is needed.

9. Carers

1,335 residents in Wolverton provided some unpaid care a week. This is 8.6% of the population compared with 8.8% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

The 2011 Census asked respondents if they provided some unpaid care each week to others either because of a long term disability or old age. The results show that 1,335 people in Wolverton provided some unpaid care. This is 8.6% of the population, compared to the Milton Keynes figure of 8.8%.

Table 10 shows the number of hours of unpaid care residents undertook each week. It outlines that around 510 people undertook more than 20 hours of unpaid care each week with 320 of those undertaking more than 50 hours.



The number of Wolverton residents providing unpaid care increased by 150 people (13.0%) between 2001 and 2011.

The number of Wolverton residents providing unpaid care grew from 1,180 in 2001 to 1,335 in 2011. As a percentage of the Milton Keynes population it decreased slightly from 8.7% in 2001 to 8.6% in 2011.

Graph 5 outlines that those that were providing unpaid care were doing so with greater hours. 3.3% of the population provided unpaid care for 20 or more hours a week compared with 3.0% in 2001.

10. Living Arrangements

Wolverton had a lower percentage of residents living in a couple than Milton Keynes as a whole.

6,650 residents aged 16 and over in Wolverton were living as a couple this is 56.1% compared to 60.4% for Milton Keynes. 3,120 (26.3%) residents were single (never married) whilst 890 people (7.5%) were divorced.

11. Household Composition

Wolverton had a higher percentage of single person households than Milton Keynes as a whole.

There were 6,280 households in Wolverton in 2011. 600 (9.5%) of these households were one person pensioner household, this compares to 8.7% for Milton Keynes as a whole. In total 28.4% of households in the ward were one person households compared with 25.9% for Milton Keynes.

In total 2,170 (34.6%) households in Wolverton had dependent children this compares to 35.0% in Milton Keynes.

615 households, or 9.8%, in Wolverton were lone parent households with dependent children. This compares to 8.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

The percentage of households with dependent children in Wolverton increased from 33.7% in 2001 to 34.6% in 2011.

Table 13 outlines how household composition changed between 2001 and 2011. The percentage of households with dependent children rose from 33.7% of households to 34.6%.

The number of lone parent households with dependent children increased from 480 to 615 between 2001 and 2011 as a percentage it increased from 8.7% to 9.8%.

12. Rooms and Bedrooms

The ward had the same average household size to Milton Keynes. It had an average of 2.5 people per household compared with 2.5 in Milton Keynes.

The ward's average household size of 2.5 was the eleventh lowest of all 23 wards in Milton Keynes. The average household size remained the same between 2001 and 2011.

Wolverton had a smaller number of rooms per household than Milton Keynes. There was an average of 5.1 rooms per household compared with 5.5 in Milton Keynes.

380 households in Wolverton lived in over occupied accommodation.

The 2011 Census also estimates the number of households with a high occupancy rating. An occupancy rating of -1 implies that a household had one less room/bedroom than required. Table 15 shows that Wolverton had around 380 households (6.0%) which were over occupied in terms of bedrooms. This is higher than the Milton Keynes figure of 5.1%.

Over occupancy in terms of rooms increased between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 510 (9.2%) households had an occupancy rating of -1 or less, in 2011 it had risen to 655 residents (10.4%). This is a trend experienced nationally.

13. Accommodation Type

A larger percentage of dwellings were classified as terraced and flats in Wolverton than Milton Keynes as a whole.

There were 6,720 dwellings in Wolverton in 2011. The 2011 Census asked residents what type of dwelling they lived in. Wolverton had a larger percentage of terraced properties than Milton Keynes as a whole (48.7% compared to 27.4%).

A larger percentage (20.2%) of dwellings in the ward were flats compared with Milton Keynes (16.2%).


A growing percentage of dwellings in the ward were flats. 15.0% of dwellings in the ward were flats in 2001, this compares to 20.2% in 2011.

Overall the number of dwellings in Wolverton grew from 5,760 in 2001 to 6,720 in 2011. This is an increase of 960 dwellings or 16.6%.

The number of flats in Wolverton grew by 57.1% between 2001 and 2011 from 865 to 1,360 in 2011. Graph 6 outlines that the percentage of dwelling which were flats increased from 15.0% in 2001 to 20.2% in 2011; this is a trend which is observed nationally.

The percentage of houses/bungalows in Wolverton decreased from 84.8% of all dwellings to 79.7%.

14. Tenure

17.4% of households rent their dwelling from the council. This compares to 11.0% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

Overall 53.8% of households in Wolverton were owner occupied; this is significantly lower than the figure for Milton Keynes as a whole of 57.7%.

A higher percentage of households were living in the council rented accommodation in Wolverton than Milton Keynes. 1,090 households (17.4%) lived in council rented accommodation compared to 11.0% in Milton Keynes.

Wolverton had a smaller percentage of households in other social rented accommodation. There were 400 households in social rented housing other than from the council accounting for 6.4% of households compared with 7.1% in Milton Keynes. 1,230 households were in private rented accommodation (including living rent free); this is 19.7% of households compared with 18.3% in Milton Keynes.




The percentage of households living in private rented accommodation in Wolverton increased from 9.3% in 2001 to 19.7% in 2011.

Between 2001 and 2011 the number of households in Wolverton living in private rented accommodation increased by 140% from 510 households to 1,230. It increased from 9.3% of all households in 2001 to 19.7% in 2011.

The percentage of households living in social rented accommodation decreased from 28.5% to 23.7%.

There was a large decrease in the percentage of households living in owner occupied properties in Wolverton from 60.9% in 2001 to 53.8% in 2011. The percentage of households in shared ownership increased from 1.3% to 2.8%.





15. Communal Establishments and Residents

There were 16 residents of communal establishments in Wolverton Ward.

There were 3 communal establishment in the ward with 16 residents, all of these residents live within 'other' establishments.

16. Car or Van Availability

25.5% of households in Wolverton had no cars or vans in the household. This is the fifth highest percentage of all wards in Milton Keynes


In total in 2011 there were 6,870 cars or vans in households in Wolverton compared with 5,745 in 2001. However 1,600 households in the ward had no car or van. This is 25.5% of all households, higher than Milton Keynes as a whole (18.9%).

Graph 8 outlines that between 2001 and 2011 the percentage of households with no car/van decreased slightly whilst the percentage of households with one or more cars/vans increased.

18. Qualifications and Students

Levels of qualifications in Wolverton were significantly lower than the Milton Keynes average. 22.1% had no qualifications compared with 18.0% in Milton Keynes.

Table 20 shows the highest level of qualifications for residents aged 16+. It outlines that roughly 2,620 people aged 16+ in Wolverton had no qualifications. This is 22.1% of the population and is higher than Milton Keynes (18.0%).

About 2,700 people aged 16+ in the ward had a degree or higher qualification. This is 22.7% of the population, lower than the Milton Keynes average of 28.2%. It had the seventh lowest percentage of people with level 4 qualifications of all wards in Milton Keynes.

Levels of qualifications in Wolverton increased significantly since 2001.

Although qualifications were lower than Milton Keynes as a whole, levels of qualifications in the ward increased considerably since 2001. Graph 9 outlines how levels of qualifications changed since 2001. In 2001 14.2% of residents aged 16+ had a degree or higher, by 2011 this had increased to 22.7%. In 2001 31.6% of the population had no qualifications by 2011 this had decreased to 22.1%.

Wolverton had a smaller percentage of students aged 18+ than Milton Keynes.

Table 21 shows that there were 390 people aged 18 and over in full time education resident in the ward. This is 3.3% of the population, lower than the Milton Keynes average of 3.5%.

19. Economic Activity

A smaller percentage (65.1%) of Wolverton residents aged 16-74 were in employment compared with Milton Keynes (68%).

Table 22 outlines that the population aged 16-74 can be broken down into two broad categories:

1. Economically Active: People that were in work or looking and available for work.

8,280 people in the Wolverton were economically active. This is 74.1% of the 16-74 year old population smaller than the Milton Keynes figure of 75.9%. The percentage of the population working as full time employees is lower in Wolverton compared with Milton Keynes as a whole. 5,005 residents in the ward were full time employees; this is 44.8% of the 16-74 year old population lower than the Milton Keynes average of 46.3%.

There were 690 unemployed people in Wolverton which accounted for 6.2% of the population, higher than the Milton Keynes rate of 4.8%.

2. Economically Inactive: People that were not in work and were not looking and available for work.

Wolverton had a larger percentage of the 16-74 population who were economically inactive. 25.9% of the ward's 16-74 population were economically inactive compared with 24.1% in Milton Keynes as a whole. This is due to a larger percentage of the 16-74 year old population looking after the home or family. 6.1% of 16-74 year old population were looking after home or family compared with 4.6% in Milton Keynes. There was also a higher percentage (4.0%) of the population who were long-term sick or disabled compared to Milton Keynes (3.2%).



There was a fall in the percentage of 16-74 year old population working as full time employees in Wolverton.

Graph 10 outlines that the percentage of the 16-74 population employed as full time employees decreased from 49.4% in 2001 to 44.8% in 2011. However, there was an increase in the percentage of people in part time employment and self employment which offsets this decrease to some degree. This is a trend experienced nationally.

The percentage of people who were unemployed increased from 3.7% to 6.2%, whilst the percentage of people who were economically inactive decreased from 27.2% to 25.9% between 2001 and 2011.

Economic activity is strongly correlated to age. Middle aged people tend to be more economically active than younger people (who may be students) and older people (who were more likely to be retired etc). Therefore to make robust comparisons between areas economic activity by age is needed.

20. Hours Worked

Three quarters of Wolverton residents in employment worked full time hours whilst a quarter work part time.


The 2011 Census asked those in employment how many hours they worked a week. Table 23 outlines that in total 1,830 of the ward's residents worked part time hours this is 24.4%, compared with the Milton Keynes average of 24.7%.

21. Industry

84.7% of Wolverton residents were employed in the service sector compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole.

6,360 Wolverton residents were employed in the service sector. This is 84.7% of employment compared with 85.3% in Milton Keynes as a whole. A larger percentage of residents were employed in the manufacturing sector than Milton Keynes as a whole. 680 Wolverton residents were employed in the manufacturing sector; this is 9.1% of those in employment compared with 8.0% in Milton Keynes.

The wholesale and retail trade industrial sector was the largest employer of Wolverton residents.

Table 24 provides more detail on the industry of employment in Wolverton and Milton Keynes. It shows that the wholesale and retail trade was the largest employer of residents in the ward. 1,660 residents were employed in this sector; this is 22.1% of people in employment compared with 20.6% in Milton Keynes.

Education, health and social work and public administration, defence and compulsory social security employs 1,790 people (23.8%).

The wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles/cycles, manufacturing, and transport and storage sectors were larger in Wolverton than Milton Keynes as a whole. The professional, scientific and technical activities, information and communication and finance and insurance activities were in smaller proportions compared with Milton Keynes.

22. Occupation

8.9% of residents in Wolverton were employed in manager, director and senior official occupations and 15.1% in elementary occupations.

A lower percentage of employees (8.9%) were employed in the managerial occupations in Wolverton compared with Milton Keynes as a whole (10.9%). 1,140 residents were employed in elementary occupations. This is 15.1% of those in employment and is significantly higher than the Milton Keynes average of 12.3%.



The largest increase in employment between 2001 and 2011 in Wolverton occurred in professional occupations the largest decrease occurred in managers, directors and senior officials.

Graph 12 outlines that the largest increase in employment between 2001 and 2011 in Wolverton occurred in professional occupations. 9.3% of those in employment in 2001 were employed in professional occupations by 2011 this increased to 14.4%. The largest decrease occurred in managers, directors and senior officials from 11.7% to 8.9%.

23. National Statistics – Socio-Economic Classification

Residents in Wolverton were more likely to be classified in the semi-routine occupations, routine occupations and never worked and long-term unemployed socio-economic categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.

1,000 residents aged 16-74 in the ward were in the higher managerial and professional category. This is 8.9% of the population compared with 12.2% in Milton Keynes. Wolverton also had a smaller percentage of people in the lower managerial, administrative and professional occupation category.

Wolverton had a higher percentage of residents in the semi-routine occupations, routine occupation and never worked and long-term unemployed categories than Milton Keynes as a whole.
